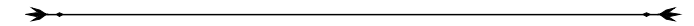

SAINT VINCENT MARTYR CHURCH  
GIFTED, GRATEFUL, AND GIVING!

*What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if someone says he has faith but does not have works?  
Can that faith save him?*  
James 2:14

This passage makes it clear that faith and love are not alive in us until they are demonstrated through *works*. “Works” of any kind will involve some self-denial. Getting up early to serve at the soup kitchen on a day off requires sacrifice. Helping out in the Christian Formation program when work emails are waiting costs time. Praying in front of the abortion clinic may get one jeered at by passers-by. Making a sacrificial gift each week to the offertory may mean having to give up some dinners out or the newest tech product.

But when we do these costly works and embrace the self-denial they require, we have the joy of knowing our faith and love are *real*. We attain the peace of soul that only comes from imitating Jesus’ way of life. By laying down our lives for Him, we gain a life that is really worth living

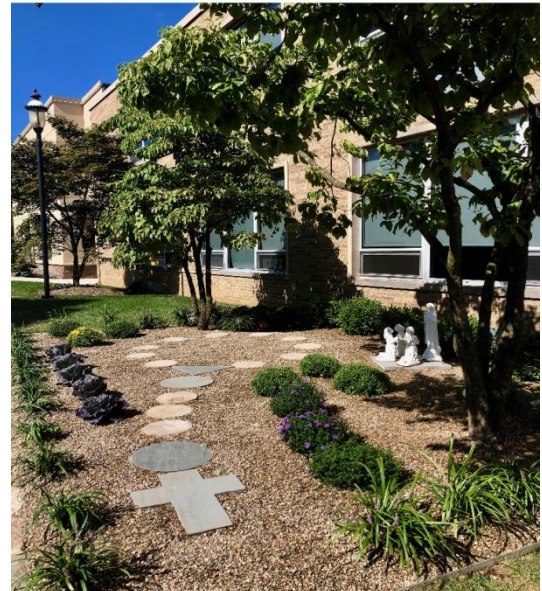


## ROSARY ALTAR SOCIETY

### What is a Rosary Garden?

The word *rosary* comes from the Latin word *rosarium*, meaning “rose garden.” In the mid-1500s, *rozaire* came to mean “a garden of prayers” from the medieval concept of compiling a collection of items, which could include flowers, into bouquets. This apparently originated in the late 1400s with the printing of a prayer book, *Hortulus Animae*, that literally meant “little garden of the soul.” Creating a bouquet of prayers eventually led to a string of knots to track one’s praying. Now, isn’t that sentiment just lovely — a Rosary as a prayerful bouquet from the garden of our soul!

### How do you use our Rosary Garden?

A Rosary Garden creates a peaceful environment ideal for contemplative prayer or quiet reflection. Stepping stones take the place of beads and can be walked around as one meditates on the mysteries of the most Holy Rosary. Our smaller garden contains stones to say one decade of the Rosary. One can continue to walk around 5 times to pray and meditate on one group of mysteries.

### How did our Rosary Garden come to be?

Our Rosary Garden was a gift from the SVMS Class of 2018. The statues of Our Lady of Fatima and the shepherd children was given to us by Monsignor Christopher DiLella, former pastor of our parish. What makes this even more significant is that the graduating class of 2018 celebrated the 100-year anniversary of Our Lady of Fatima during their 8<sup>th</sup> grade year.

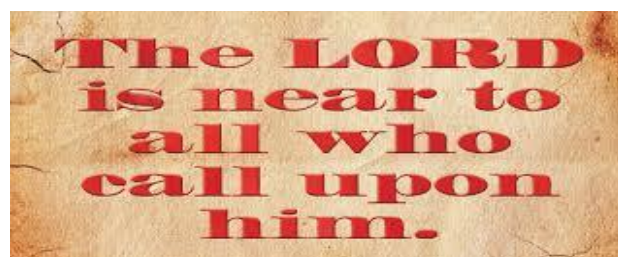

### **María Magdalena: La Tumba Vacía**

Esta semana seguimos reflexionando el capítulo 13 del libro "De la Cruz a la Tumba Vacía", de nuestro obispo Serratelli, traducido a nuestra lengua.

En su comisión dada a María, el Señor Resucitado cumple las palabras del Profeta: *"Derramaré mi espíritu sobre toda carne, tus hijos y tus hijas profetizarán"* (Joel 3, 1; ver *Mulieris Dignitatem*, 16).

Por la palabra de Jesús, María Magdalena su fe regresa. Ahora ella lleva esa palabra a otros. Primero en los evangelios para ver al Señor resucitado, luego comparte la buena nueva con los demás. María Magdalena es, como bien dice la tradición: *"el apóstol de los apóstoles"* (Rabanus Maurus, *De vita beatae Mariae Madgalenae*, XXVII). Aquellos que realmente creen siempre regresan, como María, deseosos de contarles a otros la alegría de haber conocido al Señor resucitado". Continuaremos la próxima semana con este capítulo.
