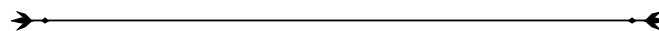

BLESSING OF HOMES ON THE FEAST OF THE EPIPHANY - THIS WEEKEND



There are a number of customs associated with the Feast of the Epiphany, such as the blessing of homes and the inscribing of doorways with the names of the Magi. May the inscription be a witness of your faith to others and may the peace of our loving God dwell in your home and in the hearts of all who dwell there.

To bless your home, gather your family at a doorway to your home. If you live alone, you may want to share this blessing with friends or make it time for private prayer.

Begin by saying: Let us praise God who fills our hearts and homes with peace! Blessed be God forever! The word became flesh and made his dwelling place among us. It is Christ who enlightens our hearts and homes with his love. May all who enter this home find Christ's light and love.

The following intercessions are then said: The son of God made his home among us. With thanks and praise let us call upon him as we respond: **R: Stay with us Lord**

- Lord Jesus Christ, with Mary and Joseph you formed the Holy Family: remain in our home, that we may know you as our guest and honor you as our Head, we pray, **R.**
- Lord Jesus Christ you had no place to lay your head, but on the spirit of poverty accepted the hospitality of your friends: grant that through our help the homeless may obtain proper housing, we pray, **R.**
- Lord Jesus Christ, the three kings presented their gifts to you in praise and adoration: grant that those living in this house may use their talents and abilities to your great glory, we pray, **R.**

Then using the chalk that was blessed and distributed at church, a designated member inscribes the following over the doorway:

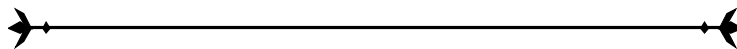
20 + C + M + B 20

(The numbers are those of the New Year - the initials, C, M, B representing the Magi - Caspar, Melchour, Balthaser - and the three crosses stand for 'saint.' The letters also abbreviate the prayer "Christus Mansionem Benedicat" which means May God bless this house.)

Conclude the blessing by praying: Lord God of heaven and earth, you revealed your only begotten Son to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless this house and all who inhabit it. Fill us with the light of Christ that our concern for others may reflect your love. We ask this through Christ our Lord.

May we always be with Christ in all our comings and goings. Amen.

SECURITY MINISTRY

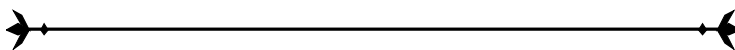

Stewardship

Our Gospel passage, from Matthew, has much to teach us about stewardship, through the actions of the magi. The magi were watching for manifestations of God's presence in their lives. "We have seen the star at its rising," they say. Good stewards are keenly aware of the "star" of God's presence and His gifts in their lives. It is this awareness that fills them with gratitude and the desire to both worship God and share His gifts with others.

The magi, upon seeing the manifestation of God's presence in their lives, "were overjoyed." Good stewards, who live with the awareness of God's presence and gifts to them, simply can't help but be filled with joy. Not necessarily the fleeting and superficial kind of joy the world promises through wealth or power, but rather the deep, unalterable joy only God can give.

Finally, the magi were so filled with awe upon encountering the newborn Jesus, they prostrated themselves before him and "opened their treasures and offered him gifts." This is precisely why good stewards generously share their material gifts — as a loving act of worship to an extravagantly loving God. Let us rejoice in God's manifestations in our lives and be watchful for the new ways He is calling us to share ourselves and our gifts in gratitude to our King in the year ahead.

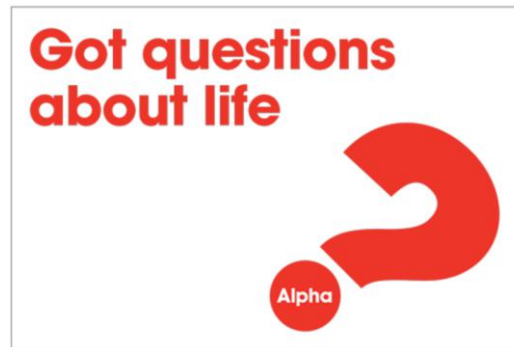

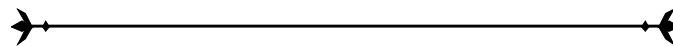

Adult Confirmation Classes



St. Vincent is now offering an adult Confirmation process for any interested baptized Catholic. Generally, this formation process will involve instruction and faith sharing sessions starting in January and leading up to Confirmation at the Easter Vigil. The instruction process will take place jointly with the RCIA through Easter. The focus of the program is to connect the practice of our Catholic Faith to our experiences in our everyday lives. For many who participate in this program, it is an opportunity to see, for the first time, the faith of the Church with an adult

understanding. The resources are varied and many and they include a scripture study of the Gospels, The US Catholic Catechism for Adults, the Bible and some of the Vatican II documents. El Papa en la Fiesta de la Sagrada Familia: retomar la comunicación en la familia

María, José y Jesús, representan una respuesta “coral a la voluntad del Padre”: ellos se ayudan recíprocamente a realizar el proyecto de Dios, rezando, trabajando y comunicándose. Que ellos, dijo el Papa en su reflexión de hoy, “sean modelo” para nuestras familias, a fin de que padres e hijos “se sostengan mutuamente en la adhesión al Evangelio, fundamento de la santidad de la familia”.

Griselda Mutual – Ciudad del Vaticano

En la fiesta de la Sagrada Familia de Nazaret el Papa Francisco se asomó a la ventana de su estudio en el Palacio Apostólico Vaticano, para rezar junto con los fieles y peregrinos la oración mariana del Ángelus. A María, “Reina de la familia”, encomendó a todas las familias del mundo, especialmente a las extenuadas por el sufrimiento o el malestar.

En su meditación antes del rezo mariano, fue puesta de manifiesto la obediencia de María, la de José y la del mismo Jesús, que es “la voluntad del Padre”. Ellos, dijo el Pontífice, adhirieron “libre y responsablemente” al

proyecto de Dios. La Sagrada Familia de Nazaret “estuvo totalmente disponible a la voluntad de Dios”.

La obediencia en la docilidad de María

Centrándose en cada uno de los miembros de esta familia, el Santo Padre destacó primeramente la “docilidad” de María a la acción del Espíritu Santo, que le pide que se convierta en la Madre del Mesías:

María, como toda joven mujer de su tiempo, estaba a punto de realizar su proyecto de vida, es decir, casarse con José. Pero cuando se da cuenta de que Dios la llama a una misión particular, no duda en proclamarse su "sierva" (cf. Lc 1,38).

El Papa señaló que de María, Jesús exalta su grandeza, y lo hace “no tanto por su papel de madre, sino por su obediencia a Dios”. Aun cuando Ella “no comprende plenamente los acontecimientos que la involucran”, en silencio “medita, reflexiona y adora la iniciativa divina”. Y su presencia al pie de la Cruz “consagra” esta disponibilidad total suya.

La obediencia en la acción de José

De José, Francisco resaltó su obediencia en la acción, puesto que el Evangelio “no nos deja ni una sola palabra”, porque “él no habla, sino que actúa obedeciendo”. José es “el hombre del silencio, el hombre de la obediencia”, dijo. Y recordó que la página del Evangelio del día (cf. Mt 2,13-15.19-23) alude bien tres veces a la obediencia del “justo José”, quien “bajo la guía de Dios, representado por el ángel” “aleja a su familia de las amenazas de Herodes y la salva”.

De este modo la Sagrada Familia se solidariza con todas las familias del mundo que se ven obligadas al exilio; se solidariza con todos aquellos que se ven constreñidos a abandonar su propia tierra a causa de la represión, de la violencia y de la guerra.

Jesús, la voluntad del Padre

“Finalmente, - continuó el Papa - la tercera persona de la Sagrada Familia, Jesús. Él es la voluntad del Padre: en Él – dice san Pablo – no hubo ni ‘sí’ y ‘no’, sino sólo ‘sí’”. (cf. 2 Co 1,19).

Francisco señaló que la obediencia de Jesús “se manifestó en muchos momentos de su vida terrenal”, y puso como ejemplo el episodio en el templo, cuando sus padres, angustiados, lo buscaban. A ellos Jesús respondió: “¿No saben que yo debo ocuparme de los asuntos de mi Padre” (Lc 2,49). También recordó el constante repetir del Maestro: “Mi alimento es hacer la voluntad de Aquel que me ha enviado”. Y su oración en el Huerto de los Olivos: “Padre mío, si este cáliz no puede pasar sin que yo lo beba, que se cumpla tu voluntad” (Mt 26,42).

Todos estos eventos – aseguró el Santo Padre – son la realización perfecta de las mismas palabras de Cristo que dice: “Tú no has querido ni sacrificio ni ofrenda [...]”. Entonces he aquí que vengo [...] a hacer, oh Dios, tu voluntad”. (Heb 10.5-7; Sal 40.7-9).

Es necesario retomar la comunicación en la familia Evangelio, fundamento de la santidad de la familia”.

Encomendamos a María "Reina de la familia" a todas las familias del mundo, especialmente a las que están extenuadas por el sufrimiento o las dificultades, e invocamos sobre ellas la protección divina.
