## "HEART, SOUL & DIVINITY"

Today is the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, also known as Corpus Christi. All of today's readings speak of offering a blessing of bread and wine. In our first reading we find King and High Priest Melchizedek blessing Abram using bread and wine and the words; "blessed be Abram, by God Most High the Creator of Heaven and Earth." In response, "Abram gave him a tenth of everything", a tithe-offering which is an act of thanksgiving and praise to our Lord. The well-known *Miracle of the Loaves and Fishes* in today's gospel reading prefigures Jesus's gift of Himself in the Eucharist. Jesus teaches and heals many of the 5,000 men in attendance, not counting the women and children also present. He then instructs His Apostles to feed everyone. Having only five loaves and two fishes the Apostles are puzzled as to how they can feed so many. The gospel tells us; "Jesus, taking the five loaves and two fishes, and looking up to heaven said a blessing over them, broke them and gave them to His disciples to feed the crowd, they all ate and were satisfied. When the left-over fragments were collected, they filled 12 baskets." What does this remind you of? Saint Paul answers that question for us in our 2<sup>nd</sup> reading when he reminds us of Jesus's actions at His last supper. "He took bread, broke it and said, this is my body that is given up for you and this cup is the new Covenant in my blood, as often as you eat this bread and drink this cup you proclaim Christ's death until He comes again". At every Mass, in all the Churches throughout the world a daily miracle takes place when the words of Consecration are spoken by a priest, the simple bread and wine becomes the Body and Blood of Christ, sacrificed for the forgiveness of your sins. No greater love is found than this, no greater gift offered to you than to share and participate in the life of Christ. **MAY YOU BE AWESTRUCK EVERY TIME YOU PARTAKE OF THIS MIRACULOUS GIFT OF TRANSUBSTANTIATION. GIVE GOD PERMISSION TO TRANSFORM YOUR HEART AND SOUL WITH THE POWER OF HIS HEART, SOUL AND DIVINITY..... ACCEPT AND LOVE THE MYSTERY OF THE HOLY EUCHARIST!**

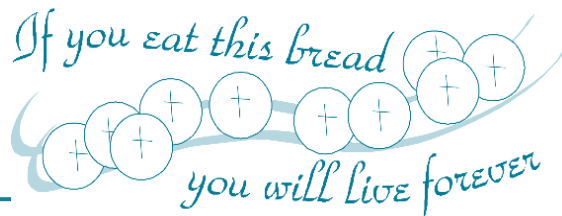

## THE MOST HOLY BODY & BLOOD OF CHRIST (CORPUS CHRISTI)

### First Reading: Genesis 14:18-20

Melchizedek, a priest of God, prayed that Abram would be blessed by God. He also praised God for delivering Abram's foes into his hands.

### Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 11:23-26

Paul describes Jesus' actions during the last supper. Jesus broke bread and said it was his body given for us, asking that we do the same in remembrance of him. He then passed the cup and called it his blood. Jesus then asked us to break bread in this manner to remember his death until he returns.

### Gospel: Luke 9:11b-17

Jesus spoke to a large crowd when his disciples asked that he dismiss the people to give them a chance to find food and lodging. Jesus asked the disciples to give the crowd something to eat, but they had only five loaves of bread and two fish. Jesus then blessed and distributed the food, which fed about 5,000 people. Twelve baskets were then collected from what was left over.

7. All children treated with **Dignity and Respect**.
8. **Clear Rules and Expectations**.  
consistent reinforcement / consequences
9. **Adequate supervision of youth**.  
team approach—accountability—no 1:1 isolation
10. All **abuse** is **reported**.

# MASS INTENTIONS

*WHAT ARE THEY, WHY ARE THEY OFFERED,  
AND HOW CAN I OFFER ONE?*

A Mass intention is a specific prayer request or petition that a person asks a priest to offer during the celebration of Mass, essentially asking the priest and parish to specifically pray for a particular person or situation during the Eucharistic sacrifice. Mass intentions are requested because we believe that by offering a Mass for someone, they can access the powerful graces of the Eucharist to pray for their needs, especially for healing, comfort, or the repose of a deceased loved one's soul. Mass intentions may also be requested to celebrate Birthdays, Anniversaries, and in Thanksgiving for a particular grace or blessing received.

available Masses that are celebrated  
throughout the year.**

**Mass Intentions may be requested by  
visiting or calling the Rectory during  
regular office hours. The requested  
donation is \$20 per intention.**



Parishioners may also wish to consider memorializing the Sanctuary Candle in memory of a loved one. The candle burns for one week either in the Church or the Chapel. The requested donation is \$15, and the intention is placed in the Bulletin.

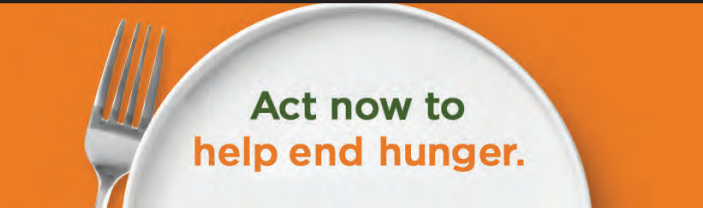
