

Alleluia, Alleluia, Give thanks to the Risen Lord! Alleluia, Alleluia, sing praise to His Name!

Looking back on our celebration of Holy Week and Easter, the words 'thanks' and 'praise' most definitely express what my heart is feeling. I am deeply grateful for all the men and women, boys and girls, who stepped forward to create a beautiful experience of worship for all who came to pray with us during those sacred days. Let me underline the word 'beautiful', for that is the description of our liturgies that I am hearing most often during these days. Beauty draws us to God, who is all beauty – when we experience beauty here on earth, we get a glimpse of the beatific vision we hope to enjoy in heaven. I believe we enjoyed a bit of heaven here at Saint Vincent Martyr during those days we gathered as Church to remember the Passion, Death and Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ.

It was heavenly for me to have the privilege of baptizing the biggest number of catechumen at one time in all my years of priesthood. We brought seven – the biblical number of perfection and completeness – into the Church at our Vigil. The sounds of praise that came forth from our music ministry were nothing less than heavenly. With angelic voices and symphonic sounds from keyboards, bells, flutes, and stringed instruments directed and blended together by our music minister Peter we were lifted up as we gave glory to God for all God has done for us in Jesus Christ. Our musical journey through those days deepened our awareness of each event, from the Hosannas that started the week, the tunes of gathering that brought us to the table, the mournful tones that marked Christ's death and finally to the canticles of hope and new life that celebrated Christ's rising from the dead. 
From Father George

Eastertide Message Series






