Message from the Pastor

This weekend, at the beginning of our 12 Noon Mass, we place a new crucifix in the alcove over our tabernacle. The image of Christ on the cross is that of the Eternal High Priest which draws its inspiration from the Letter to the Hebrews found in the New Testament.

Since then, we have a great high priest who has passed through the heavens,
Jesus, the Son of God, let us hold fast to our profession of faith.
For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize
with our weakness, but one who was tempted in every way that we are,
yet never sinned. So let us confidently approach the throne of grace
to receive mercy and favor and to find help in time of need. (Hebrews 4:14-16)

On the cross Jesus extends his arms to us, His hands bearing the wounds of his crucifixion, inviting us to be drawn more deeply into His love for you and me. That love transforms us into His likeness, just as the bread and wine are transformed into His Body and Blood. Jesus Christ is both priest and sacrifice, as He offered Himself to the Father on our behalf, reconciling us to God and opening the way for us into heaven.

At our baptism we were given a share in the priesthood of Jesus Christ through the anointing with the Sacred Chrism. This is the priesthood of all believers which is exercised in our worship of God, in particular when we gather for Sunday Eucharist. As the bread and wine is carried up to the altar, we are called to consciously place ourselves and all the sacrifices of the past week on the altar with the gifts to be united with Christ's perfect sacrifice to the Father.

Our common priesthood is also exercised in 'offering up' in love the work we do and the trials we endure, as a sacrifice of praise of God and intercession for others in need. Studying for exams, changing a dirty diaper, going to work to provide for our families - these are all activities that become opportunities for Christians to exercise their sacred priesthood.

As the priesthood of the faithful, lay women and men are called to consecrate the secular, the earthly, the nitty-gritty realities of life to God. When we give thanks over a meal we consecrate it to God's glory and sanctify it. When we offer our work in sacrifice and live out our Christian witness in the work place, we consecrate our work and sanctify it. The laity consecrate and animate the world with the Spirit of God, in places where priests and nuns may never go, elevating, purifying, sanctifying and blessing.

Finally, Christ the High Priest presents Himself to all those ordained to the priesthood reminding us that we are to be 'another Him'. Just as Christ emptied himself totally in love for all of us, we priests must do the same in service of our brothers and sisters. We must remember that apart from Christ we can do nothing. He must shine forth and be made manifest in our sacred ministry. Our lives must be holy as He is holy, which can only happen when we rely totally on His grace and conform our wills to His. And so I pray:

Christ the Eternal High Priest have mercy on those you have called to the priesthoodpurify us and make us ardent but gentle preachers of the gospel and faithful stewards of your mysteries. Amen.

Our new crucifix is hand carved in wood from a German artisan. It is donated in memory of our beloved, Barbara Carey by her devoted husband, Thomas and her loving children and grandchildren.

Donations to our Lenten Almsgiving Outreach will be for the **Romero Center Ministries**, located in Camden, NJ. The Center was founded to honor St. Oscar Romero, the Archbishop of El Salvador who in defending the poor, was martyred in 1980. Their primary mission is to be an urban retreat center that would ground people in Jesus' call to serve the poor among us. Through their Urban Challenge Program, the retreat center offers suburban high school and college-aged students the opportunity to immerse themselves in Catholic Social Teaching principles through prayer, reflection, community sharing, and perform

service to those in need in the Camden community. The Romero Center Ministries:

- Hosts over 1,400 guests annually
- Retreatants travel to Camden from over 100 high schools, colleges, and parishes from 15 different states
- In 2018, they welcomed seven new high schools and churches from New Jersey, New York, Massachusetts, and Virginia
- Nearly 25,000 hours of service each year.

The funds will be used to subsidize the program since all the costs aren't covered and some of the participants can't afford the program fees.
