We often miss Advent's power because these December weeks are full of secular Christmas parties and preparations for Christmas. Each year, the busyness of this season serves to distract us from having an Advent season that truly prepares us for the celebration of Christmas, with all its meaning. This site offers simple ways to enter into this Advent season, week by week, in the midst of our everyday lives.

Preparing our Hearts and asking for the Grace

We prepare this week by stepping up the longing. We move through this week by naming deeper and more specific desires.

Each morning this week, if even for that brief moment at the side of our beds, we want to light a second inner candle. We want to let it represent “a bit more hope.” Perhaps we can pause, breathe deeply and say,

“Lord, I place my trust in you.”

Each day this week, as we encounter times that are rushed, even crazy, we can take that deep breath, and make that profound prayer. Each time we face some darkness, some experience of “parched land” or desert, some place where we feel “defeated” or “trapped,” we hear the words, “Our God will come to save us!”

The grace we desire for this week is to be able to hear the promise and to invite our God to come into those real places of our lives that dearly need God's coming. We want to be able to say:

“Lord, I place my trust in your promise. Please, Lord, rouse your power and come into this place in my life, this relationship, into this deep self-defeating pattern. Please come here and save me.”

Each night this week we can look back over the day and give thanks for the moments of deep breath, that opened a space for more trust and confidence in God's fidelity to us. No matter how difficult the challenges we are facing - from the growing realization of our personal sinfulness, to any experience of emptiness or powerlessness, even in the face of death itself - we can give thanks for the two candles that faithfully push back the darkness. And, we can give thanks for the graces given us to believe that “Our God will come to save us” because we were given the courageous faith to desire and ask boldly.

*Come, Lord Jesus. Come and visit your people.
We await your coming. Come, O Lord.*

Message from the Pastor

I am happy to announce that our Saint Vincent Martyr School Middle School addition will be dedicated on Sunday, February 12, 2017 at 2:00 p.m. by Bishop Serratelli. Stay tuned for further details on this momentous occasion!

Also, our church renovation project is moving ahead on schedule. We will be having another parish update meeting in January to present a new walk through

I have had to choose which of these I will support, as it is impossible to give to them all. The same is true of the parish. You have invited to give when you can, where you can. From another perspective the requests that are made make us ever aware of the great need for our help that exists in our community and our world.

Our parish will celebrate the sacrament of Reconciliation on **Tuesday, December 13 at 7:00 p.m. at St. Thomas More Church in Convent Station**. Advent begins the Church year and gives us the opportunity to focus on the coming of Christ – at the end of time and as the Christ Child. What better way to prepare to meet the Lord than with the sacrament of Reconciliation. All are invited to celebrate with our parish family.

IT'S BEGINNING TO LOOK A LOT LIKE CHRISTMAS.....

We are blessed at St. Vincent's that so many of our parish families bring their families and guests to worship with us on Christmas Eve and Christmas Morning. In order to assure that our Campus and our Worship Spaces are safe, secure and prayerful we are initiating some new plans for Christmas at St. Vincent's.

In order to accommodate our numbers, we will continue to use an additional location for our early **Vigil Christmas Eve**. Mass will be celebrated **at 4:00 PM** in TWO locations:

- The Lower Church, St. Vincent Martyr
- St. Paul Inside the Wall, 205 Madison Ave., Madison

The Mass at St. Paul's will be staffed by our parishioners and musicians and the celebrant will be one of our priests! We are excited that this expansion is necessary and we are anticipating all to go smoothly.

- Our Christmas Liturgy will be held at 6:00 PM on Christmas Eve in our Lower Church. Our Cherub Choir (Grades K – Gr. 2), Christmas Pageant and gifts for our children will all be a part of this special liturgy with Fr. George, our Pastor, as celebrant.
- Additional Christmas Eve Masses: 8:00 PM (Spanish) and 10:30 PM (Carols begin at 10 PM).
- Christmas Day Liturgies will be celebrated in our Lower Church using the regular Sunday schedule.
- Our **parking lot will have volunteers** who will assist as you arrive for Mass on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day. If the weather cooperates on Christmas Eve, we suggest that you might walk to Mass or park on the street or downtown if that works for your family since parking is limited.
- Once all the marked spaces are full, we will need to close the parking lot in order to keep all the fire lanes open. (This is required by the Madison Fire Chief.)

THE STEWARDSHIP CORNER

Beginning this weekend and extending into the weeks ahead we will be featuring reflections on stewardship as a way of life for today's Catholic.

I first heard about stewardship during my pastorate at Saint Gerard Parish in Paterson, New Jersey. What most impressed me about this concept was that it was rooted in gratitude. Stewardship looks at life through the eyes of faith and sees that all we have and all we are is gift from God. This engenders a deep thankfulness in our hearts and souls that compels us to ask the question voiced by the psalmist in the Hebrew Scriptures: what return can I make to the Lord for all the good He has done for me? (Psalm 116:2) The answer to this biblical query is sacrificial giving - putting ourselves in service of the needs of others by sharing our time, talent and treasure. Our offering to the Lord is made from the first fruits of our lives, not from what is left over when we are done taking care of ourselves. This calls us to be intentional in our giving, to plan our activities, involvement, charity and support for our church.

Personally, I strive to practice a stewardship way of life and have found in that effort a greater joy and serenity in living. When I came to Saint Vincent Martyr, I was very happy to see that we identify ourselves as a stewardship parish. Over the past year I have been meeting with a small group of your fellow parishioners to better understand what it means for us to embrace stewardship as a faith community and to grow in our awareness of how we can live our call to be good and faithful stewards in more authentic ways. Over the next months we will be sharing with you our insights regarding this challenge and the plan that we have developed to revitalize our stewardship at our parish. I am grateful to the men and women who will be leading us on this exciting journey into a deeper understanding of who we are as a people - GIFTED, GRATEFUL AND GIVING!

THANKSGIVING OUTREACH

Through your generous support, we were once again able to meet all of our commitments for our annual Thanksgiving Outreach Program. Your donations of baskets, gift cards (total- \$1,975) and financial support (total - \$3,115) allowed the parish to provide a total of 317 baskets of food for those in need. The breakdown is as follows:

- 115 baskets to local families
- 100 baskets to La Vida, formerly called Friendship Corner, a Catholic Charities resource in Paterson
- 50 baskets to the Vocationist Sisters in Florham Park who distributed the baskets in Newark
- 52 baskets, @ 205 lbs. of rice, @ 20 lbs. of beans, 250 lbs. of potatoes, 16 extra turkeys and chickens and 4 boxes of canned goods to St. Agnes Church in Paterson

The sincere gratitude and appreciation expressed by those receiving a basket made all of our efforts worthwhile.

Thank you to the army of faithful volunteers who worked so tirelessly to help—the group of men and their families who picked up our Sunday Shop-Rite order (in the middle of NFL football games!), the Sunday team who put together boxes, unpacked and distributed the Shop-Rite order, the Monday teams who processed and delivered those heavy baskets and the Tuesday morning team who delivered our St. Agnes donations. A special word of thanks to the takedown team assigned to the lower church on Sunday who graciously (and without being asked) continued working after takedown was completed to help us set-up for the Outreach. Sincere thanks and appreciation to Keith Amling and Tom Kenny for their help with set-up, takedown, accepting box and table deliveries and numerous other behind the scenes tasks. Organizing this year in light of the many functions taking place in the lower church required cooperation, patience and teamwork and everyone stepped up! An extra big thank you to our parking lot volunteers who endured brutal winds and cold temperatures in unloading parishioners cars during a very long day.

Thank you to Miss Gisoldi and the team of teens and parents who conducted another successful scavenger hunt for us on Sunday. A big thank you also to the SVMS students, their teachers and staff who donated and decorated baskets in order to help us meet our commitments and to Mrs. Stefanelli and the Christian Formation classes for their very generous donation of canned goods, potatoes, fruit, and many other items.

So many volunteers assist year after year; I am truly grateful for the hard work, energy and good cheer you provide; what a wonderful parish family!



para la gran de Venida del
Salvador del Mundo: Jesús

Hemos iniciado el tiempo de Adviento, palabra que deriva del Latín: *Adventus* que significa “venida”. En este tiempo nos preparamos para esa gran venida, la venida del Salvador del mundo,, del salvador de nuestras vidas. En este tiempo esta compuesto por cuatro semanas, o cuatro domingos, la tercera semana o el cuarto domingo es llamado *Domingo de Gaudete*, palabra que significa regocíjense; en ese domingo hacemos un pare y nos regocijamos porque la venida del Salvador, Jesús, está cerca. El color litúrgico para este domingo es el color Rosado o Rosa. Durante los cuatro domingos estaremos leyendo en la primera lectura del profeta Isaías.

Isaías es el profeta que nos ensena la importancia de volver nuestro corazón al Señor que llega. Es el profeta que nos enseña que un salvador vendrá al mundo para redimirlo. Isaías es el profeta que nos muestra al Mesías llamándolo Emmanuel, nombre que significa, Dios con nosotros. En el tiempo de Adviento, tendremos una corona a la que llamamos la “Corona de Adviento” la cual contiene cuatro cirios, tres de color morado y una de color Rosado, para el tercer domingo de *Gaudete*. Los cirios se irán encendiendo cada domingo. Donde Cada uno de nosotros podremos rezar y presentar nuestras intenciones al Señor porque Él es nuestra luz que guía nuestra vida cuando se encuentra en la oscuridad. La invitación es vivir este tiempo de Adviento como si fuera el último de nuestras vidas y así podemos experimentar el amor de Dios que purifica y tran
