

Message from the Pastor

This past Wednesday, on May 1, the Feast of St. Joseph the Worker, we welcomed to our parish Father Jader J. Avila as our new Parochial Vicar. In his letter of assignment to Father Jader, Bishop Serratelli wrote this: "It is significant that you begin your priestly ministry at Saint Vincent Martyr on the Feast of St. Joseph the Worker. Saint Joseph opened himself to the word of the Lord and to do what the Lord asked of him; you are to follow in that same spirit that Saint Joseph did, so that you will be able to bring the Lord to the people you serve".

Like Father Darwin, Father Jader is from the district of Barranquilla in Colombia. The major part of his work in our parish will be with the Latino community where he will build on the good foundation provided by Fr. Darwin. He will also be involved in ministering to the great community as our parish priest. When he was moving in I was pleased to see that a guitar was among his possessions. I am confident that we will jam well together not only as musicians but more importantly as brother priests and that you will give to him the same warm embrace you have shared with so many others. Who knows - maybe Fr. Chris plays the drums! We shall see!


In the meantime we will continue to enjoy the heartfelt priestly ministry of our Fr. Przemek whose service to our parish we will celebrate on the weekend of June 8/9, with a special liturgy at 10:30 a.m. on Sunday, June 9 followed by a reception in the gym. "Jesus, we trust in you."

As you know, from time to time I will comment on a newspaper headline that sometimes, in my view, speaks to our faith. In the Arts section of the NY Times on Tuesday, April 9 the front page had this story: "Anti-Abortion In Hollywood: The makers of "Unplanned" have a hit despite hurdles. The movie "Unplanned" is based on the memoir of the same name by Abby Johnson, a former director of a Planned Parenthood clinic in Bryan, Texas, who stepped up and stepped out as a leader in the pro-life movement after experiencing a crisis of conscience. The film portrays her conversion narrative and includes three unflinching portrayals of abortions, the first and most explicit of which occurs in the first ten minutes of the film. The article in the Times concludes with this paragraph: "This movie tells the truth, and a lot of times we don't get the opportunity to see that," said Cheryl A. Riley, Director of the Respect Life Office for the Archdiocese of Newark, who organized the viewing and works with women who have had abortions. Describing herself, like Johnson, as formerly in favor of abortion rights, Riley choked up while recalling her own experience terminating a pregnancy at 19 - "I know that story and I know that pain".

The fact that the NY Times acknowledged the power and importance of this film is a moment of grace in a world that can be so mired in secularism and relativism. When we move to religious publications such as our own Beacon, the Catholic News Service and the National Catholic Reporter we get an even more pointed commentary on the movie - viewing it from the context of our Catholic faith. Among these, Bishop Robert Baron's shines as a profound statement not only on the movie but also on the issues it addresses. Entitled "Seeing Abortion" it compares Abby Johnson to Harriet Beecher Stowe and her role in giving people a vivid presentation of the concrete reality of slavery. I encourage you to give it a read (the article can be found in the April 25 issue of the Beacon or by googling - "Abortion Word on Fire."

For me personally I plan to take the recommendation of many folks I have spoken with to see the movie - I am sure that I will find it an unsettling and uncomfortable experience - which is what we need at times to be more grounded in the truths of our faith and more committed to spreading the Gospel of Life.



In today's Gospel, we find the Apostles dejected and discouraged following the death of our Lord. Poor Peter decides to throw in the towel on the whole disciple thing, declaring, "I'm going fishing." Upon hearing this, the other disciples follow him. But look how Jesus treats the disciples during their "backslide." He is right there with them, already waiting for them on the shore. When we find ourselves "out at sea" Jesus is with us! He is calling to us from the shore to come back to Him without shame or embarrassment, but with hope-filled trust in His steadfast love. He never tires of offering "do-overs" if we just keep returning to Him. This is the essence of a stewardship way of life. Good stewards are not necessarily those who have mastered some perfect formula. They are those who continue to get back up after each fall, who are willing to continually reevaluate their goals and priorities as they aim for Heaven. Good stewards simply have more confidence in the goodness of the Lord than fear of their own failure. Please join us in praying for Pope Francis' intention for May: That the Church in Africa, through the commitment of its members, may be the seed of unity among her peoples and a sign of hope for this continent.



The mission of the Sound Start Babies Foundation for Deaf and Hard of Hearing Children is to support families of babies with hearing loss during the most critical years of brain development - birth to age 3 - with identification, evaluation, therapeutic intervention and education, regardless of their financial status. The state of NJ only contributes approximately 1/3 of the costs needed by the *Sound Start Babies Program*, the all-volunteer Foundation raises the rest.

2 to 3 of every 1000 babies are born with a hearing loss, 90% of these children come from a "hearing family." If babies with hearing loss don't receive specialized, intensive therapy during these critical years of brain development, irreversible delays in speech and learning can occur. Early intervention therapies from *Sound Start Babies* help babies learn to listen, speak and communicate so they can lead a limitless life.

**Tercer Domingo de Pascua
5 de mayo de 2019**

“Pedro, junto con los Apóstoles, respondió: ‘Hay que obedecer a Dios antes que a los hombres. El Dios de nuestros padres ha resucitado a Jesús, al que ustedes hicieron morir suspendiéndolo del patíbulo. A él, Dios lo exaltó con su poder, haciéndolo Jefe y Salvador, a fin de conceder a Israel la conversión y el perdón de los pecados. Nosotros somos testigos de estas cosas, nosotros y el Espíritu Santo que Dios ha enviado a los que le obedecen.’”

Cuando la gente se pregunta cómo empezar a aprender sobre la iglesia católica, o a leer la biblia, la respuesta más clara se encuentra en los sermones de San Pedro y San Pablo en los Hechos de los Apóstoles. TERCER DOMINGO DE PASCUA

Primera Lectura: Hechos 5:27-32, 40b-41

El gran sacerdote castigó a Pedro y a los otros apóstoles por continuar predicando cuando ya se les había ordenado no hacerlo. Pedro replicó que el prefería obedecer a Dios que a los hombres, considerando que el poder de Dios es mayor que la muerte. Se les advierte que dejen de hablar de Jesús, y luego se les deja libres.

Segunda Lectura: Apocalipsis 5:11-14

Evangelio: San Juan 21:1-19

Cuando así lo hicieron, agarraron una gran cantidad de peces. Jesús entonces preguntó a Pedro tres veces “¿Me amas?” Cuando Pedro dijo que sí, Jesús le pidió cuidar y alimentar a sus ovejas.
