One of the things that I love about Easter is celebrating the Octave, that is, the eight days over which we stretch the Easter feast, treating that time as one day. For me, this underscores the deep meaning of the Resurrection of Jesus Christ in our lives. It certainly takes more than one day to unpack the glorious event of Christ rising from the dead. In truth, it takes a lifetime! One of the features of

the Octave is listening each day to a Gospel recounting the Resurrection appearances of our Lord. I celebrated Mass on Friday of the Octave where the Gospel recounted how the Risen Jesus appeared to Peter and some of the other disciples when they were fishing. From the place where he stood on the seashore, he commanded them to cast their nets over the right side of the boat which brought forth a catch of 153 fish – one from every known species of fish at that time. The net remained un torn, signifying that all people are meant to be caught by God's love. Jesus had a fire going and after asking them for some of the fish he cooked up breakfast. That morning I got so caught up in preaching that Gospel that I tripped on the flowers surrounding the altar. I laughed and told those who were listening that I had become 'overcome with paschal joy'!

The phrase 'overcome with paschal joy' and the phrase 'but in this time above all to laud you yet more gloriously' both appear in all the five prefaces for Easter. The preface is the prayer we pray right before the Holy, Holy, Holy. To laud God is to praise God – thus our praise is meant to be more intense than ever during this Easter season. The word 'paschal' is equivalent to the word 'Easter' – thus these are days of being overcome with the joy of Easter. So, what happens when we are not feeling particularly joyful. Does that mean that we are not being the Easter people singing an Alleluia that we are called to be? I think not. My friends, just as in the case of love, the joy of Easter is more than a feeling. It comes from a place deeper than our emotions although it can be expressed at times in an emotion. The joy of Easter radiates from the core of our being, from our soul, and resounds in response to the truth that we are loved by God with a love that is stronger than death and greater than sin. Thus, we can know Easter joy even in the midst of the world's sorrows. Even in the midst of trials the knowledge that we are beloved can bring a song to our hearts and an Alleluia to our lips. As Bethel Music sings in one of my favorite songs:

*I raise a hallelujah, with everything inside of me
I raise a hallelujah, I will watch the darkness flee
I raise a hallelujah, in the middle of the mystery
I raise a hallelujah, fear you lost your hold on me!*

*I'm gonna sing, in the middle of the storm
Louder and louder, you're gonna hear my praises roar
Up from the ashes, hope will arise
Death is defeated, the King is alive!*








YOUTH MINISTRY







Tercera parte: Cardenal Czerny: mi familia como la imagen de la "Huida a Egipto"



Entonces, ¿podría contarnos un poco sobre su infancia?

Nací en Brno en julio de 1946 y mi hermano Robert en mayo de 1948. Ese mismo año nuestra familia huyó. El primero de muchos desafíos fue salir, y tuvimos que encontrar un lugar para ir. Nuestros padres hicieron muchas consultas. Aprendieron que Canadá nos dejaría entrar si pudiéramos encontrar a alguien en Canadá para patrocinarnos. Primero, un pariente estaba dispuesto, pero luego retiró la oferta. Entonces un hombre de negocios dijo que sí, que podía contratar a mi padre, pero cambió de opinión cuando su fábrica se quemó. Finalmente, con nuestra familia en peligro, cada vez mayor, un compañero de clase de la escuela secundaria de mis padres nos patrocinó. Él mismo había emigrado a Canadá solo unos años antes con su propia esposa e hijo pequeño. El riesgo de patrocinar incluía tener que sostenernos durante un año si mi padre no podía encontrar trabajo. Sin embargo, esta familia nos ayudó a entrar, nos dio la bienvenida y nos guió a través del proceso, muy desconcertante, de movernos por una nueva ciudad antes de aprender a hablar un nuevo idioma; de cómo comportarnos antes de comprender una cultura diferente; ganarnos la vida y, finalmente, nos ayudó a cruzar las barreras étnicas de la ciudad y a hacer amigos... Sin embargo, siguen viviendo en los idiomas y culturas que trajimos con nosotros.

En Canadá, nuestra familia vivió en un barrio de habla francesa durante dos años, y luego se mudó a otro lugar en Montreal y, finalmente, en 1953 al suburbio de habla inglesa de Lakeside (ahora Pointe Claire). Así que ya hablaba checo, luego aprendí francés, y luego inglés, que ahora es mi "primer" idioma.

¿Tuvo alguna relación con Checoslovaquia o la República Checa más adelante?

Como adulto, regresé a Checoslovaquia y estuve desde mediados de octubre de 1987 hasta mediados de enero de 1988. Quería explorar la tierra de mi nacimiento y tener una experiencia de primera mano de la vida bajo el comunismo. En Brno me reuní varias veces con el provincial P. Jan Pavlik, que vivía en la casa de su madre y tenía su "oficina" allí. En Praga a menudo visitaba al P. Karel Dománek, que vivía muy discretamente en el edificio donde había trabajado durante muchos años como conserje. También visité al P. František Lízna en Velké Opatovice, y concelebramos la Eucaristía en el pequeño altar en la casa de su madre.

Regresé por unas semanas en abril de 1989, y visité al P. Pavlik y al provincial eslovaco P. Andrej Osvald en Važec, de donde era párroco y también atendía espiritualmente a los romaníes.

En todos estos encuentros, me impresionó el coraje y la fe de quienes, aún durante el régimen comunista, lograron mantener encendida la llama de la fe cristiana y la vida de la Iglesia durante esos años.

¡Nadie adivinó que llegaría un gran cambio en unos pocos meses! Y, desde entonces, he estado en la República Checa y Eslovaquia para las reuniones del Apostolado Social Jesuita en Europa Central / Oriental, una vez en la residencia jesuita del Kostel svatého Ignáce en Praga en enero de 1996 y, otra, en el Exercičný dom sv. Ignáca en Prešov en noviembre de 1998.
