Holy Week

There is a wonderful prayer that follows the prayer of absolution, optional in the ordinary form and proper in the extraordinary, that sums up quite beautifully our experience of Lent and quite particularly the enigmatic tension experienced during Holy week and the Sacred Triduum: *"May the Passion of our Lord Jesus Christ, the merits of the Blessed Virgin Mary and all of the saints, and also whatever good you do and evil you endure be cause for the remission of your sins, the increase of grace, and the reward of everlasting life. Amen."*

The Passion of the Lord is commemorated and proclaimed in the Gospels throughout this week. Each time we hear it from a different Evangelist we have a different and deeper insight into this great mystery. We approach the readings with greater remorse for our sins and greater appreciation for the sacrifice of the unblemished lamb upon the Cross as priest and victim, the offeror and offered. We are meant to draw ever closer to the Cross each day we meditate upon it. We are meant to grow more and more sensitive and aware of our sins and develop a repugnance for them. Examining our consciences we not only grow in self-knowledge but a greater desire for spiritual and human perfection.

Holy week is precisely an experience of intense spiritual reflection, of renunciation of sin that we may more perfectly unite ourselves in love with Christ Jesus to die with Him upon the Cross and rise with Him unto new life on Easter Sunday. If we have not united ourselves with Christ already than this is the time! Those who do not share in His Cross do not share in His Resurrection! This is why we are baptized. We are baptized and immersed into the water three times to represent the three days Jesus spent in the earth. We are baptized into the death of Christ that we may then prepare ourselves through prayer and penance to receive the fruits of His Resurrection in our lives at the end of days.

"whatever good you do and evil you endure". It is God who accomplishes His work of salvation and redemption without any help from us. We do not add to or decrease from the glory of God, the *kabod Theou*. We are, if you will mind the expression, not even "the cherry atop". All the more generous then is God's salvation given us. Yet, despite the fact that it is Faith, Hope and Love that saves us we must co-operate with God's grace working toward our salvation. We do so by *"whatever good [we] do and evil [we] endure"*. In enduring evil and in good works we co-operate with grace and minister unto the building up of the Kingdom of God.

Venerable John Paul II offered his sufferings from Parkinson's Disease for the sake of the sanctification of the world. Following John Paul II's witness, if we too offer our sufferings this week with Christ upon the Cross than we will indeed pour out a wonderful ointment upon the Church. Pray for the Pope. Pray for the Church and suffer not without value (worth) but for the sake of your soul and the life of the Church. The witness we provide will only be of value if it witnesses in conformity to the life of Christ. God Bless!


One Million Hail Marys


Catechists and Classroom Assistants
