He has come to the help of his servant Israel for he remembered his promise of mercy, the promise he made to our fathers, to Abraham and his children forever.





"FERTILIZE, FERTILIZE, FERTILIZE"

Today is the Third Sunday of Lent and our first reading is from the Book of Exodus. We hear the wonderful story of the Burning Bush which, although burning, was not consumed. Moses being curious wants to take a closer look when he hears; "Moses Moses, remove your sandals for you are standing on Holy Ground, for I am the Lord God of your father Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob." The Lord then commands Moses to rescue the suffering Hebrews from the Egyptians. When Moses asks the Lord who should I say sent me, God replies saying; "I AM, sent you, this Is my name forever!!" Saint Paul continues the story by telling you that the Israelites all passed through the sea and were baptized into Moses. God was not pleased with them because of their grumbling and sinful ways. Most suffered death in the desert. God warns you; "whoever thinks he is standing secure, should take care not to fall!" Do you know where you stand with the Lord? In today's gospel Jesus tells a parable of a lifeless fig tree that produces no fruit. When the owner of the orchard was going to cut the fig tree down the gardener begged him to let him fertilize it and see if it will rebound. Are you bearing fruit in your life? Are you a conduit of faith by bringing love, compassion and forgiveness to others around you? Sin causes us to resist God in order to do our own thing and we dry up like the fig tree. This Lent go to Confession and grow in Grace. The closer you resemble Christ, the easier it will be to bring Spiritual life to the lifeless. Jesus tells you; "If you do not repent, you too will all perish." DON'T BE RESISTANT TO GOD'S GRACE. DON'T RUN OUT OF TIME TO BEAR HOLY FRUIT...... BE THAT FERTILIZER THAT OTHERS NEED TO THRIVE!!!!

THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT

First Reading: Exodus 3:1-8a, 13-15

Moses came upon a burning bush, when God called out to him. God told Moses that he had seen the suffering of his people in Egypt and intended to lead them from their captors to a land of milk and honey. Moses asked what he should say if the Israelites should ask what God wished to be called. God replied, "I am who am."

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 10:1-6, 10-12

Paul describes how the people were led into the desert by Moses, yet many of them were struck down by God. He warns that this should serve as an example not to give in to wicked desires or we may suffer the same downfall.

Gospel: Luke 13:1-9

Jesus says that an individual's misfortune does not mean that their sins were greater than someone else's. He warns that without repenting, all sinners will meet the same end. He tells of a barren fig tree whose owner planned to cut it down. But a servant offered to give it special care for one year and destroy it should it remain barren. This symbolizes God's patience toward us.


