





Who was Mother Cabrini?

Frances Xavier Cabrini, also called **Mother Cabrini**, was an Italian-American Roman Catholic Nun and the first U.S. citizen to be canonized in 1946. Mother Cabrini herself was an immigrant from Italy to the United States. She wanted to be a missionary to Japan, but the Pope asked her instead to go to New York to take care of all the Italian immigrants there.

Mother Cabrini founded 67 institutions dedicated to caring for the poor, the abandoned, the uneducated and the sick, including the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, a Catholic religious order that was a major support to her fellow Italian immigrants to the United States.

Mother Cabrini is shown with a suitcase to represent the immigrants who came to New York and an anchor to represent the ships that brought them. The anchor is also a symbol of hope—which Mother Cabrini gave to so many in her care.

Mother Cabrini is buried under the altar of the St. Frances Cabrini Shrine in Washington Heights, New York City. Pope Pius XII named Frances Xavier Cabrini as the patron saint of immigrants, recognizing her efforts on their behalf across America in schools, orphanages, hospitals, and prisons.

Mother Cabrini's Feast Day is November 13th, the anniversary of her beautification.

My dear fellow Parishioners of St. Kilian,

It is amazing how time flies! Six years ago in 2019, I was asked by our Bishop Barres to leave my beloved Air Force and come home from my Base in South Carolina to Long Island. When I came back, the personnel director and I met and when he asked me which parish I would like to be Pastor of out of the 19 parishes that were available, I happily chose St. Kilian! At the same time, Fr. George was asked by his Bishop in Ghana, Africa to leave his parish and to go to the United States to minister to the people here because of the priest shortage on Long Island. So on June 26th 2019, without ever meeting each other we began our six year term of ministry together here in Farmingdale.

It has been a wonderful six years of ministry here together – but not without its challenges. Burying more than fifty people a month during the early days of the pandemic, not having Sunday Mass for months and the High School bus crash immediately come to mind. Of course, there were so many Joys as well.

Now that our six year term here of 2019-2025 is completed, I am very happy to announce that the Bishop has renewed Fr. George and me for another six years! Both of us were very happy with this news. We enjoy ministering and living with each other – except for the smell of his Ghana cooking!

I was recently asked by a parishioner, what was the biggest surprise I encountered when I came to be the Pastor of St. Kilian? Besides the very real differences in being a Pastor on Long Island and being a Pastor in the Middle East, Japan and Korea – my biggest surprise and challenge was the very poor shape the St. Kilian Parish plant was in! It seemed that just about everything around the Parish and the grounds was broken or in a state of disrepair. It seemed a very big project to tackle! So with the generosity of the Parishioners' contributions to the Capital Campaign, and with a \$2.5 million dollar lawsuit that I initiated and won against the former tenants of the school, the repair work began! And my new model became "I don't do broken". Below is a partial list of all the repairs and updates over the last six years....

Parish Facilities- inc. Church, rectory, school building, Outreach

- completely new Church front entrance– includes stairs, handrails and door (CC)
- new Church elevator (CC)
- Parish wide camera surveillance system
- New Church cooling and heating system (CC)
- Church organ completely restored and refurbished: trumpets, chimes, pipes
- Erected a custom shrine with St. Jude, Mother Cabrini and St. Patrick statues with smokeless candles
- new digital hymn boards
- new sidewalks on Cherry Street and in front of the school auditorium
- new sidewalks and concrete pathways around Church building (CC)
- new handicapped parking lights (CC)
- bollards with new lighting for safety and to protect Church building (CC)

- Our Lady of Guadalupe shrine and candle stand
- restored 125 year old historic crucifix in gathering space
- new carillon bell system in the tower
- new Advent wreath and life-sized outdoor Nativity set with creche
- Hardcover hymnals for all parishioners
- New Church sign on front lawn
- TV monitor in the gathering space with parish highlights weekly
- Memorial trees as a new west border on front of Church lawn
- new cross on Outreach roof; redesign of food distribution, outside break area for volunteers.
- new smart boards in parish center, outreach and meeting rooms

St. Benedict Chapel

Entire chapel completely restored and rebuilt “down to the studs” after a two year renovation - including new altar, statues, tabernacle, Custom 9/11 plaque, icons, windows, lighting, baptismal font and all sacramental items. Once Chapel was fully renovated, it became multi-use for parish: private Baptisms, (when appropriate) small weddings, prayer services, Eucharistic Adoration and daily Mass instead of in the Church building, which resulted in significant cost savings during summer and winter months by avoiding incurring a/c and heating costs in the Church.

School Building

- ◆ Completely restored gym with new lighting, air conditioning, ceiling (CC)
- ◆ Auditorium grounds new landscaping, awning
- ◆ New sidewalks on Cherry Street and in front of the auditorium
- ◆ School boilers (CC)
- ◆ Auditorium roof (CC)
- ◆ New handicapped bathroom (CC)
- ◆ Replaced the remaining old, inefficient windows in the school cafeteria, lobby, hallways and west-side staircases
- ◆ Repaired and replaced the AC system in the cafeteria

Rectory

- Rectory paving and stairs (CC)
- New rectory roof (CC)
- Rectory boiler/new (CC)
- New video intercom/doorbell for improved safety and security
- Renovation of the rectory courtyard
- Refurbished rectory offices – replaced broken fireplace
- French drain

Thanks for your generosity! We will continue to repair, rebuild and update, and more importantly grow deeper in our faith in Christ, as His disciples and Pilgrims of Hope!

I'd like to have a Mass said for someone who recently passed away. How would I get one? Please call or stop by the rectory for a Mass Card. Mass Intentions are \$20 and the name of the deceased or living individual will be announced at Mass.

I was Baptized but never received my First Communion or Confirmation and am interested in finding out how to receive my other Sacraments. What do I do now? Please call St. Kilian's Faith Formation at (516) 694-0633 for further information. We look forward to assisting you in completing your Sacraments!

I'd like to spend some quiet time in the Church. Is it open during the day? Yes, the Church building is generally open from 9am to 5pm. We also have the beautiful, recently renovated St. Benedict Chapel located across the street in the rectory. On Wednesdays there is a 12:15pm Mass followed by Eucharistic Adoration in the chapel.

How would I find out when Masses are on Sundays and Holy Days? What about current news?
