

The Pastor's Corner

As many of you know it has been a tradition of mine to end my Christmas homilies with a song. Although I am still searching for this year's selection (I am writing this four days before Christmas) there has been one song that has caught my ear as a possibility - it is entitled "Jesus is Alive" by John Wilson. I know what you are thinking - that sounds like an Easter song. In a sense you are right. The song gives voice to the truth that the Savior in the manger changes everything. Jesus will go on to live, die and rise again - and ultimately bring us home to heaven. Thus the refrain brings Christmas and Easter together - "Noel, Noel! Jesus is alive. Emmanuel, hope is here tonight. So go and tell the world that death has died. Noel, Noel - Jesus is alive!"

I am sure that the reason I connected with this beautiful tune is that my personal journey since last Christmas included walking through the grief of losing my Dad. Like all of us who experience the death of someone we love, I have been approaching the Christmas feast with a bit of anxiety - wondering what will it be like without my father. But then I hear the Easter message sung with a Christmas message in perfect harmony, giving me hope and bringing peace to my heart and soul. Because Jesus was born and is alive I know where my Dad is. Because Jesus was born and is alive I know I will see him and my Mom and my sister again.

Because Jesus was born and is alive I can be close to everyone I love who now live in Him and are united with us in our worship of God, Father, Son and Spirit!

Indeed, the joy of the Christmas festival is found in the alleluia of the Easter that we celebrated every Sunday as God's holy church.

My prayer for you, my dear friends, is that on this holy night and this happy day you allow yourselves to be drawn ever more deeply into the mystery of God's love that we celebrate at Christmas. Feel the embrace of the Father's arms assuring you that all will be well. Look upon the infant Jesus and adore him as your Lord and Savior. Let your heart be flooded with the Holy Spirit moving you out into the world to spread the good news we celebrate - God is with us and for us - today, tomorrow and forever - Amen.

A very blessed and Merry Christmas to you all!





Adviento: La Figura de María

Nos aproximamos a la Navidad y crece la importancia de la figura de la <u>Virgen</u> María en la preparación a la gran fiesta de la Encarnación del Hijo de Dios. Es interesante recordar las enseñanzas de Pablo VI en la exhortación apostólica Marialis Cultus del dos de febrero de 1974. Allí nos decía el <u>Papa</u> Pablo VI:

"Durante el tiempo de Adviento la Liturgia recuerda frecuentemente a la Santísima Virgen —aparte la solemnidad del día 8 de diciembre, en que se celebran conjuntamente la Inmaculada Concepción de María, la preparación radical (cf. Is 11, 1.10) a la venida del Salvador y el feliz exordio de la Iglesia sin mancha ni arruga—, sobre todos los días feriales del 17 al 24 de diciembre y, más concretamente, el domingo anterior a la Navidad, en que hace resonar antiguas voces proféticas sobre la Virgen Madre y el Mesías, y se leen episodios evangélicos relativos al nacimiento inminente de Cristo y del Precursor.

De este modo, los fieles que viven con la Liturgia el espíritu del Adviento, al considerar el inefable amor con que la Virgen Madre esperó al Hijo, se sentirán animados a tomarla como modelos y a prepararse, "vigilantes en la oración y... jubilosos en la alabanza", para salir al encuentro del Salvador que viene. Queremos, además, observar cómo en la Liturgia de Adviento, uniendo la espera mesiánica y la espera del glorioso retorno de Cristo al admirable recuerdo de la Madre, presenta un feliz equilibrio cultual, que puede ser tomado como norma para impedir toda tendencia a separar, como ha ocurrido a veces en algunas formas de piedad popular el culto a la Virgen de su necesario punto de referencia: Cristo. Resulta así que este periodo, como han observado los especialistas en liturgia, debe ser considerado como un tiempo particularmente apto para el culto de la Madre del Señor: orientación que confirmamos y deseamos ver acogida y seguida en todas partes".
