## **From the Desk of Father Ed:**

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend we celebrate the 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time. In two weeks our liturgical year comes to an end and we begin a new year of grace and the Season of Advent. Advent will last four weeks and find its culmination in the celebration of Christmas and the Christmas Season. In our Gospel this weekend from the evangelist St. Luke we hear of Jesus' prediction of the destruction of the Jewish Temple and the end times. The end times correspond to the end of our liturgical year and point to the Season of Advent where we highlight the events of Jesus' coming into the world. The first part of Advent focuses on the Second Coming of Jesus where the world will come to an end and there will be a new heaven and a new earth. The second part of Advent prepares us for Jesus' birth, his coming into the world some 2,000 years ago.

The Gospel this weekend begins by people admiring the beauty of the Jewish Temple, which must have been magnificent in its time. Jesus predicted that the Temple would be destroyed and his prophecy was fulfilled in the year 70 AD. The Temple was never rebuilt after its destruction. The destruction of the Temple some 40 years after Jesus' Death and Resurrection was a sign of the end times to come. For a faithful Jewish believer the destruction of the Temple was the end of the world. The Temple was God's dwelling place on earth; it was the place where heaven and earth met. It was the culmination of Salvation History for God's chosen people, the Jewish nation. It was the place where the Holy of Holies was, that is, the place where the Spirit of God dwelt. When the Temple was destroyed there was no place for the faithful Jew to offer sacrifice for thanksgiving or to atone for sins. The Temple was the place where one could pray and encounter the God of Israel.

"There will be powerful earthquakes, famines, and plagues from place to place; and awesome sights and mighty signs will come from the sky," Jesus' prediction of the destruction of the Temple was fulfilled and so will his prophecy of the end time come to fruition. He did not tell us when this will occur so we have to remain prepared and faithful, "By your perseverance you will secure your lives."

This Sunday we begin to prepare for the Season of Advent, which is approaching and to be mindful of the Lord's second coming. The Temple, which was so sacred to the Jewish people was a foreshadowing of the True Temple that is Christ. He is present among us in the Holy Eucharist and his Spirit dwells within us. Let us use this time to prepare ourselves for his coming to us in the Season of Advent.

The Missionary Images are actual color and size (4' x 6') replicas of the original Miraculous Image of Our Lady which she left on Saint Juan Diego's Tilma. They were blessed at the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Mexico by the Rector of the Basilica, Msgr. Diego Monroy to bring conversions, reverence for life, sanctity of the family and solidarity of the Church in America. They have been displayed before millions at thousands of sites. They have journeyed throughout America and the world and visited every state of the United States. The Images visit churches, abortion centers, convents, prisons, hospitals, nursing homes and schools.

Many conversions, healings, reconciliations and graces are reported. Many abortions have been prevented and over twenty abortion centers have been closed through Our Lady's intercession by her Missionary Images after Visitations to them.
