

Pentecost Sunday





"In honor and memory of all those who made the ultimate sacrifice of giving their lives for our country we offer this reflection on the flag folding ceremony. It is usually accompanied by TAPS played on the bugle, the last thing that a soldier hears before they go to sleep.

The flag-folding ceremony represents the same religious principles on which our country was originally founded. The portion of the flag denoting honor is the canton of blue containing the stars representing the states our veterans served in uniform. The canton field of blue dresses from left to right and is inverted when draped as a pall on a casket of a veteran who has served our country in uniform.

In the Armed Forces of the United States, at the ceremony of retreat the flag is lowered, folded in a triangle fold and kept under watch throughout the night as a tribute to our nations' honored dead. The next morning it is brought out and, at the ceremony of reveille, run aloft as a symbol of our belief in the resurrection of the body."

The first fold of our flag is a symbol of life.

The second fold is a symbol of our belief in the eternal life.

The third fold is made in honor and remembrance of the veteran departing our ranks who gave a portion of life for the defense of our country to attain a peace throughout the world.

The fourth fold represents our weaker nature, for as American citizens trusting in God, it is to Him we turn in times of peace as well as in times of war for His divine guidance.

The fifth fold is a tribute to our country, for in the works of Stephen Decatur, "Our country, in dealing with other countries, may she always be right; but it is still our country, right or wrong."

The sixth fold is for where our hearts lie. It is with our heart that we pledge allegiance to the flag of the United States of America, and to the republic for which it stands, one nation, under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all.

The seventh fold is a tribute to our Armed Forces, for it is through the Armed Forces that we protect our country and our flag against all her enemies, whether they be found within or without the boundaries of our republic.

The eighth fold is a tribute to the one who entered into the valley of the shadow of death, that we might see the light of day, and to honor mother, for whom it flies on Mother's Day.

The ninth fold is a tribute to womanhood; for it has been through their faith, love, loyalty and devotion that the character of the men and women who have made this country great have been molded.

The tenth fold is a tribute to father, for he, too, has given his sons and daughters for the defense of our country since they were first born.

The eleventh fold, in the eyes of a Hebrew citizen, represents the lower portion of the seal of King David and King Solomon, and glorifies, in their eyes, the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob (this includes persons of other faiths also).

The twelfth fold, in the eyes of a Christian citizen, represents an emblem of eternity and glorifies, in their eyes, God the Father, the Son, and Holy Ghost.

When the flag is completely folded, the stars and uppermost, reminding us our national motto, 'In God We Trust'.

After the flag is completely folded and tucked in, it takes on the appearance of a cocked hat, ever reminding us of the soldiers who served under General George Washington and the sailors and marines who served under Captain John Paul Jones who were followed by their comrades and shipmates in the Armed Forces of the United States, preserving for us the rights, privileges, and freedoms we enjoy today."



FAMILY PROMISE FUNDING CUT, PLEASE HELP!

Three years ago, St Vincent Martyr was honored to kick off the first week of the new Motel Shelter Program at Family Promise of Morris County, providing emergency shelter to individuals and families in need. Now the Shelter Program is in critical need of funding. A grant received through the CARES Act that has been funding the motel



sheltering program will end in June. Additionally, funding from FEMA has been cut for all of Morris County this year and there will be no funding for Family Promise.

The cost of one night of shelter at the Extended Stay Motel is \$80 per room. We have been utilizing three rooms, which brings the amount to \$240 per night. There are about 214 households on the shelter waiting list hoping to enter a shelter program. Some of these families are living in cars or hopping from family to friends' homes. Unfortunately, Family Promise cannot take any of the families on the waiting list into their shelter program because of lack of funding. St. Vincent Martyr's annual American Red Cross blood drive will take place on Sunday, June 11th, from 9 AM to 2 PM in the Community Room. Donating blood makes a big difference in the lives of others. Every two seconds someone in the U.S. needs blood. It is essential for surgeries, cancer treatment, chronic illnesses, and traumatic injuries. The Red Cross collects, processes and distributes about 40% of the nation's blood supply. Each day, the Red Cross needs to collect about 12,500 blood donations and nearly 3,000 platelet donations to meet the needs of patients at about 2,500 hospitals and other facilities across the country. About 62%



of the U.S. population is eligible to give blood but only about 3% donates. A single blood donation can help save more than one life. 




