
PRACTICING GOOD STEWARDSHIP IN OUR PARISH: PARTICIPATION





La xenofobia alimenta cultura del odio en Estados Unidos

La Iglesia Católica propone acciones pastorales contra el odio y las armas

Ciudad del Vaticano

"México y Estados Unidos están en una batalla contra el tiempo, en la que la xenofobia, que alimenta de manera acelerada la cultura del odio en el país vecino, es el principal enemigo a superar": estas son las primeras líneas del editorial del boletín católico de la Ciudad de México "Desde la fe" en su publicación de ayer 11 de agosto.

Es necesario un mayor control sobre la compra de armas

El comentario se refiere a los últimos casos ocurridos en los últimos días: "Los masivos tiroteos del fin de semana pasado que mataron al menos a 29 personas y dejaron medio centenar de heridos en Texas y Ohio, una vez más han puesto sobre la mesa la exigencia al presidente de Estados Unidos, Donald Trump, y al Congreso que legisle a favor de un mayor control en la adquisición de armas por parte de civiles.

Falta de valores

La situación -continúa el editorial- es particularmente compleja: "Lo que la sociedad norteamericana no puede entender es que no son sólo las armas las que causan estas acciones criminales, sino que hay un trasfondo más complicado que tiene sus raíces en la falta de valores, empezando por el respeto a la vida, y en esto, los obispos de ese país siempre han señalado el punto clave".

Proteger la vida

"La USCCB (Conferencia Episcopal de los Estados Unidos) ha abogado desde hace tiempo por leyes de armas más responsables y por mayores recursos para abordar las causas fundamentales de la violencia - dice "Desde la fe" - También ha pedido al Presidente y al Congreso que dejen de lado los intereses políticos y encuentren formas de proteger mejor la vida de los inocentes. Sin embargo, frente a esta petición, los obispos encontraron oídos sordos.

El presidente de la Conferencia de Obispos Católicos de los Estados Unidos (USCCB), el cardenal Daniel DiNardo, ha pedido a la sociedad norteamericana no tragarse la mentira de que los tiroteos masivos son una excepción aislada, sino una epidemia contra la vida.

Construyendo una Humanidad Auténtica

"Hoy, la Iglesia en este país ha decidido no esperar más -continúa el texto- y ha decidido emprender una acción preventiva y una campaña pastoral para abordar las formas en que, como institución, puede ayudar a combatir "esta enfermedad social que ha infectado a la nación".

De ahí la invitación a los católicos a "aumentar la oración y el sacrificio para poner fin a estos tiroteos, pero sobre todo a expresar su voz a favor de los cambios necesarios en la cultura nacional para que la bandera del odio xenófobo deje de cobrar fuerza". "Construyamos una auténtica cultura de la humanidad", concluye el mensaje. (Agencia Fides)
