Dear Parishioners,

Last Sunday Bishop Manuel Cruz celebrated Mass at The Chapel of the Good Shepherd, Seton Hall. During the Mass he instituted twelve young men to the Order of Acolytes, amongst those young men was our very own seminarian, Carlos Vargas. I was delighted to represent our parish at this beautiful ceremony. I am so proud of Carlos in his new role. The role of Acolyte is similar to that of an Extraordinary Minister, but the role is given directly by a Bishop, and it is a universal role in deference to the role of an extraordinary minister who serves in their own local parish. It also gives the acolyte the honor and responsibility of purifying, "cleaning" the sacred vessels after Holy Communion. Carlos has been mentored by many wonderful priests, Msgr. Jack Carroll, Pastor Emeritus, Our Lady of the Magnificat, Kinnelon, our own beloved Msgr. George and Fr. Steven Prisk, pastor of Holy Spirit Pequannock. It is with great honor; I continue to mentor this young man toward the goal of priesthood. We congratulate Carlos this weekend as he comes to work with MaryBeth in ongoing training sessions with our altar servers.



I enjoyed my first ever Bottle Hill Day on Saturday. Fr. Chris and I ambled around the town for about an hour, and we were delighted to meet many new parishioners. I was happy to see the stands representing our parish and school and the many people who gathered to see who we are. Fr. Chris and I visit Sunrise Care Facility and Pine Acres Care facility here in Madison every Monday. We offer Mass, hear Confessions, and anoint the residents on a regular basis. I made my first visit there last Monday and look forward to getting to know the residents.

This coming Tuesday, I look forward to a fun time as the students at our school celebrate Halloween. Wednesday, the 1st day of November is the Feast day of All Saints, a great day when we remember the known and unknown saints who by their living examples, assist us on the road to heaven. All Saints day is a holy day of obligation. Thursday, November 2nd is All Souls Day, the day when we remember all of those who have died. We pray for their souls and for the souls of those whom we do not know. We remember the mercy of God and ask that all souls through the way they have lived their life, our prayers, Mass intentions and sacrifices, may be lifted into the glory of heaven. Masses will be celebrated at 8:30 am and noon. At 7 pm, I will preside at a Mass of Light when we will remember all of those who have died in our parish this past year. During that Mass, the bereaved will be given a small candle to place in front of the altar before my homily; these lights will be lit and placed in front of the altar, the church lights will be dimmed, and we will certainly feel the presence of God. All are welcome to join us for this beautiful Mass.

Fr. Yojan with the assistance of members of the diocese, organized a spirited seminar for Hispanic catechesis ministry. The topics centered on catechesis through scripture and Holy Mass. In the last several years, many parishes have adapted their faith formation to this model. It involves parent and child learning together, followed by a teaching Mass so that together parents and children can learn the dignity of our Mass, the parts of the Mass, sacraments and become familiar with areas of the church such as altar, tabernacle, crucifix, podium. Fr. Yojan was very excited after the session and as Director of Catechesis for the Diocese, he and the staff and I will talk more about this approach in the coming months.

I hope everybody has a wonderful Halloween weekend. It is funny that this weekend, although technically for children, is truly enjoyed by many adults. Let us remember to be safe and have good fun!



CST is built around seven "themes," and all the principles of CST flow from the first theme, Life and Dignity of the Human Person.

Life and Dignity of the Human Person

The Catholic Church proclaims that human life is sacred and that the dignity of the human person is the foundation of a moral vision for society.

We believe that every person is precious; people are more important than things; and the measure of every institution is whether it threatens or enhances the life and dignity of the human person.

Outreach volunteers at St Vincent's support the life and dignity of the human person in all our efforts. Here are some examples:

- advocating against the death penalty, euthanasia, and abortion and offering practical support for women facing unplanned pregnancies (Respect Life Ministry)




St. Joseph's Home for the Elderly LITTLE SISTERS OF THE POOR
