"Hope is being able to see that there is light despite all of the darkness." - Desmond Tutu

Some of you may have noticed that I have been limping a bit over the past weeks. The reason for that is a probable torn meniscus in my right knee.

Rather than jump into surgery my doctor is having me do some physical therapy to alleviate the condition. I am receiving the therapy at Summit Medical's facility in Florham Park. The elevator there is restricted to two people at a time, with a designated dot to stand on for the ride. Each dot has an inspiring quote from a figure in history, such as the one that I cite at the heading of this article. It was the movement of the Holy Spirit that put me on that dot since lately I have been thinking a lot about light.

Now combine that with the little annotation on todays daily meditation (February 2) by Fr. Richard Rohr where he notes that "candles were historically blessed on this day to mark the halfway point between the winter solstice and the spring equinox and the slow return of light. Secular America created Groundhog Day with the same unconscious hope."

Clearly 'hope' and 'light' go together. As we grow in hope the light shines brighter and we ourselves become beacons of hope for others. In a recent homily I made a reference to light from a favorite Christian message song by We Are Messengers – the refrain is: We are made in the image of God, beautiful shades of love, made in the image of God, that's where the light comes from! Friends, if we can truly anchor (the symbol of hope) ourselves in the truth that everyone of us is a beloved child of God then our hope will be deepened. What does an anchor do? It holds the boat in place. We are held by God – God is never going to let us go. Secure in His embrace we can move forward in life doing good, not because it will gain us anything, but simple because it is the right thing to do. Each infusion of goodness in our homes, our church, our nation and our world brings forth the light. And every ray of light pushes back the darkness.

This journey through the pandemic has been so long and many of us are feeling tired. I want to encourage us to take heart-literally, to take heart! Claim your place in the heart of Jesus! Let us rest there with one another and be invigorated by the Spirit that holds us together as one. Then firm in our belief that the light is greater than the darkness may we step courageously forward into the future committed to the work that is ours to do as disciples and as church - to be light and to be love for one another and the world.




A FAMILY PERSPECTIVE

Presentación de Jesús en el Templo. Esperar y reconocer la vida nueva

Hoy, cuarenta días después de la Navidad, es la fiesta de la Presentación del Señor en el Templo, que celebra el encuentro luminoso entre Jesús y la humanidad que le espera. En el reconocimiento del Mesías por parte de Simeón y Ana, la confirmación de una tenacidad y una obstinación, a pesar de la fragilidad, que vencen la tristeza y la desolación

Antonella Palermo - Ciudad del Vaticano

Según las prescripciones del Antiguo Testamento, relativas a la pureza cultural (Lv 12,1-8), una mujer era impura después de dar a luz durante cuarenta días y debía ofrecer al templo, como sacrificio de expiación, un cordero y una paloma joven; si era pobre, dos palomas jóvenes. También Jesús fue presentado por María y José al templo para ser redimido, para la ceremonia de la purificación: a Dios, de quien procede todo, se debía toda primicia, incluido el primer hijo varón. Simeón es el verdadero israelita, justo y piadoso, guiado por el Espíritu (como los profetas), que espera al Mesías. Ana es la profetisa anciana que dedica su viudez al Señor (verdadero marido), sirviéndole con ayunos y oraciones, noche y día. Cada día los dos ancianos acogen a diferentes niños para realizar el rito. Cuando los padres de Jesús se presentan ante ellos, ven en su Hijo al Señor anunciado desde hace siglos, la "luz para iluminar a las naciones".

Mis ojos han visto tu salvación

Ana había enviudado muy joven. Simeón esperó durante toda su vida el consuelo de Israel, habiendo compartido su dolor y desolación. Sus ojos podrían haberse oscurecido por el sufrimiento, la soledad, la resignación, el cansancio. Podrían haberse dirigido a otra parte, podrían haberse apagado, limitándose a ver sólo de cerca. En cambio, Simeón y Ana supieron esperar toda una vida. En el relato del Evangelio de Lucas, el cántico de Simeón libera una regurgitación de luz de la profunda humanidad de un hombre considerado muy anciano, pero que tiene una mirada viva porque se ha dejado atraer. Había muchas personas y doctores de la Ley en el templo todos los días, haciendo oraciones y liturgias. Sin embargo, sólo Simeón y Ana tenían ojos capaces de ver más allá, no cegados por la costumbre y la indiferencia, ojos que no dejan de buscar y de soñar.

El Cántico de Simeón

En el templo, mientras Jesús se ofrecía a su Padre, se abandonaba en manos de los hombres. Es el doble movimiento de la encarnación: el Hijo entra en el mundo para ser un perfecto adorador del Padre y para responder a las expectativas de los hombres. Simeón tomó a Jesús de los brazos de María en los suyos, bendijo a Dios y rezó el "Nunc dimittis", un himno que puede compararse con los más bellos salmos y que se reza todos los días en el

oficio de la tarde, en Completas, desde el siglo V. Ahora, Simeón puede morir en paz, porque ha visto la señal prometida, que es la salvación para todos los pueblos y para Israel. Saciado de vida y alegría, ahora puede confiar plenamente en Dios, sabiendo que su vida tiene sentido. En el himno añade: "Él está aquí para la caída y resurrección de muchos y como signo de contradicción". Cristo derriba nuestros pequeños o grandes ídolos, las máscaras y las mentiras, contradice la tranquila mediocridad, las falsas imágenes de Dios. Como nos recuerda el padre Ermes Ronchi, es la resurrección de la nobleza que hay en todo hombre, incluso en el más perdido y desesperado.

La luz del mundo

En el mismo día en que se celebra la fiesta de la Presentación en el Templo, se celebra la Candelaria desde el siglo IV. La procesión, que la liturgia de este día manifiesta con velas encendidas, recuerda precisamente las palabras con las que Simeón indica al Mesías: "luz para iluminar a las naciones". La palabra griega es apokalupsis: sugiere la retirada de un velo que oculta la luz. El hombre, dirigiéndose directamente a María, revela la acogida que tendrá el Señor: está destinado a ser ocasión de caída y de resurgimiento en Israel, estarán a favor o en contra de él; será aceptado por unos y rechazado por otros. Ana se acercó a la sagrada familia, y como Simeón, como si hubiera escuchado sus palabras, comenzó a alabar a Dios y a hablar del niño a todos los que esperaban la liberación de Jerusalén.
