Ask the Pastor

People Living in Indecision – All I Want Is to Have My Peace of Mind

Question: I hope this is not too personal a question and please don't feel obligated to answer. What made you decide to become a diocesan priest instead of an order priest? You would make a great Dominican (Order of Preachers) or a Jesuit (Society of Jesus).

Thank you and a very blessed Advent season to you and yours!

Response: Personal, yes. Too personal, not at all. At the time that I said: "yes" to the priesthood, I was a college student in Princeton, New Jersey at Westminster Choir College – which is in the Diocese of Trenton. It was with the chaplain at the University, a priest of the Diocese of Trenton, that I first discussed becoming a priest, and he wanted me to study for the Diocese of Trenton. But, seeing that I did not live in that diocese I told them I needed to speak to a priest nearer to my home. I visited with Msgr. McHugh of Pope John XXIII H.S. He told me that I must be crazy to want to become a priest now – the priest sex abuse scandal had just broken in the media and the priesthood was being lambasted. Yet, I was resolved to become a priest and, as you all know, when I am resolved to do something, I do it. Fr. McHugh put me in touch with the then-vocation's director for our diocese. However, he was too preoccupied to meet with me. I thought about going somewhere else, but I felt that God was calling me to serve the people with whom I am a native, to whom I can relate, and whom I wanted to bring to Christ.

Throughout my time in college seminary at Seton Hall University, the Archdiocese of Newark kept wanting me to switch and study for them. Then, when I was in Rome, I gave a lot of thought to switching to a religious institute or society. I thought about the Dominicans, the Carmelites, and the Franciscans but I also thought about the Priestly Fraternity of St. Peter and the Benedictines at Le Barroux Abbey in France because of my love for the Traditional Latin Mass. However, God kept in my heart the sentiment that the battleground for souls is in the parishes and my love for the people back home in Northwest New Jersey was where my heart remained.

At times as a diocesan priest, the "OG's", I have reconsidered a religious vocation, but my heart keeps coming back to the desire to serve the people of my homeland. That's why I am so happy to be back in Sussex County, New Jersey – God's Country – and to be able to serve the people I love so much.

Why do we bless our homes at Epiphany?

The tradition of blessing our homes during Epiphanytide is over a millennia years old custom in the Catholic Church. Marking one's doors has biblical routes going back to the celebration of the first Passover in Egypt when the Jews put the lamb's blood over their lintels to signify their fidelity to the one true God and were thus spared from the angel of death who took all the firstborns that night as one of the plagues against Pharaoh. (See Exodus 12: 1-13) The Catholic tradition of marking our doorposts with the Epiphany blessing signifies the placing of our family and home under the protection of the Lord as we publicly profess: "For me and my house, we will serve the Lord (Joshua 24: 15)"

The custom's origins saw the priest being invited during Epiphanytide, from January 6 until the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord (February 2) being invited to their parishioner's homes to bless their houses. As parishes grew and this was no longer practical for the priest to be able to bless every parishioner's home, the blessing was adapted so that it could be given by the head of the household. The custom is for the blessing to be administered on twelfthnight, that is January 5th or during the day of Epiphany – January 6th. The chalk is blessed at the Masses for the Epiphany and is then distributed to the householders so that they can bless their homes with their family. It is also custom that a celebratory meal be had where the family, after the blessing of the home, celebrates the welcoming of Christ's sacred word into their household.

The blessing and markings are also significant. The “20” and “20” at the beginning and end of the blessing signifies the blessing of that household and family for the current calendar year. The crosses, X, signify the blessing of Christ. The “C, M and B” have two traditional meanings: **Christus mansionem benedic – Christ bless the house, or Caspar, Melchior and Balthazar, that is the Magi. For those who want to make explicit that they are invoking the Magi can use a “K” for Kaspar.**

Blessing one's home is not only a public act of faith but casts out evil. Just as the blessing of the homes at Passover protected our Jewish ancestors from the angel of death, the practice of the Epiphany blessing keeps our homes free from the presence of evil spirits. Lastly, this act of the Epiphany blessing is a sign of hospitality. It states that the Holy Family is welcome in our home, unlike the Inn at Bethlehem. It shows that like the Magi, our family welcomes Jesus, Mary and Joseph and offers them our treasure: gold, our worship: frankincense, and our lives unto death: myrrh, which was used to perfume the dead during their final anointing.

All make the Sign of the Cross: In the Name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Leader: Peace be to this house and to all who dwell here, in the name of the Lord.

All: Thanks be to God.

Reader: When Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea,
in the days of King Herod,
behold, magi from the east arrived in Jerusalem, saying,
“Where is the newborn king of the Jews?

We saw his star at its rising
and have come to do him homage.”

After their audience with the king they set out.

And behold, the star that they had seen at its rising preceded them,
until it came and stopped over the place where the child was.

They were overjoyed at seeing the star,
and on entering the house
they saw the child with Mary his mother.

They prostrated themselves and did him homage.

Then they opened their treasures
and offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh.
And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod,
they departed for their country by another way.

The word of the Lord.

ALL: Thanks be to God

Using chalk, write on the outside of your house or inside above the front main entrance, above or next to an entrance:

20 X Christus X Mansionem X Benedicat X 20

These words mean. “Christ bless this house”, or you may use the names of the Magi:

20 X Caspar X Melchior X Balthazar X 20

All: Lord God of heaven and earth, you revealed your only begotten Son to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless this house and all who live here and all who visit. May we be blessed with health, kindness of heart, gentleness and the keeping of your law. Fill us with the light of Christ, that our love for each other may go out to all. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.



Day 1: Tuesday, October 25, 2022 Overnight Flight Travel on an inspirational journey to some of the most fascinating religious sites and relics in the world.

Day 2: Wednesday, October 26, 2022 Rome, Italy - Tour

Tomb of Matthew the Apostle in Salerno-Campania Journey through the picturesque landscapes of Apulia on your way to Campania. Visit the Cathedral of Salerno, which guards the relics of Saint Matthew the Apostle and Evangelist. You will have the option of celebrating Mass here in Salerno. This afternoon opt to relax at your hotel or visit the Historic Ruins of Pompeii during an optional tour of this vast archaeological site. (B, D)

Day 8: Tuesday, November 1, 2022 Campania - Abbey of Montecassino - The Catacombs - Rome

Travel to Montecassino and discover the renowned abbey founded by St. Benedict in the 6th century A.D., housing the relics of the saint and his sister, Saint Scholastica. Montecassino also became famous during World War II, when the abbey was bombed and destroyed. You'll have the option of celebrating Mass here before continuing to Rome. Visit the Catacombs where early Christians hid and buried their dead. (B)

**Vatican Museums are not available on most Sundays and holidays.

To complete your tour, we include roundtrip airport-to-hotel transfers when purchasing our airfare with your tour. If you have arranged for your own air, we are pleased to provide you the option of purchasing these transfers. Please note that all transfers will leave at pre-scheduled times.

Single accommodations are limited and are available on a first come, first served basis.




The little Brown Scapular Coloring Book, The Story, Miracles and the Rosary
