### From the Desk of Father Ed:

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend is the 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time. Our first reading this weekend is from the Book of Exodus. Moses was standing on a hilltop praying while Joshua was leading the Israelites in battle against the pagan leader Amalek and the Amalekites. "As long as Moses kept his hands raised up, Israel had the better of the fight, but when he let his hands rest, Amalek had the better of the fight." Aaron and Hur had to help Moses hold his arms up and eventually Joshua and the Israelites were victorious. Our reading from the Book of Exodus reminds us of the power in Moses' prayer, which was bolstered by Aaron and Hur, and brought about the defeat of the enemy. It also teaches us the necessity of prayer and that the Father extends his hands to defeat the enemy; the prayer of His Son, Jesus and our prayers keeps his saving hands extended for his Church.

In our Gospel from St. Luke this weekend, Jesus reminds us of the need to "pray always without becoming weary." He teaches us through the story of the dishonest judge. He neither feared God nor respected any human being but gave into rendering a favorable decision for a pestering widow fearing that she might do him harm. God is all good and honest and always hears our prayers. He always answers our prayers because he loves us. He has shown the depth of his love when he sent his only Begotten Son to suffer and die for us so that we could become His adopted children. Our Heavenly Father desires that we turn to Him and call upon him for all our needs. He delights in us his children and delights in our prayers.

Prayer is essential in the life of a Christian. What air is for the lungs and our bodies, prayer is for the spirit and our soul. Prayer keeps us close to our God; the closer we get to Him the more we come to know his will in our lives. We need to pray always. Our Church needs us to pray always. As Aaron and Hur supported the outstretched arms of Moses to defeat the enemy we need to pray so that our God will continue to fight for us and help us defeat the many moral evils in our time. Let us pray always so that when the Lord returns he may find his Church faithful and united.





### **March For Life**
