AN EASTER MESSAGE FROM FATHER FORTUNATUS

Good Shepherd Sunday and World Day of Prayer for Vocations

The 4th Sunday of Easter is commonly referred to as "Good Shepherd Sunday". This is because of the shepherd imagery from Chapter 10 of John's Gospel that is read on this Sunday every year where Jesus refers to himself as the Shepherd who protects, gathers and lays down his life for the sheep. He is the Shepherd who knows his sheep and whose sheep know him and hear his voice.

The image of Jesus as the Good Shepherd is one of the earliest Christian images in art. Given the world in which early Christians lived, they needed to be discreet where Christian images were often viewed with suspicion at best and persecution or even death at worst. The image of the good shepherd blended seamlessly into the already existing shepherd motifs of the Greek and Roman art, hence could escape the notice of the authorities during persecution. Hence as early as the 3rd century, we find paintings of Jesus the Good Shepherd, carrying a sheep across his shoulders, on the walls of the St. Callisto Catacomb in Rome. On this Sunday, please pray for your priests who are conformed to Christ the Good Shepherd. At their ordinations, the bishop addresses them as follows: "Keep always before your eyes the example of the Good Shepherd who came not to be served but to serve, and who came to seek out and save what was lost." So, please pray for us that we may truly follow the example of Jesus the Good Shepherd and not be like the hired man in the Gospel who does not know or love the sheep and who runs away when the sheep are threatened. Priests are not called to be bad shepherds like we find depicted in the Old Testament (Ezekiel 34 and Jeremiah 23). Pope Francis has often challenged priests to have the "smell of the sheep". In his homily on Holy Thursday in 2015, Pope Francis called on the priests to carry out the work of the Good Shepherd: "to rejoice with couples who marry; we are to laugh with the children brought to the baptismal font; we are to accompany young fiancés and families; we are to suffer with those who receive the anointing of the sick in their hospital beds; we are to mourn with those burying a loved one..... For us priests, what happens in the lives of our people is not like a news bulletin: we know our people, we sense what is going on in their hearts." Hence the priest is to be one who protects, gathers and lays down his life for the people.

This Sunday is also the World Day of Prayer for Vocations. Jesus instructed his disciples to, "Pray to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest" (Matthew 9:38, Luke 10:2). While appreciating all vocations, the Church asks us on this Sunday to pray especially for the vocations to ordained ministry (priesthood and diaconate) and consecrated life.

As we are very aware, over the last number of years, there has been a dramatic fall in the number of vocations to the priesthood and religious life especially in America and Europe. Many reasons have been given for this dramatic decline of priestly vocations ranging from secularism to the abuse scandals. But one may also wonder: could the decline also be attributed to lack of good shepherds (pastors/priests) who should mirror Christ the Good Shepherd to us and to the world?

There are no easy solutions when it comes to vocations to the priesthood and religious life. But, as we pray to the Lord to send more laborers to the harvest, may be each of us can do something about it: There are young (or not-so-young) people in our families and parish community who exhibit qualities of what it takes to be a good priest or religious. Can we be brave enough to ask them to consider the priesthood or religious life? We may not get an immediate 'yes' to that question but that should not discourage us. I encourage parents and grandparents to plant seeds in your children/grandchildren so that they may consider God's call as priests or religious. May I suggest that we take a moment this Sunday to pray Psalm 23: "The Lord is my shepherd, there is nothing I shall want.....", to pray for vocations, to pray for priests and to encourage someone to consider responding to Jesus' call to ministry in the church.
