We are on a journey. Today's readings call our attention to our "ongoing" journey.

In the first reading from the first book of Kings, the journey continues when Elijah passes on his prophetic task to Elisha to carry on and to be the voice of God to the people of Israel. In the second reading from Paul's letter to the Galatians, Paul speaks of our continuing struggle to be truly free, a struggle common to all mankind.
