

In today's Gospel, Christ refers to the struggle to put Him above all else as He encounters two "would-be" disciples on His way to Jerusalem. "'Follow me,'" Jesus says to the first man. "But he replied, 'Lord let me go first and bury my father.' The other said, "I will follow you, Lord, but first let me say farewell to my family at home." These two want to follow Christ, but only on their own terms.

To this, Christ says thanks, but no thanks! Following Him requires an unqualified "yes" not a "yes, but..." We are called to put Christ and His kingdom ahead of our own plans if we truly wish to be His disciples. Living stewardship as a way of life can go a long way in arming us for victory in the battle of selfishness. The daily discipline of committing to a specific offering of our time, talent and treasure strengthens us and helps us gradually move away from the "yes, but" attitude and towards an unqualified "yes!" to Christ and His will. Please join us in praying for Pope Francis' intention for July: That those who administer justice may work with integrity, and that the injustice which prevails in the world may not have the last word.

Culture of Life Corner

This January New York Governor Andrew Cuomo signed a law permitting abortion in case of fetal inviability or when necessary to protect a patient's life or health up to the mother's due date, allows for non-doctors, like nurse practioners and physicians assistants, to perform the abortion, and then lit up the Empire State Building in pink to celebrate. Illinois' state senate passed legislation that goes even further. It repeals a ban on partial-birth abortion, mandates health insurers cover abortion for any reason, removes conscience provisions that protect doctors or hospitals with moral objections, and explicitly states that, "a fertilized egg, embryo, or fetus does not have independent rights under the laws of this State." Their governor signed this into law. Rhode Island's governor has just signed similar legislation.

Our Holy Father offers a counter-cultural message. "Abortion is never the answer," Pope Francis said at a recent Vatican conference on caring for children with challenging prenatal diagnosis. He went on to say, "the Church's teaching on this point is clear: human life is sacred and inviolable and the use of prenatal diagnosis for selective purposes must be strongly discouraged because it is the expression of an inhuman eugenics mentality, which removes the possibility for families to accept, embrace and love their weakest children."

Let us ask the Holy Spirit to help us defend the weakest among us.



Justicia y Paz: alerta aumento de trata de personas en Venezuela

"Investigar, procesar, juzgar y condenar a los responsables de los delitos de trata de personas": esto es lo que la Comisión de Justicia y Paz y Cáritas de Venezuela están pidiendo a las autoridades del Poder Público Nacional, en una nota que comienza con las palabras del Papa Francisco: "La trata de personas es un crimen contra la humanidad La justicia debe proceder sin demora El documento está firmado por Mons. Roberto Lückert, Arzobispo Emérito de Coro,Presidente de la Comisión de Justicia y Paz de la Conferencia Episcopal Venezolana y por Don Saúl Ron Braasch, Vicario General de la misma Comisión.

En particular, en la nota, los organismos episcopales subrayan la necesidad de "garantizar a las familias de las víctimas el acceso directo, sin obstáculos, a los cuerpos de seguridad del Estado y a los órganos judiciales, para que expongan sus casos y reciban justicia sin demora, de conformidad con lo dispuesto en la Constitución y en los diversos instrumentos internacionales para la protección de los derechos humanos, firmados y ratificados por la República Bolivariana de Venezuela".

Las mujeres entre las víctimas más afectadas

El documento se refiere específicamente a un encuentro entre los responsables de Justicia y Paz y los familiares de las 28 personas desaparecidas en Güiria, en el Estado Sucre, mientras navegaban en un barco hacia la isla de Trinidad y Tobago, que partió el 23 de abril. De este encuentro se desprende que "la mayoría de las personas desaparecidas en esta ocasión eran mujeres, contactadas por personas que les habían ofrecido trabajo y mejores condiciones de vida". En mayo, otro barco desapareció, de nuevo con un grupo considerable de personas a bordo.

Alarma para niños abandonados

Los familiares también se quejaron de que, aunque se les informó de que sus familiares, en su mayoría mujeres jóvenes, habían muerto en el naufragio, todavía no se habían encontrado los cadáveres y los encargados de la investigación no respondían con prontitud.

"La Comisión -continúa la nota- observa con preocupación el aumento de este tipo de hechos no sólo en la parte oriental del país, sino también en las zonas fronterizas de Falcón, Brasil y Colombia, donde operan estos grupos de delincuentes que ponen en peligro la vida, la integridad física y la dignidad de las mujeres, especialmente los jóvenes y los menores, creando gran ansiedad y desesperación en sus familias y especialmente en los niños abandonados.

La Comisión y Cáritas continuarán haciendo seguimiento a estos casos y acompañará a los familiares dentro de sus posibilidades para la obtención de justicia, la información oportuna y el esclarecimiento de los casos.

El mensaje termina con un llamado: ¡Donde están mis hijas (os)! Luchemos contra la venta de niños, mujeres y hombres como esclavos para dedicarse a la mendicidad, la prostitución o trabajos forzados.
