It is Tuesday evening. I am working in my office at the Parish Ministry Center while the first of the Listening Sessions is going on in the school gym. It feels strange not being there. Earlier today I read the daily nourishment from Abbey of the Arts which posed the question: Can you allow yourself to be with uncomfortable feelings without having to fix them or change them in any way? Why would I want to stay with those feelings, unless of course I have something to learn from them. And I do.

Tonight, was the first invitation to let go, to begin the process of taking leave. It meant letting go of control and allowing the process of discernment to be guided by someone else than me. Have I ever shared with you how very good I am at giving up control? Not very good at all! I began to wonder about the future, not wanting the wonder to turn into worry. And then I realized that I need to listen to my own advice about being in this in between time, this liminal space. I need to use the GPS I spoke about in my Sunday evening broadcast to navigate through these next months. In case you missed that I am happy to share what the GPS stands for.

The G is for gratitude. I have always said that we need to lead with gratitude. Being thankful must always be the beginning of any conversation we have with God. There is so much for which I am grateful in my time here at Saint Vincent Martyr. The people that have blessed my life, the wonderful things that we have accomplished together and the special times we have shared make my heart overflow with gratitude! As I mentioned last Sunday evening, I am also grateful for the hard times and the challenges that have come my way. These are the things that have formed and shaped me into a better version of myself as a man and as a priest. The amazing thing about gratitude is that it has the power to bring our thoughts and our feelings into a positive place. It places us more firmly into the flow of God's love.

The P is for prayer. God is seeking to walk with us in this time in between. He is calling out to us constantly to enter a conversation that can calm any fears that we might have and give us confidence for the future. Of course, the most important prayer we have is the Eucharist. This is the source and summit of who we are as Church. Everything we do flows from this great sacrament and leads us toward it. As long as we remember that we are a Eucharistic people, beloved of God, we will find courage and strength in Christ for the journey.

The S is for surrender. We are called to let go and to let God take the lead in our lives. He has a plan for us, and that plan is for the good. Indeed, as St. Paul says, for those who love God all things work for the good. I have found that to fully surrender to God we need to let go of our need for certitude. There are things that we cannot know for sure. That can make us anxious or worried, unless we put out trust in God that He will sustain us in all things. We are called to embrace life as mystery that God lovingly unfolds for us like a beautiful flower coming to bloom in the springtime. We are called to believe what Julian of Norwich proclaimed with great faith: All shall be well, and all shall be well, and all manner of things shall be well!

Let us hold one another in prayer in this in between time, in this liminal space. God will provide! God bless.

### **FAMILY PROMISE FUNDING CUT, PLEASE HELP!**



Three years ago, St Vincent Martyr was honored to kick off the first week of the new Motel Shelter Program at Family Promise of Morris County, providing emergency shelter to individuals and families in need. Now the Shelter Program is in critical need of funding. A grant received through the CARES Act that has been funding the motel sheltering program will end in June. Additionally, funding from FEMA has been cut for all of Morris County this year and there will be no funding for Family Promise.

The cost of one night of shelter at the Extended Stay Motel is \$80 per room. We have been utilizing three rooms, which brings the amount to \$240 per night. There are about 214 households on the shelter waiting list hoping to enter a shelter program. Some of these families are living in cars or hopping from family to friends' homes. Unfortunately, Family Promise cannot take any of the families on the waiting list into their shelter program because of lack of funding. 




