MARCH 27, 2016 EASTER SUNDAY OF THE RESURRECTION OF THE LORD

- o 696 Donors gifted and/or pledged **\$5,841,876.00** towards Partners in Faith, Building for the Future.



WEEKLY READINGS EASTER SUNDAY OF THE RESURRECTION OF THE LORD First Reading: Acts 10:34a, 37-43

Peter discusses Jesus' life of preaching and healing. Jesus was crucified, and then he rose up and was seen by his chosen witnesses. Peter also mentions the importance of all the disciples bearing witness to what they saw, so that many people would believe in Jesus, and have their sins forgiven through him.

Second Reading: Colossians 3:1-4

Paul asserts that we must pay attention to higher realms rather than earthly concerns. Our life is not yet completely known to us, until Christ appears and we are raised to glory in him.

Gospel: John 20:1-9

When Mary Magdalene discovered Jesus' tomb was open, she told Simon Peter and another disciple. They ran to the tomb and Peter went inside. He found the burial wrappings on the ground, with the head covering separate from the rest. The other disciple came in and they believed what they saw, although until then they had not understood the Scripture's message of Jesus' resurrection.



Primera Lectura: Hch. 10, 34^a. 37-43

Domingo de Resurrección

"La Pascua de la Resurrección es la fiesta de las fiestas. Si el domingo es en la semana el "día del Señor", la Pascua de Resurrección es dentro del año la "fiesta del Señor". Es la fiesta del Señor resucitado, vivo y presente en nuestra historia, desde su nuevo estilo de vida. Entró en la historia en carne mortal, como celebramos en Navidad. Esa carne mortal fue aplastada, maltratada por los que ejecutaron su muerte; pero por su resurrección afirmamos que sigue en la historia. Está en nuestra historia con un modo distinto de ser, ya no es mortal, y con una distinta presencia, ya no es visible; pero es el mismo Jesús histórico cuya vida, Pasión, Muerte y Resurrección nos relatan los evangelios. La fiesta de la Resurrección, pues, es la fiesta en la que celebramos que con nosotros sigue Jesús. El que llamamos Cristo el Señor no fue un gran hombre cuya vida hemos de recordar e imitar, pero que pertenece a tiempos pasados, sino que está presente en nuestra existencia actual. Y está dándole sentido, razón de ser, y ofreciendo la promesa del triunfo definitivo más allá del dolor de nuestro peregrinar por el mundo y más allá incluso de la misma muerte: en Él hemos resucitado todos".
