

Once again, I would like to thank you for your collaboration with me in the proclamation of the good news of Jesus Christ. I would also like to thank you again for your warm words of encouragement and affection as I move on to retirement. Some of you contributed to a Dell laptop that I will make good use of in the years ahead. Thank you for your generosity and thoughtfulness. Others simply gave gifts of prayer or retirement funds, and a few gift cards as well. Thank you! This pastor's page was written to remind us of the centrality of the

Eucharist, and the importance of celebrating the mass well. This is where it all begins and ends, at the banquet table of Christ. From the Eucharist we have the grace we need to hand on the faith, to bear witness to the risen Lord by word and deed, to care for the poor and forgotten, and to build a solid foundation for the future for Saint Kilian parish.

I have been told that Father Mark Rowan will be settling in this week, and not preparing a pastor's page for now. So I took the opportunity. I know that you will welcome him warmly and support him with great affection and prayers.

Until we meet again may God's blessings be with you always - as we journey to the fullness of life that awaits us!

How can we celebrate Mass with joy and gladness?

The First Commandment: Thou Shall Prepare. Purchase a St. Joseph Sunday Missal or open the bishops' website USCCB.org to the weekend's readings. Read and pray with the upcoming weekend's Scripture readings. Use the gospel or another of the readings as grace before your evening meal, or in your small Christian community. Do not bring the missal to mass. Sit near the Lector as the word of God is proclaimed. Focus on hearing the prayers and the readings. Listen attentively - because you are hungry to hear God speak to you!

The Second Commandment: Thou Shall Be Welcoming. Recognize that you are always a 'minister of welcome and hospitality' at Saint Kilian. Upon arrival in the parking lot be ready to greet other parishioners with warm affection. Say hello to the ushers and greeters. Do not sit at the end of the pew. Instead, move to the middle of the pew, allowing others ample seating space as they enter the church.

The Third Commandment: Thou Shall Sign yourself with the Cross with Holy Water, and Go near the Altar and ambo. Remember that when you were baptized, your spiritual journey began. This was the most important day in your life. You have been born again and clothed with the Glory of God. Go to the front of the church where the action is. Bow reverently to the altar and Ambo. As you move far into the pew greet those around you with a smile. Then be still, preparing to hear God speak and to rejoice with the rest of your brothers and sisters. Consider once again picking up the missal in the church and refreshing your memory.

The Fourth Commandment: Thou Shall pick up the Hymnal, Sing with Enthusiasm, and Respond Loudly to the priest leading the prayers. The celebration of the Eucharist is a kind of living theater. A great celebration requires each believer's full, active and conscious participation. Even though we are many in the church, we praise God as one voice. How can we keep from singing! God longs to hear your voice lifted in song. And your brother or sister, son or daughter, wife or husband or neighbor, needs to hear your belief loud and clear. Bear witness to your faith. Let your children and grandchildren nearby and all who have come to worship the Lord, witness your love for Jesus Christ as you lift up your hymnal and sing. Mere presence is

not enough to energize our Spirit- led assembly. While there are opportunities for silence and quiet prayer, the mass is primarily God's holy people enthusiastically as a community, expressing their joy. The priest acts as a kind of orchestra leader and representative of Jesus Christ present in the assembly.

The Fifth Commandment: Thou Shall Devour God's Word. After the priest greets you and you have cried out for God's mercy and kindness in the penitential Rite that begins each mass, we are ready to devour God's message of love for us and all people throughout history. The ancient prophets of Israel found the word of God as sweet as honey and burning like a hot coal! The two-edged sword of the word purifies and comforts. It also challenges and inspires. Are we ready to be transformed as God speaks?

The Sixth Commandment: Thou Shall Respond Wholeheartedly throughout the Mass. God has worked innumerable wonders in our lives and throughout history. We applaud with great enthusiasm the works of the Lord as we profess our faith in the Creed, doctrinal formulations handed on to us by our Christian ancestors at Nicaea and Constantinople. In our intercessions we pray for one another and for our church. We stand in solidarity with the cause of peace and justice, and the dignity and sacredness of human beings. We are conscious of current events. We intercede for the victims of war and violence and natural disaster. We ask healing for the sick and eternal life for our loved ones who have gone before us. At the Offertory, we place ourselves on the paten (gold plate) with the unleavened bread offered to God. We surrender ourselves, and in return God gives us divine life at communion time.

The Seventh Commandment: Thou Shall Give Thanks Always and Everywhere. The Eucharistic prayer, following the offertory, is our prayer of thanksgiving and praise. It is the heart and soul of the mass. We remember all the saving deeds that God has done for us. We recall God's wondrous love that impelled the Lord to become one of us and share our human journey intimately. We call to mind the way Jesus lived - with courage and confidence, despite his fears and anxieties. As he ate his last meal with his followers, he became our new Moses setting us free, not from the grasp of the Egyptians but from darkness and death that hold us captive.

The Eighth Commandment: Thou Shall Pray the Lord's Prayer, and Give Peace. This prayer learned from our early childhood is a prayer of praise to God and of abandonment to whatever life gives us. It appeals to the Father "Abba" for daily sustenance of soul and mind and body. It pleads for forgiveness of our personal sins and the sins of the church. That forgiveness will be given, but we must forgive those who have sinned against us.

The Ninth Commandment: Thou Shall Become What You Receive, and Receive What You Already Are. The mystery of the holy sacrifice of the mass (both sacrifice and sacred meal) includes our participation in the dying and rising of Christ. By entering into the prayers of the mass and saying the 'great amen' at the end of the Eucharistic prayer, we are giving complete assent to what we already are, the Body and Blood of Christ. Our yearning to become more fully Christ present and acting in the world is included in our Amen. As we process to the altar to receive Christ's body and blood, we sing the communion song refrain as the leader of song directs us. We stand up for this Holy Communion because we are an "Alleluia People" who have been made worthy of Christ body, in fact members of it destined for eternal life.

The Tenth Commandment: Thou Shall Go Forth, and Be Body Broken and Blood poured out for others. We have feasted on God's word, and at the table of God's meal of fellowship and sacrifice. The grace of God is working powerfully within us. If we surrender to the Holy Spirit, we will be transformed. We will be more like Christ, the perfect one whose love has no boundaries. Now we will go forth and live lives of service with a special love and a great compassion for the weak and defenseless. We will return to the table of the Lord in a week's time for nourishment and rejuvenation. Our lives are holy. We are pleasing to God. We are his children.

We are located at 140 Elizabeth Street but our main entrance is in the parking lot facing Conklin Street.






