St. Vincent Martyr Parish has a long tradition of practicing Stewardship. Recognizing that Stewardship is more than simply giving money, the parish strives to encourage all parishioners to give their "first fruits" back to God – in time, talent and treasure. This sense of generosity comes from acknowledging how richly blessed we are by God and responding to Him in gratitude.

Last spring, we shared with you the generous response we received from our time and talent stewardship commitment campaign. With over 250 commitment cards completed, our parishioners generously committed (and recommitted) their time to prayer and their talent to 50+ ministries, filling more than 700 ministry positions. We are happy to share with you now the financial results of our Gifted, Grateful and Giving Program.


As you know, our yearly parish financial reports had shown us that while we had been able to meet our ordinary expenses with current contributions, we had little left to invest in savings. We need additional revenue to advance the ever widening mission of our parish and to care for our building and grounds. As a result of your renewed prayerful and sacrificial giving we are now able to better advance the mission of our parish to share Christ's love through prayer, ministry, education and service.

Some Results:

- All of our parishioners who regularly give to St. Vincent Martyr recommitted their valued support, with 64% increasing their level of support
- From that group, 54% increased their support by 30% or more
- Through the Gifted, Grateful and Giving program, 38 families newly committed themselves to financially support the parish
- The annual offertory for the parish is expected to increase by \$200,000

We are grateful for every sacrificial offering as each of us gives according to our ability. Through your generous sharing of your time, talent and treasure we have been abundantly blessed!



XXXI Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

Primera Lectura: Mal. 1, 14. 2,2.8-10

Malaquías, de donde se toma la lª Lectura de hoy (1,14b-2,2), es más un libro de oráculos que un profeta, ya que la personalidad que subyace en el texto del último de los profetas nos muestra una dimensión difuminada de la actividad profética; de un tiempo mucho más tardío (480/460 a. C), aunque antes de la reforma de Esdras y Nehemías, tras lo que se hará callar a los profetas para siempre hasta el momento del Nuevo Testamento.

Segunda Lectura: 1Tes. 2, 7-9. 13

Este lectura espiga algunos versos del c. 2 de esta primera carta de Pablo, con objeto de poner de manifiesto aspectos que el apóstol siente y que evocan la evangelización de la comunidad, su amor como padremadre de la misma. En ese sentido, pues, no solamente estaba dispuesto a entregarles el evangelio, sino su vida si hubiera sido necesario

Evangelio: San Mateo 23, 1-12

El evangelio de hoy refleja claramente las actitudes de Jesús con los dirigentes que le acusaron y le llevaron al juicio condenatorio. Las controversias que han precedido en Jerusalén han puesto de manifiesto la separación, el abismo diríamos, entre la concepción religiosa de los escribas, sacerdotes y dirigentes y la del profeta de Nazaret. Pero en el caso del

evangelio de Mateo, este conjunto que hoy se lee en la liturgia, adquiere, si cabe, tonos más controvertidos que lo que se ha transmitido en Mc 12,38-40 y Lc 20,45-47. Se han ampliado las acusaciones, cuando precisamente el evangelio de Mateo tiene un origen mucho más judío que los otros.

El Año de la Sagrada Escritura

El pasado mes de Septiembre, mes donde recordamos la memoria de San Jerónimo, gran santo y Padre de nuestra Iglesia a quien le debe su traducción de la Biblia del Griego y Hebreo al Latín por mandato del Papa Dámaso I, hemos iniciado, como comunidad hispana de la Parroquia San Vicente Mártir, el año de la Sagrada Escritura, donde todos los fieles de nuestra comunidad tendrán un encuentra personal y profundo con la Palabra de Dios.

San Jerónimo, padre de Iglesia, nos recuerda que: "El que desconoce a la Escritura, desconoce a Jesús". Este año, todos nosotros, la comunidad hispana de San Vicente Mártir, conocerá un poco más de Jesús a través de la lectura activa de la Palabra de Dios.

Los invito para que continuemos abriendo y leyendo uno de los tesoros más valioso que podemos tener en nuestras vidas, la Palabra de Dios. Que por la intercesión de San Jerónimo, nos llenemos del Espíritu Santo y nos entremos y abracemos a la Palabra hecha carne, Jesús, a través de la lectura de la Palabra de Dios.
