A Message from the Pastor

1st Sunday of Lent March 5, 2017

The 2017 Sharing God's Blessings Annual Appeal has begun. The appeal is something we do every year because the needs are ongoing and it is our opportunity to share the gifts God gave us. This year's appeal theme is, "Be of One Mind" from 1 Peter 3:8. Our parish goal this year is \$49,944. Last weekend we showed the video in church. If you missed it you can find the link on the home page of our website.

We are often reminded by our Holy Father Pope Francis and Sacred Scripture that in order to love one another we must share the blessings which God has provided to us.

In this Year of Missionary Discipleship, which began in our Archdiocese on January 25, we are called to remember that we are all missionaries and that we have a responsibility to bring others to Christ, helping them to encounter the fullness of love and leading them to discipleship. In order to reach out to our brothers and sisters in Christ, we must "be of one mind: share each other's troubles with mutual affection; be compassionate and humble." 1 Peter 3:9

When we embrace this sacred scripture and show sympathy, compassion, and humility in our hearts, and equally important, in our actions towards others, we are truly able to become the Missionaries that we are called to be. Your support of the Sharing God's Blessings Annual Appeal is one way to concretely share in each other's troubles. You are ultimately helping to alleviate someone else's burden with compassion and humility.

Here is just a sampling of where your gift to the Annual Appeal goes:

For the homeless, the Archdiocese of Newark, through Catholic Charities, operates seven shelters. These shelters provide basic emergency assistance of food and shelter, but most important, also offer a life-line for the homeless with life skills instruction, job training and referral services, enabling the homeless to reenter society by building a life of self-sufficiency.

For those in need of food, the Emergency Food and Nutrition Network coordinates bulk food collection and distribution through a network of 75 parish-based food pantries, soup kitchens, and shelters in the Archdiocese of Newark.

To educate our young people in the faith, the Archdiocesan Catechetical Office provides parishes with guidelines and tools in accord with the Magisterium, to use when providing religious education and sacramental preparation.

Through the Catholic Youth Organization, the young have an opportunity to participate in retreats, increase their knowledge of Catholicism and be involved in a variety of sports and recreation programs.

A Catholic education is provided in over 67 Catholic elementary schools, and 29 high schools, which in total educated more than 30,000 young people last year.

The Archdiocese of Newark puts a special emphasis on reaching out to students attending one of the 10 colleges located within the archdiocese.

The Archdiocesan Respect Life Office works to discourage abortions and counsels those who have had abortions.

For seniors, the appeal funds opportunities for faith sharing and fellowship with senior housing, senior centers, and parish organizations.

For those wanting to become Catholic, the appeal funds RCIA and continuing religious education programs. For engaged couples, there are marriage encounter, and pre-cana programs.

There are also special ministries to the bereaved, separated, widowed and divorced. The appeal supports evangelization ministries that include the Men's and Women's commisions, Stewardship Day, Discovering Christ.

The Annual Appeal also helps financially-challenged parishes to remain open and continue to offer the sacraments and the saving news of Jesus Christ to their parishioners. The appeal also provides rebates to parishes that exceed their appeal goal.

The Annual Appeal also funds three seminaries, which prepare our

This weekend I will go to St. Louis for a 10-day "intensive session" for a preaching course I am taking toward a doctoral degree in homiletics. Our cohort of 14 students meets with our professors for an extended study session each semester, with other classwork being done independently and in group work online. This is the sixth and final required course I am taking in St. Louis. After this I will need to take two electives of my choosing, and then complete a doctoral project and thesis (due by May 2020). This program is designed for those in full-time ministry, so that is why it is spread out over six years. The workload is heavy, but I have been enjoying learning more about preaching, and looking for ways to apply it to my preaching and to the preaching class I teach at our seminary at Seton Hall University.

While I am away, Father Don will be handling the priestly ministry, with weekend assistance (as usual) from the Salesian priests at Don Bosco High School. Please remember my classmates, my professors and me in your prayers.



YOUTH MINISTRY

Approaching this Lent, I want to experience something different. Maybe you do, too. If giving up your phone doesn't seem like a good option for you, I have another alternative in mind: Use your phone to do good.

Sacrifice is good, and fasting is absolutely necessary. However, I worry that **if we don't learn to use things for the good of the Kingdom of God, we might be missing the boat**. It's the same with using your humor to glorify God, or using your body to glorify God, or using your music to glorify God – we can use our phones the same way. These might sound basic, but here are some suggestions of how to use your phone to do good this Lent. Warning: side effects may include deepening of friendships, growing in holiness, and seeing God in places you don't usually notice Him.

- 1. Text a different person every day for the 40 days. Affirm them, tell them how they make your world a better place, and ask how you can pray for them. Then, actually pray for them.
- 2. Set an alarm on your phone every day reminding you to pray. At that time, stop whatever you're doing and pray.
- 3. Read Scripture every day, and then post on Facebook daily about what stood out to you from that scripture. This will be a sacrifice especially since a lot of our Facebook friends may not know about our faith.
- 4. Use the iBreviary or any other app to pray the Liturgy of the Hours. This will help you stay unified with God AND the rest of the Church throughout the day. Talk about staying connected.
- 5. Set three different timers, spaced evenly throughout the day. At each one, stop and reflect on your day since the last timer and all that has happened. Try to see God in each moment, be mindful of His presence along the way, and thank Him.
- 6. Delete one song a day from your phone that probably shouldn't be there. For each one that you delete, download a worship song. Share a beautiful, inspirational image on Instagram once a week. Write a caption about how it inspired you in your faith and maybe include that you'll be praying for everyone who sees it.

Now these were just some suggestions. Hopefully this got your brain working on some cool ways you can use your phone a little differently this Lent. Who knows, you may end up forming a lifelong habit. Be God's.

Film Screening and Discussion

"13th" an Oscar-nominated documentary film will be shown on Monday, March 6th at 7:00 p.m. and Tuesday, March at 9:30 a.m.

The film takes a sweeping, unflinching look at the history of race in the US. It poignantly links an overlooked clause in the 13th Amendment to today's crisis of mass incarceration which many say is the new form of Jim Crow.

This movie is named for the 13th Amendment, ratified in 1865, which abolished slavery but contained a loophole: "Neither slavery nor involuntary servitude, except as a punishment for crime whereof the party shall have been duly convicted, shall exits within the United States, or any place subject to their jurisdiction." In other words, slavery isn't permitted - but only for people who aren't convicted of a crime. This clause depends on a just court system in which every person accused of a crime is treated fairly and equitably - which, in turn, depends on a policing system that accuses people in the same manner, with no consideration for their race, class or gender.
