

FINANCIAL BLESSINGS

to \$122,586. Your generosity is greatly appreciated.



As some of you know my mom, Rose, lived with kidney disease for the last 20 years of her life. This involved her being dialyzed three times a week on a machine that she came eventually to call her friend, as it kept her alive and going. Her dialysis unit for many years was the den of our home in Wayne, NJ where dad would get her all connected and run the machine. He truly was her angel during those years. Every once in a while, my mom would discuss the need

for a little extra scripture support so I would be called in to celebrate with her the Anointing of the Sick. When I showed up my dad would hastily dismiss himself to the kitchen “to make coffee.” I would always invite him to stay for the anointing, but he always declined. I am pretty sure the reason for this refusal was that in his mind the Anointing of the Sick was still the “Extreme Unction,” the Last Rites, he had learned about earlier in life – and he certainly didn’t want to think about that in relation to my mom. Dad was not alone. Many folks still make that association with the Sacrament of the Sick – I still get calls asking me to go to someone who is dying and read them “their Last Rites.” While the Sacrament does still remain a profound source of grace and comfort in preparation for death, it also is available to us whenever we find ourselves in need of Christ’s healing. I, myself have been anointed a few times in my life before surgery and during a communal service of anointing.

On Saturday, March 27th at 2:00 pm, we will be offering the opportunity to our parishioners and friends to experience the healing power of the Sacrament of the Sick at a Mass of Anointing. The Sacrament offers us three things. First, the healing of body, mind, and spirit. For my mom, the healing was not physical but rather an inner healing that enabled her to accept her struggles and even use them to witness to Christ. Second, the sacrament deepens our awareness that Christ is with us in our suffering, right by our side to give us strength and comfort. Third, the sacrament gives us the grace we need to join our suffering to the suffering of Christ that he may use it to further His work of redeeming the world – truly a noble and most profound offering. All who seek these graces are most welcome to join us for the celebration. I close with this beautiful prayer which follows the anointing – it truly touches my heart.

*Father in Heaven, through this holy anointing
Grant us comfort in our suffering
When we are afraid, give us courage,
When afflicted, give us patience,
When dejected, afford us hope,
And when alone, assure us of the support of your holy people.
~Amen*

This weekend we are erecting outdoor Stations of the Cross for you and your family to pray over the next two weeks. There are photographs of the stations inside our church, taken by Brian Dorney and erected by Craig Erezuma. Thank you both for your stewardship. I was at an interfaith meeting this past Tuesday and one of our members, Mother Susan from Grace Episcopal, commented that praying their outdoor stations was a very powerful experience for her. The reason she gave was that being outdoors, amidst the sights and sounds of the world, reminded her that God sent His Son, Jesus into the world to take on our humanity and redeem us and all creation by His death on the Cross. Invite you to make the way of the Cross with Jesus, reflection on His love for you – a love that saved you and set you free. The stations begin on Green Village Rd at the base of the walkway leading up to the front entrance of the church. The prayers for each station can be found on our website.

We are also looking forward to presenting our **LIVING STATIONS OF THE CROSS ON FRIDAY, evening March 26th at 7:00 pm**. Weather permitting the stations will be presented outdoors on the parking lot side of our church. If the weather is bad, they will be moved into the church and livestreamed.

Thank you in advance to all who are working with me on this prayerful offering which will reflect in the Way of the Cross as it has been experienced dure the pandemic.






The Fifth Sunday of Lent – March 21, 2021



Papa Francisco: "La fraternidad es el verdadero remedio para las crisis y divisiones de hoy" VI

La plaga del terrorismo

Francisco no puede olvidar "otra grave plaga de nuestro tiempo": el terrorismo, que cada año se cobra numerosas víctimas en todo el mundo entre la población civil indefensa. Así, se refiere de modo particular al terrorismo que afecta sobre todo al África subsahariana, pero también en Asia y en Europa. Y destaca que, con frecuencia, objetivo de ataques son los lugares de culto: la protección de los lugares de culto – afirma – es una consecuencia directa de la defensa de la libertad de pensamiento, de conciencia y de religión, y es un deber para las autoridades civiles, independientemente de la tendencia política o de la pertenencia religiosa.

La "catástrofe educativa"

El Santo Padre no oculta que la pandemia ha provocado un profundo malestar entre los jóvenes, que se han visto obligados a aislarse y algunos aún más marginados por su falta de acceso a plataformas educativas. Un retraso también desde el punto de vista del desarrollo pedagógico. Por ello, es necesario relanzar el Pacto Mundial por la Educación:

Asistimos a una suerte de "catástrofe educativa", ante la que no podemos permanecer inertes, por el bien de las generaciones futuras y de la sociedad en su conjunto. «Hoy es necesario un nuevo periodo de compromiso educativo, que involucre a todos los componentes de la sociedad», porque la educación es «el antídoto natural de la cultura individualista, que a veces degenera en un verdadero culto al yo y en la primacía de la indiferencia. Nuestro futuro no puede ser la división, el empobrecimiento de las facultades de pensamiento e imaginación, de escucha, de diálogo y de comprensión mutua».

En el aislamiento, algunas familias se han reunido, otras se han distanciado, y en varios casos ha estallado la violencia contra las mujeres: "exhorto a todos, autoridades públicas y sociedad civil, a ofrecer ayuda a las víctimas de la violencia en la familia. Sabemos que lamentablemente son las mujeres, a menudo junto con sus hijos, quienes pagan el precio más alto".

Libertad de religión

Las exigencias para contener la difusión del virus también se ramificaron sobre diversas libertades fundamentales, incluida la libertad de religión, limitando el culto y las actividades educativas y caritativas de las comunidades de fe. Sin embargo, - subraya Francisco - no debemos pasar por alto que la dimensión religiosa constituye un aspecto fundamental de la personalidad humana y de la sociedad, que no puede ser cancelado; y que, aun cuando se está buscando proteger vidas humanas de la difusión del virus, la dimensión espiritual y moral de la persona no se puede considerar como secundaria respecto a la salud física. "La libertad de culto - asevera - no constituye un corolario de la libertad de reunión, sino que deriva esencialmente del derecho a la libertad religiosa, que es el primer y fundamental derecho humano. Por eso es necesario que sea respetada, protegida y defendida por las autoridades civiles, como la salud y la integridad física. Además, un buen cuidado del cuerpo nunca puede prescindir del cuidado del alma".

Por último, el Pontífice dirige un afectuoso pensamiento a Italia, el primer país de Europa duramente afectado por la pandemia, exhortando a sus ciudadanos a no dejarse abatir por las dificultades, "sino a trabajar juntos para construir una sociedad en la que nadie sea descartado u olvidado".

El año de la fraternidad

El Papa Francisco concluye su discurso con una invitación a buscar nuevos caminos de solidaridad y comunión para toda la familia humana:

El 2021 es un tiempo que debemos aprovechar. Y no será desaprovechado en la medida en que sepamos colaborar con generosidad y esfuerzo. En este sentido considero que la fraternidad es el verdadero remedio a la pandemia y a muchos males que nos han golpeado. Fraternidad y esperanza son como medicinas que hoy el mundo necesita, junto con las vacunas.
