Message from the Pastor

Almost four years ago our parish welcomed the newly ordained Father Darwin Lastra as our new Parochial Vicar. His arrival was greatly anticipated not only because we were being blessed with a new priest, but also because I had been without an associate and our Spanish community had been without a spiritual leader for over five months. He quickly settled in and made Saint Vincent Martyr parish his home. And now, in what literally feels like a blink of an eye we are sending him forth to pastor a community of his own, Our Lady of Good Counsel in Pompton Plains. In accord with diocesan policy he will begin as an Administrator and then after about six months he will officially become Pastor. Interestingly, Fr. Darwin follows the footsteps of Fr. Antonio, going to a parish that does not have a Latino community as part of its population. He might even lose his Columbian accent!

It was a bit of a challenge to put together a fitting send-off for Fr. Darwin in such a short period of time - he received his call from the Bishop just two weeks ago and is already at work tending his new flock. But as we know, with God and with the spirit of generosity ever present here at SVM, all things are possible. Thank you to everyone who made it happen. I know that we are going to miss Fr. Darwin at our parish - he blessed us in so many ways in his ministry to us. His gentle spirit, his sense of humor, his heartfelt preaching, his humility and his great reverence in praying the liturgy are just some of the characteristics of his priestly service.

Reflecting on his ministry to our Latino parishioners I am amazed at the caring and patient way he grew that community over those years. True to the teaching of Jesus he sowed the seeds of God's love in the hearts and souls of the people he served and waited for the Lord to bring forth the harvest of one hundred fold - and so He did!

My deepest thanks to this community for your continued embrace of the priests and deacons that come to us from other countries. Your acceptance, your openness, your caring and your love has created a church where these men can grow in their sacred ministry and develop the gifts God has given them for service to his people. I am extraordinarily proud of you as your pastor and as a member of this parish family.

For me personally I feel so blessed to have shared these years with Father Darwin, who has become a true brother and a true friend. He has been my sounding board when I got stressed and uptight, my support when I was dealing with the challenges of parish life, my colleague and helper in so many church projects and as Father Przemek would attest to, a fun person to live with in our rectory. Most of all he has been a true reflection of Christ which is why I know he will be an excellent pastor to the people of Good Counsel.






This year, donations to our Lenten Almsgiving Outreach will be for the **Romero Center Ministries**, located in Camden, NJ.

The Center was founded to honor St. Oscar Romero, the Archbishop of El Salvador who in defending the poor, was martyred in 1980. Their primary mission is to be an urban retreat center that would ground people in Jesus' call to serve the poor among us.

Through their Urban Challenge Program, the retreat center offers suburban high school and college-aged students the opportunity to immerse themselves in Catholic Social Teaching principles through prayer, reflection, community sharing, and perform service to those in need in the Camden community. The Romero Center emphasizes that we are all part of one human family, and we belong together. The retreat participants are told that "the most important thing that will happen on these experiences is not what they will do for others, but what others will do for them." Through these retreats of prayer and service, it is hoped that a seed will be planted within the young people to carry forth the call of Christ to serve others, and understand their role in bringing about a societal commitment to end poverty and discrimination in our world.

The funds will be used to subsidize the program since all the costs aren't covered and some of the participants can't afford the program fees.


The drawing will be held the evening of our event, however, you do not need to be present to win!

La Multitud: La Gracia Divina

Esta semana seguimos reflexionando el séptimo capítulo del libro "De la Cruz a la Tumba Vacía" de nuestro obispo Serratelli, traducido a nuestra lengua.

"Lucas es el único evangelista que habla de la presencia de una gran multitud que sigue a Jesús. Tal vez, Lucas está pensando en aquellos individuos que estuvieron presentes

en el pretorio de Pilato y que gritó por su

crucifixión. Cuando Pilato había ofrecido liberar a Jesús en honor a la Pascua, habían exigido, la liberación de Barrabás, un conocido asesino. La multitud había sido manipulada por los enemigos de Jesús.

Las multitudes son fácilmente manipulables. El anonimato de la multitud enmascara la responsabilidad personal. Las personas en las multitudes piensan diferente que cuando están solas. Siempre debemos ser conscientes de que, ya sea que estemos con otros o solos, somos responsables de nuestras propias decisiones y acciones. La conciencia nunca es absuelta apelando a los demás. Tenemos que hacer lo correcto, no importa lo que otros, incluso si sus números son grandiosos, pueden hacer.

Quizás Lucas también está pensando en aquellos que siguen a Jesús en el camino al Calvario como individuos que habían esperado que Jesús los liberara de la tiranía de Roma. Pero ahora se dieron cuenta de que esto nunca pasaría. Jesús se había negado a aceptar el papel del Mesías político que ellos se imaginaron para Él. Como resultado, sus esperanzas se rompieron en pedazos".

La próxima semana continuaremos reflexionando este capítulo.
