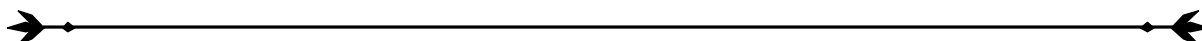

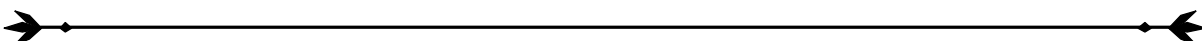

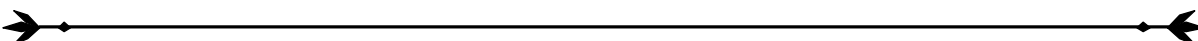
I am writing this article on the morning after my Covenant House Sleep Out. As you know we were not able to go down to Newark this year because of the Pandemic (I can hear the collective sigh of relief from all my maternal friends out there). Instead we slept out right here in Madison in Niles Park. That experience not only gave me a sense of solidarity with the homeless youth that Covenant House seeks to serve but also in a special way this year with all of you! When I do these sleep outs I do not do them as Fr. George alone. I do them as part of a team who together raised over \$177,000.00 and as part of a larger effort that brought in over \$1.1 million. Most of all I sleep – or at least try to sleep – as part of this parish family. I sleep for us! I felt your presence in a particular way being so close to the places where you live. It also reminded me that homelessness is not just an urban experience. There are homeless youth in every community. Thank God for Covenant House who seeks them out and gives them a home filled with love! I love how we support our charities here at the parish – many people giving what they can together making one big gift – I am so proud to be part of that effort!



On Monday, November 16, we officially gifted the village of Madison with the beautiful pine tree that has been growing for 15 years on the south side of the church. This was actually the third tree that Saint Vincent Martyr gave the town. I am not sure which year we donated the first tree – we think it was over where the old convent used to be. The second was in honor of our 200th anniversary of the parish and the 100th anniversary of the building of our church in 2005. After solemnly blessing the tree after Mass that morning (see pictures on our website) I spent some time watching the crew from town take down the tree for transport to Waverly Place. It was a fascinating process. I could actually feel this beautiful tree give up its roots so as to let itself be a gift for all who will look upon it, bringing Christmas hope and cheer into their hearts! I was not alone in witnessing this wonderful event. In addition to us adults that were present were three little children with their moms – a boy and two girls. They were so excited. Their moms even went home to get out their Christmas hats for the occasion. When I was thinking about who might light the tree on the day after Thanksgiving I could think of no one better than these three little parishioners. Our children are our promise for tomorrow in a world that we are called to make more loving, more peaceful and kinder today!



What a great task for the season of Advent that we begin today. Our collect or opening prayer for Mass reads: Grant your faithful, we pray, Almighty God, the resolve to run forth to meet your Christ, with righteous deeds at his coming. I would like to suggest that our righteous deed for this year should look like gestures of love, expressions of peace and acts of kindness. These will go a long way in preparing the way of the Lord into our hearts and into our world. I wish all of you a blessed Advent season. As we journey together towards the Christmas feast let us travel that path as mindfully and intentionally as we can, taking one step at a time, maybe even slowing it down a bit, and allow God to bring us to the manger, where we will find in His Son hope, calm, joy and love. God bless!

CHRISTMAS OUTREACH



If Thanksgiving is right around the corner, then Christmas cannot be far behind. Work is underway for our annual Christmas outreach. Each year we have had a generous and warm response to the poor and struggling in our community, and throughout our Diocese. Because of the generosity of so many of you, we can bring some of Christ's light into the lives of many. This year, due to the COVID-19 pandemic and the effects that it has had on so many, we need to limit the scope of our Outreach and focus it on the many local Madison families and senior citizens who are in need of our support.

While the Outreach will function quite differently from the way it has in the past, your help is still very much needed as:

We would like to be able to provide each child with a gift card to

Walmart or Target to help their family fulfill their gift request. Most of the children in the program are under the age of 16 and their requests for gifts are often very simple.

We would very much like to provide each family with a local food gift card to enable them to plan a Christmas meal without the constraints of a tight budget.

We would like to provide each gift recipient with a gift card to either Walmart, Target or Old Navy, to assist them with their clothing needs since the gift requests we receive from local families are often for clothing, specifically warm, winter clothing.

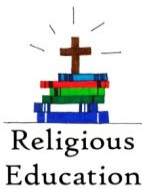

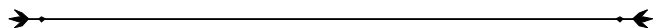

El Papa: buscar el bien común, el desprestigio del otro mina la posibilidad de acuerdos.

Es necesario "rehabilitar la política", una de las formas más preciosas de la caridad, por el bien de todos los pueblos. La profundidad de la crisis actual reclama proporcionalmente "la altura" de la clase política-dirigente, para que sea "capaz de levantar la mirada y dirigir y orientar las legítimas diferencias en la búsqueda de soluciones viables para nuestros pueblos". Lo dijo el Papa en un video mensaje dirigido al Seminario virtual «América Latina: Iglesia, Papa Francisco y los escenarios de la pandemia».

El Santo Padre se hizo presente con un video mensaje en el Seminario virtual «América Latina: Iglesia, Papa Francisco y los escenarios de la pandemia», organizado por la Pontificia Comisión para América Latina (CAL) junto con la Pontificia Academia de Ciencias Sociales y el Consejo Episcopal Latinoamericano (CELAM). Con la esperanza de que la iniciativa pueda "inspirar caminos, despertar procesos, crear alianzas e impulsar todos los mecanismos necesarios para garantizar una vida digna a nuestros pueblos, especialmente a los más excluidos, a través de la vivencia de la fraternidad y la construcción de la amistad social", el Sumo Pontífice saludó a los participantes y agradeció a los organizadores que se reunieron de forma virtual para reflexionar y analizar la situación de pandemia de Covid-19 en la región, sus consecuencias y las posibles líneas de acción y ayuda solidaria a desarrollar.

Contribuir, compartir y distribuir

En el vídeo el Pontífice constata que la pandemia del COVID hizo "aún más visibles vulnerabilidades

preexistentes", como la falta de un techo seguro donde poder cumplir el distanciamiento social, la falta de agua y de recursos sanitarios para higienizarse y desinfectar los ambientes, un trabajo estable que garantice el acceso a los beneficios. Francisco piensa en aquellos que "además de sufrir el embate de la pandemia, ven con tristeza que el ecosistema de su entorno está en serio peligro por los incendios forestales que destruyen extensas zonas como el pantanal, la amazonia", que son "el pulmón de América Latina y del mundo" (ver <https://www.vaticannews.va/es>)
