





On the 4th Sunday of Advent we will celebrate "Bambinelli Sunday", a custom started by Saint Pope John Paul II, where people of the parish are invited to bring the Baby Jesus figure from their home nativity scene to be blessed at Sunday Mass. What is Advent?

Sunday, November 27, 2022 - Saturday, December 24, 2022

Beginning the Church's liturgical year, Advent (from, "ad-venire" in Latin or "to come to") is the season encompassing the four Sundays (and weekdays) leading up to the celebration of Christmas.



The Advent season is a time of preparation that directs our hearts and minds to Christ's second coming at the end of time and to the anniversary of Our Lord's birth on Christmas. From the earliest days of the Church, people have been fascinated by Jesus' promise to come back. But the scripture readings during Advent tell us not to waste our time with predictions. Advent is not about

speculation. Our Advent readings call us to be alert and ready, not weighted down and distracted by the cares of this world (Lk 21:34-36). Like Lent, the liturgical color for Advent is purple since both are seasons that prepare us for great feast days. Advent also includes an element of penance in the sense of preparing, quieting, and disciplining our hearts for the full joy of Christmas.

As we prepare for Christmas, the General Instruction of the Roman Missal notes some differences to the Mass that should be observed during the season. For instance, the priest will wear violet or purple during Advent, except for the Third Sunday of Advent (Gaudete Sunday) when rose is worn (GIRM, no. 316). Aside from what the priest wears, other aesthetic changes in the Church can include a more modestly decorated altar. The final days of Advent, from December 17 to December 24, we focus on our preparation for the celebrations of the Nativity of our Lord at Christmas. In particular, the "O" Antiphons are sung during this period and have been by the Church since at least the eighth century. They are a magnificent theology that uses ancient biblical imagery drawn from the messianic hopes of the Old Testament to proclaim the coming of Christ as the fulfillment not only of Old Testament hopes, but of present ones as well.



Keep Christ in Christmas Poster Contest

Contest is open to all youth between the ages of 5 and 14 and entrants will compete in one of three age groups – ages 5 through 7, ages 8 through 10 and 11 through 14. There will be a first prize and second prize winner in each age group. First prize is a \$50 gift card and second prize is a \$25 gift card.

Poster size should be approximately 11x17 inches, however, we will accept sizes no larger than 22x28. Poster must be original work and reflect the theme of Keep Christ in Christmas and will be judged on child's authenticity and expression of the theme. If pastels, chalk or charcoal are used, the poster must be laminated or covered with clear plastic.

Child's name, age and phone number must be written on the back of the poster and submitted with an entry form and may be dropped off at St. Kilian's Rectory during normal business hours.


Deadline for all entries is December 18th and posters will be displayed in the gathering space of St. Kilian Church as they are received. Judging will be by a team of judges headed by our Pastor Monsignor Mark Rowan, along with

Grand Knight Tom Schwarz and others. All entries become property of the Knights of Columbus Supreme Council office. Posters cannot be returned in most cases.
