A Message from the Pastor

Twenty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time

Our parish is assisted at weekend Mass by the Salesian priests from Don Bosco High School in Ramsey. From time to time, we share with you some spiritual reflections by one of their members, Father Steve Ryan.

Confession More Often Than Not! Why?

Too many times I hear in the confessional that it's been a few years since I confessed. Sometimes we priests get a 'big fish': "It's been 40 or 50 years since my last confession."

In this article I want to re-iterate the Church's teaching. We have 7 sacraments. Two of them – Holy Communion and Confession – can and should be received often to keep us close to Christ and in a state of grace. St. John Bosco said, "We can fly to heaven on the wings of confession and communion!" And also, "Go to confession and communion often, and when you can, visit Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament."



There are many good reasons why we should go to confession often – monthly. Even more than monthly, in fact.

1. I want to be a saint and I will not let the sins I committed stay on my soul and weigh me down.
2. I am truly sorry for offending Almighty God by my selfishness and sin.
3. I have hurt others around me and I need to tell God that I'm sorry and receive absolution for my offenses.
4. The devil's temptations are strong and I want to receive the grace of confession to fight them off.
5. I want to receive Holy Communion in a state of grace and not have any serious sin (even a little sin) in my heart and on my soul.
6. I do not want to die suddenly with unconfessed sins.

There are many excuses – none of them truly valid – that we give for not going to confession often:

- "The priest in my parish doesn't stress the importance of confession and is rarely available for it."
- "What the heck – I'm going to sin again anyway."
- "I can say I'm sorry in my mind and it's done; I don't need to tell a priest."
- "It's embarrassing to say some of the stuff I did."
- "Confession is outdated; nobody goes anymore."
- "The priest is a sinner too, and some of those priests are hypocrites anyway."

Out of all these excuses the one thing that ought to bother us most is going up to receive communion on Sundays and realizing that we have neglected going to confession for a long time. Since confession and communion go together and work beautifully in us for holiness – to ignore the one and go to the other is not right. St. John Bosco said, "For communions made coldly, indifferently, perhaps even at times for renewing Judas' betrayal by sacrilege,... let us reflect. Let us inflame our hearts with a more fervent love for the Blessed Sacrament, and rouse ourselves to sincere repentance for sin through confession and toward real gratitude for the offering Christ makes to His Eternal Father on our behalf."

An examination of conscience (and there are many available online) might help you to realize that there are a lot of things out there that are sins, that hurt us. There are a lot of toxic behaviors that hurt our relationships with God and others and that hurt our growth as human beings and as Christian disciples.

God wants to forgive and heal. He is asking us to bring forth an awareness of our failings and our sinfulness. He can't do much with us if we are full of pride and don't see any need for change and conversion.

God thinks we are worth fighting for. Why don't we?

The saints hated their own sins. Why don't we?

Here are the words of C.S. Lewis:

"It would seem that Our Lord finds our desires not too strong, but too weak. We are half-hearted creatures, fooling about with drink and sex and ambition when infinite joy is offered us, like an ignorant child who wants to go on making mud pies in a slum because he cannot imagine what is meant by the offer of a holiday at the sea. We are far too easily pleased."

Make a good confession. If you want to keep moving forward in holiness, keep making good confessions – often. Go more often than not!


BRINGING UP THE GIFTS AT MASS
