Thanksgiving Basket Guidelines

For those who are planning to prepare a basket of food to donate to those in need, there are a few guidelines to follow when putting it together.

- 1. Please bring the food to St. Vincent's school gym on Monday, November 23 between 6:30 a.m. 3:00 p.m.
- 2. Choose a turkey or roasting chicken appropriate for the family you wish to feed:
 - 1-2 people: a chicken or turkey breast or small turkey.
 - 3-4 people: a turkey 12 15 lbs.
 - 5-6 people: a turkey 16 18 lbs.
 - 7 or more people: a turkey 19+ lbs.
- 3. <u>Make sure the bird is frozen and wrapped securely in newspaper and brown bag.</u> This will keep the bird cold and prevent thawing. Important: *Please write the turkey size on the outside of the brown bag.*
- 4. Include the "fixings" for a Thanksgiving Dinner rolls, stuffing, cranberry sauce, yams, vegetables, gravy, nuts, pies (not frozen) and some festive candies.
- 5. No frozen food, except the turkey, should be included in the box. No milk, butter or other dairy products that would spoil without refrigeration for several hours.
- 6. No alcoholic beverages, please.
- 7. Place heavier foods on the bottom and crushable items (desserts, pies, fruit, rolls, etc.) on top.
- 8. Fresh fruits and vegetables are always welcome and appreciated.
- 9. Mark the outside of the box/basket indicating the number of people it is designed to feed. A list of the contents of the box taped to the outside would also be appreciated.



CELEBRATING ADVENT AT ST. VINCENT MARTYR

Advent is the season of quiet waiting and joyful anticipation for the coming of Christ. With the busyness of our modern culture the idea of quiet waiting might be lost. It is our challenge to find time during the four weeks of Advent to prepare to meet our Lord – at the end time and to welcome Him as the infant on Christmas morning.

Be still and know that I am God. Psalm 46:11

As Advent is upon us the days are short and the air gets colder. It is a beautiful season to appreciate the stillness of the long nights. As each day gets shorter we

are reminded that the day of the Lord's birth is quickly approaching. The time is busy – but try to find some time to still your heart and your mind to make a place for the Prince of Peace.

You also must be ready, because the Son of Man will come at an hour when you do not expect him. Luke 12: 40

As we arrive at Church next weekend, many things will be different – the colors, the music, the readings (from Luke's Gospel), and the environment. All of these changes are meant to aid us in our quest for quiet reflection as we prepare to meet the Lord. The four weeks of Advent have a threefold purpose: first, to prepare for the anniversary of the Lord's birth at Christmas; second, to focus on our reception of the Lord in Eucharist and lastly, to be ready to meet the Lord at the final coming.

During the holy season of Advent we will once again spend more time in quiet reflection during our weekend liturgies. There will be a period of silence after the readings and homily in order to give a reflective moment and we will only have instrumental music during the Preparation Rite.

What is new for Advent?

- Before the Entrance Song is announced a member of our Parish Liturgical Ministry will welcome the assembly and ask each
 person to introduce themselves to those around them. This new practice has a two-fold benefit: first, we can welcome and
 greet visitors with us and also get to know our parish family and second, we will learn the names of those liturgical
 ministers who serve weekly in the parish.
- After the Consecration and before the Our Father, the celebrant (at the 5:00 PM Saturday and 9:00 AM on Sunday) will call forth any children in the assembly to come up on the altar to pray the Lord's Prayer together with the priest and for the exchange of the sign of peace.
- The Music Ministry will lead us in a new entrance song, *Light a Candle for All to See*. Our Gathering Rite will change a bit and Barbara will teach us the beautiful new music in the weeks ahead. The words change each Sunday in Advent and will be in the inside covers of the Breaking Bread books.

Advent offers us the opportunity for a new beginning. Not only does it take place at the start of the liturgical year, but also offers us a chance to re-examine and deepen our faith.




