

What do you say when you have nothing to say? The logical response to that question would be—"nothing." And yet here I am with a blank page before me and with just a few hours to write something that might inspire, encourage, or simply instruct those who might read what I write. I remember not too long ago having a conversation with my neighboring pastor Fr. Bob Mitchell, who

in my opinion, always has something valuable to share in his weekly bulletin. When I complimented him on his articles he thanked me and told me that he often wondered what people thought about what he wrote – or even if anyone was even reading it! I felt bad for him knowing how much time and energy he put into making those bulletin articles happen. So back to my own "writer's block." Here I am coming off a fantastic retreat week at Loyola that exceeded my expectations. Not only that, I am looking forward to six days of vacation in Wyoming with my siblings, visiting Yellowstone National Park and the Grand Tetons. You would think that I would be brimming over with stuff to say – but no, not a word or phrase bubbling forth! So, what's going on? Maybe it has something to do with being in-between. In-between retreat and vacation, in-between July and September, in-between masked and unmasked, in-between surgery and wellness. There is something about in-between time – which is often called liminal space – that invites us into silence. It is a time of pondering, reflecting on what the present moment has to say about where we have been and where we are going. To hastily fill that space with words is to diminish the mystery of it all, to define what might defy defining. And so, we take to heart the psalmist's challenge – "Be still and know that I am God." And from that stillness in God's presence, we begin to sense how God is acting on us and the world around us. Sometimes, having nothing to say is very good – especially if it means letting God do all the talking.

PILGRIMAGE TO THE HOLY LAND: FEB. 2022



There is no place like Israel, the homeland of Jesus. Whether this is your first time or a return trip, you will be changed by the experience of living the Gospels. This pilgrimage will be steeped in Old and New Testament tradition with time dedicated to reading the Scriptures, praying, celebrating Mass, learning about the Israeli culture, food, and lifestyle. The pilgrimage will depart from Newark Airport approx. Feb. 10, 2022, and land in Tel-Aviv. Major sites along the pilgrimage will include Jerusalem, Ein Karem, the Sea of Galilee, the Jordan River, Bethlehem,

and Nazareth. In Jerusalem, pilgrims will follow in the footsteps of Jesus as they visit multiple sites, such as the Cardo, Western Wall, Via Dolorosa, and the Church of the Holy Sepulcher. In the Galilee, visit Nazareth, Mount of the Beatitudes, Capernaum and many other significant sites in the public ministry of Jesus with accommodations along the Sea of Galilee. This pilgrimage offers many different experiences for return visitors or first-time pilgrims. We return approx. Feb. 20, 2022. All participants must be vaccinated.

Jan Figenshu and Father Darwin Lastra, the pastor of Our Lady of Good Counsel, will be the spiritual Directors for the trip.

"I AM THE BREAD OF LIFE"






