
Nativity B.V.M. December 19, 2021 FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT

"ADVENT JESSE TREE":

This Sunday, - December 19th - the Fourth Sunday of Advent - our Cathedral will reflect upon the lineage and prophecies of Jesus Our Lord by remembering Jonah, his refusal to journey to Nineveh and his reflective period in the belly of a whale. All this because Jonah knew that God in his great compassion and "Love" would forgive the people of Nineveh. This Sunday is the Sunday reflective of "Love" in our Advent journey. Today, members of Nativity Elementary's Cantor Academy will adorn the Jesse Tree with whale ornaments remembering Jonah's experience. They will also share the Prayers of the People for the Mass.

This weekend concludes our Advent Jesse Tree Offering in which we have ornament symbols on our tree reflective of Adam & Eve and the Creation Story, Noah and the Great Flood, King David and finally Jonah and the whale.
