Church Regulations Regarding Fast and Abstinence: Abstinence from meat (beast or fowl) is to be observed by All Catholics fourteen years old and older on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays of Lent. This obligation prohibits the eating of meat, but not eggs, milk products, or condiments of any kind, even though made from animal fat. Fasting means limiting oneself to one full meal on a given fast day. Catholics who are eighteen years of age but not yet fifty-nine are obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. On fast days, two additional smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength. However, the two smaller meals together may not equal one full meal. Moreover, eating solid foods between meals on fast days is not permitted.

My Dear Parishioners,

Today we mark the Third Sunday of Lent as we gather to celebrate the Lord's Day. The Gospel reading tells us of the Lord Jesus coming into the Temple in Jerusalem. What He finds is disturbing to Him for it is not a place of prayer but rather a place where corruption and sin are found. After turning over the tables of the impious He reminds all that the Temple is a house of prayer dedicated to God.

The House of God is indeed a holy place which can become quickly profaned by the actions of unbelievers. As Catholics we too hold to the belief that the church is the House of God and as such deserves respect and honor. The church is where prayers are offered, the Sacred Scriptures are proclaimed, the sacraments celebrated and the Divine Liturgy conducted which unites heaven and earth. It is in this house that the Lord's true presence is to be found in the Eucharist which is reserved in the tabernacle. For this reason we believe that God is present in the church building and because of that we enter into His presence with devotion and respect.

As your pastor I am continually reminding people, primarily non parishioners, of the sanctity of this house. The challenge is especially present when weddings and funerals are conducted which bring some people who have no faith into the Lord's House. Reminding people to refrain from loud talking, playing with cell phones, bringing beverages and snacks and much more becomes an almost daily routine for me. Because of a lack of faith inappropriate conduct is not only a sin against God but a major distraction for people of faith who come to worship in the Lord's House. Our secular culture, which is doing a successful job of removing God from our lives, is the cause for such disrespect.

It's so important for parents to form their children in the reverential ways in which we conduct ourselves in church. The children are our future and it is up to us to pass on to them the ways in which we have been instructed by our parents. I am sure that for many of you your parents were like mine when I was growing up. My parents prayed, sang, responded, knelt, genuflected and were attentive in church. They passed that down to me and my brothers. I am sure it was the same for you.

When we are in church we are in the House of God. Others are around us trying to pray, reflect and recollect themselves before and after the Holy Mass. Helping to maintain the Lord's House as a house of prayer is the task of all of us ("Zeal for your house will consume me."). When people showed disrespect for God's House it drew the ANGER of Jesus. Let's not anger Him but worship Him with prayer and devotion!

DID YOU TAKE A RICE BOWL? – There are still plenty of rice bowls located in the baskets at the church entrance. Every household should take a rice bowl and place it on their table as a reminder during Lent of the fasting and abstinence we should be undergoing during this holy season. The money we are saving by denying ourselves of the snacks, etc of what we are giving up should then be placed in the rice bowl. The rice bowls should be brought to church at Easter, not before. Lent concludes at Easter and therefore our alms should be practiced up to the Feast of our Lord's Holy Resurrection! (75% of the alms collected helps feed the poor internationally, 25% of the alms remains in the Diocese of Paterson for food distribution.)

LENTEN PENANCE SERVICE – The final celebration of the sacrament of penance will take place on Wednesday evening of Holy Week, March 28th at 7 o'clock in Saint Cecilia Church. Eight priests will be present to hear confessions for both adults and children. Please mark the date and plan to go to confession before the celebration of Easter.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS – One of the features of the Lenten season is the praying of the Stations of the Cross which is done every Friday in Sacred Heart of Jesus Church and Saint Cecilia Church. The Stations begin on Friday, February 16th. **Stations at Sacred Heart of Jesus Church will take place every Friday evening during Lent at 7 o'clock. On March 2nd, due to First Friday devotions, Stations will begin at 6 o'clock.** Stations at Saint Cecilia Church will also take place every Friday evening during Lent but will begin at 7:30. On February 23 and March 16, due to Generations of Faith Programs, Stations will be cancelled but you are encouraged to go to Sacred Heart on these evenings. The Stations of the Cross are also prayed every Friday following the 8 o'clock morning Mass.
