



Stewardship Corner

Serving at the Morristown Community Soup Kitchen and Outreach Center has been a very popular ministry among our parishioners, but the serving time is not always convenient for everyone who is interested. The Soup Kitchen has shared with us other times that they are in need of volunteers: **Breakfast** is served daily and volunteers are needed 7 days a week from 8:50 – 10:30 am. Additionally, the Soup Kitchen runs a **Free Farmers Market** on Mondays and Fridays with two volunteer shifts available. The market is set up and produce is sorted from 10:30 -12:30 p.m., and the market is open from 12:45 - 2:30 p.m. You can sign up for one or both shifts. The Free Farmers Market is also open on Wednesdays from 3:00 - 4:45 p.m. perfect if you would like your children to volunteer alongside you. Occasionally, help is needed **moving canned goods** from the offsite pantry to the kitchen. The schedule varies but you can put yourself on an email list and be notified when help is needed. If you would like to participate in the **kitchen safety training** that would enable you to help in preparing meals, there is a session scheduled for February 12 (18 and over only; reservations required).



El Buen Ladrón: La Divina Misericordia

Esta semana terminaremos reflexionando el octavo capítulo del libro "De la Cruz a la Tumba Vacía" de nuestro obispo Serratelli, traducido a nuestra lengua. "Jesús es más generoso en su respuesta de lo que el criminal jamás podría haber imaginado. Jesús ahora le habla a alguien en los últimos momentos de su vida. "En verdad te digo, hoy estarás conmigo en el paraíso" (Lucas 23, 43). Jesús le asegura la salvación. Él cumple la misión que inauguró en la sinagoga de Nazaret cuando anunció su ministerio de proclamar la liberación de los cautivos y liberar a los

oprimidos (véase Lucas 4, 18-19). El criminal se unirá a Jesús en el paraíso en el banquete con los pobres, los cojos y los lisiados (véase Lucas 14, 21).

Jesús dijo: "Si me enaltecen, atraeré a todos hacia mí" (Juan 12, 32). Su profecía se está cumpliendo ya que el criminal a su derecha se dirige a Él con fe. Este criminal está terriblemente sufriendo, muriendo y subiendo con Jesús. Su conversión en el lecho de muerte lo ha convertido en un verdadero discípulo: es alguien que está con Jesús. El Jesús Crucificado no baja de la Cruz para salvarse. Él permanece clavado en su madera para salvarnos. Su cuerpo traspasado se convierte en la fuente desbordante de misericordia para cada pecador.

El Evangelio de Nicodemo del siglo XII, nos dice que el nombre del criminal que reza a Jesús en la Cruz es Dismas. Otro evangelio apócrifo relata sus primeros años. Según ese evangelio, Dismas era el líder de una banda de ladrones en Egipto. Cuando la Sagrada Familia huyó de Herodes el Grande después del nacimiento de Jesús, se unieron a él. Él discernió algo especial acerca de ellos y sus hombres los perdonaron. Treinta años después, vio a ese niño una vez más, clavado en una cruz (ver el sexto siglo, Evangelio de la Infancia Árabe). Esto es simplemente una leyenda. ¡Pero la oferta de salvación de Cristo Crucificado no lo es!

La escena de los dos criminales crucificados a cada lado de Jesús representa gráficamente el evangelio completo. Jesús se encuentra en compañía de pecadores. Algunos lo aceptan. Otros no lo hacen. El moribundo a su derecha es un pecador, culpable del mal. Él ha perjudicado a otros por su vida. Él ha ofendido a Dios. Sin embargo, no duda en volver a Jesús en la Cruz y pedir lo que no merece. La tradición bautiza cariñosamente a este criminal como "el buen ladrón". Con sus últimas palabras, se robó el cielo. Pero, es bueno recordar que no se puede robar lo que se da gratuitamente. ¡El buen ladrón ya no es ladrón! Su salvación, como la nuestra, es un regalo de lo divino".
