From Father George

Before Christmas I wrote about our Holy Father's letter on the importance of the Nativity scene to the celebration of Christmas. He made mention of the custom of adding additional figures to the manger: "from the shepherd to the blacksmith, from the baker to the musicians, from the women carrying jugs of water to the children at play: all this speaks of the everyday holiness, the joy of doing ordinary things in an extraordinary way, born whenever Jesus shares his divine life with us."

I thought about this part of Pope Francis' letter when I looked back on our parish celebration of Christmas. I feel a deep gratitude for all who made the feast come alive here at Saint Vincent Martyr with your prayer, your participation and your generosity. In our parish nativity scene we had singers and musicians and bell ringers. We had decorators and florists and banner hangers. We had chair movers, car parkers, and collection takers. We had servers and sacristans and ministers of Word and Sacrament. We had greeters, planners and priests. We had gift givers, gift organizers and gift sharers. And most of all we had you! Thank you for your investment of time and talent which is PRICELESS! And thank you for your investment of treasure in our Christmas collection which totaled \$129,075. I would say that it takes a village to celebrate the birth of our Savior and King. Thank you for being such a faithful part of our village at St. Vincent Martyr. Thank you for doing ordinary things in an extraordinary way! God bless.

The March for Life

This year our Right to Life Committee are joining ranks with Our Knights of Columbus to make it possible for us to participate either by presence or by prayer in the March for Life which is being held on Friday, January 24. The March for Life which takes place in Washington, D.C. was first held in 1974 and was intended as a one-time event in hopes that the Supreme Court would reverse Roe v. Wade. Roe v. Wade was a legal decision issued on January 22, 1973 in which the U.S. Supreme Court struck down a Texas statute banning abortion, effectively legalizing the procedure across the United States. The court held that a woman's right to an abortion was implicit in the right to privacy protected by the 14th amendment to the Constitution. Catholic teaching states that the right to life is more fundamental and extends this right to a child from the moment of conception. The March for Life immediately became a yearly event, embraced by people of all faiths as an effective way to give witness to the sanctity of life and to advocate for change.

Our parish supports the March for Life and all other efforts to advance a culture of life, from womb to tomb. Personally, I support any peaceful protest against anything that does not uphold the fundamental dignity of every man and woman and every child, born and unborn.

This commitment is at the heart of the Prayer for Life being distributed at our masses this weekend by the Knights of Columbus. The prayer is written by St. John Paul II and asks for Mary's intercession in spreading the Gospel of Life. I encourage you to use this prayer in praying a nine day novena beginning on Thursday, January 16 and extending through Friday, January 24. This is a very good way to participate in the March for Life through prayer. For those who would like to add their presence to this effort we are providing a comfortable coach bus to the March for Life on January 24. The bus will leave from the SVM parking lot at 7:00 a.m., following a 6:30 a.m. Mass in the church. The bus will return by 10:00 p.m. that same day. There is no cost for the bus. Stewardship

Though sinless, Jesus submitted himself to the baptism of John the Baptist. He entered the waters of the Jordan River so that we could be baptized not just with water but with the Holy Spirit. Jesus humbled himself throughout his life on earth to bring us all the gifts of God's love. The first gift is baptism, which opens us up to faith, to the Holy Spirit, and to all the other sacraments that follow. Our baptism is a commitment we make to share Jesus' concern for the lost and the broken. If Jesus is willing to stoop down and live a life of service for the poor, we must be willing to do the same or we cannot call ourselves his followers.

We are all searching for God. If He has seemed distant and hard to find, it could be that we are looking in the wrong places. Perhaps we are looking on the mountaintops when we should be looking in the streets. Perhaps we are reading books when we should be feeding bellies. Until we are ready to get ourselves dirty, to risk our comfort, and to give without counting the cost, God will remain elusive to us. However, if we can follow Jesus into the wet and murky places of our world, it could just be that we will be surprised by his marvelous light shining out from where we least expect it.

Please join us in praying for Pope Francis' intention for January: We pray that Christians, followers of other religions, and all people of goodwill may promote peace and justice in the world.



There are five women in the genealogy of Jesus Christ. In a time when genealogies didn't normally contain even a single female name, why are these women included? And what does their presence imply?





La experiencia de Dios no nos bloquea, sino que nos libera

Lo dijo el Papa Francisco a la hora del Ángelus en la solemnidad de la Epifanía del Señor en que saludó, además de a los fieles y a los figurantes de la típica procesión histórico-folklorica, a las comunidades de las Iglesias Orientales, católicas y ortodoxas, muchas de las cuales celebran mañana la Navidad del Señor y a quienes les deseó la luz y la paz de Cristo Salvador
Ciudad del Vaticano

Después de celebrar la Santa Misa en la solemnidad de la Epifanía del Señor, el Santo Padre rezó a mediodía la oración mariana del Ángelus con los miles de fieles y peregrinos que se dieron cita a mediodía en la soleada Plaza de San Pedro en la que también estaban

presentes los figurantes de la procesión histórico-folklorica, inspirada en las tradiciones de esta fiesta.

Tras destacar que en esta ocasión se recuerda a los Reyes Magos que, procedentes de Oriente llegaron a Belén siguiendo la estrella, para visitar al Mesías recién nacido, el Papa se refirió a un detalle del Evangelio que suscita nuestra reflexión. Y es que al final del relato, se dice que estos Magos "advertidos en un sueño que no debían regresar a lo de Herodes" lo hicieron por otro camino. También aludió al hecho de que estos sabios, tras postrarse y adorar al Niño Jesús – a quien le ofrecieron sus preciosos dones – volvieron a su tierra para relatar a los suyos aquel encuentro que los cambió. La experiencia de Dios cambia nuestra existencia

Por esta razón el Obispo de Roma dijo que "la experiencia de Dios no nos bloquea, sino que nos libera; no nos aprisiona, sino que nos vuelve a poner en camino, nos devuelve a los lugares habituales de nuestra existencia". Los lugares son los mismos, pero nosotros, después del encuentro con Jesús, no somos los mismos que antes. El evangelista Mateo subraya que los Magos regresaron "por otro camino". Y que fueron inducidos a cambiar su ruta para no encontrarse con Herodes y sus tramas de poder.

Otro camino que sana el corazón y nos separa del mal Francisco agregó que "cada experiencia de encuentro con Jesús nos induce a emprender caminos diferentes", dado que "de Él proviene una fuerza buena que sana el corazón y nos separa del mal".

Somos nosotros los que debemos cambiar

El Santo Padre se refirió asimismo a esa "sabia dinámica entre continuidad y novedad", que indica que somos nosotros los que "debemos cambiar, transformar nuestro modo de vivir, si bien en el mismo ambiente de siempre" y modificar nuestros "criterios de juicio sobre la realidad que nos circunda".

"Esta es la diferencia entre el verdadero Dios y los ídolos traidores, como el dinero, el poder, el éxito...; entre Dios y cuantos prometen darte estos ídolos, como los magos, los adivinos, los hechiceros. La diferencia es que los ídolos nos atan a sí mismos y nosotros tomamos posesión de ellos. El verdadero Dios no nos retiene ni se deja retener por nosotros: nos abre caminos de novedad y de libertad"
