MARY AND JOSEPH

DECEMBER 31, 2023

My Dear Parishioners,

As we gather on this weekend of New Year's Eve and New Year's Day, we celebrate the feast of the Holy Family. We consider Mary's "Yes" to God and through the grace of God and the decision of her parents, St. Anne, and St. Joachim, she was well prepared through scripture formation to be the mother of Jesus. Joseph, her husband, the foster father of Jesus also had said "Yes" and though he did not always understand God's role for him, he trusted. We consider the couples' early traumatic exile in Egypt with the little baby Jesus rushing to the Egyptian border to escape the wrath of Herod. During their time in exile, the Holy Family must have missed home terribly. Let us always be empathic to exiles; the exiles who live in our land and the undocumented, who try to find a way through work to make better lives for themselves and their families. Let us try not to be judgmental of immigrants but rather consider how Mary and Joseph would empathize with them. How glad Mary and Joseph were when King Herod died to return to their homeland and to the family that they loved so much. The makeup of a family these days can be different, whether it is two parents or one parent, married, single, divorced. Each person or couple has their own joys and challenges. Our parish of St. Vincent Martyr welcomes family units as together we teach our children our Catholic faith, prepare them for the sacraments and walk with them together as intentional disciples on the journey. These days, most couples work outside the home, sometimes the mother is the breadwinner, sometimes the father, sometimes both. I would encourage all parents to always make time to attend Mass with their children, to teach their children to pray and then pray with them and in a very busy stressed world, listen to them.

On Monday, January 1st, we celebrate the feast of Mary, Mother of God. What an awesome title and what an amazing privilege and responsibility! Mary was and is the mother of Jesus and is mother to the world. Jesus gave us his mother to be our mother, too, just before he died on the cross. Our mother Mary guides us in life and empowers us always to follow our Lord, brother, and savior. We honor Mary today as our Mother and as a refuge for all mankind in times of joy and sorrow.

Next Saturday/Sunday, we celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany. On this day we remember God's invitation to the gentiles (non-Jews), that they as well as Jewish people were all called into son-ship and daughter-ship with the Lord. We see the wise men coming from afar, from very different countries and ethnic groups. They follow the star to find Jesus for whom they were yearning.

Last Wednesday, December 20th, I was honored to celebrate a liturgy with other religious leaders of our town in an Ecumenical Service called the Winter Solstice. This service takes place on the longest night of the year. Our theme is "Light through the darkness." We, as Christians, call to mind the old pagan religions which were full of fear and superstition, praying to a deity of Gods, of whom they were afraid. As Christians, we call to mind the light of Christ. This light we see as symbolized by our Paschal candle which is lit by great acclaim every Holy Saturday night. Rejoicing in Christ's victory of light over the darkness, good over evil. Christ is our light, and we reflect our light by the extraordinary way in which we live ordinary lives. My thanks to Jan, Carlos and the other leaders of faith who together brought to mind - we need not fear the darkness of the night, we rejoice because Christ is our light.

31 de diciembre de 2023
Experiencia Hispana

Mis queridos feligreses,

Al reunirnos este fin de semana de Nochevieja y Día de Año Nuevo, celebramos la fiesta de la Sagrada Familia. Consideramos el "Sí" de María a Dios y, a través de la gracia de Dios y la decisión de sus padres, Santa Ana y San Joaquín, ella estuvo bien preparada a través de la formación en las Escrituras para ser la madre de Jesús. José, su esposo, el padre adoptivo de Jesús, también había dicho "sí" y aunque no siempre entendió el papel de Dios para él, confió. Consideramos el traumático exilio temprano de las parejas en Egipto con el pequeño niño Jesús corriendo hacia la frontera egipcia para escapar de la ira de Herodes. Durante su tiempo en el exilio, la Sagrada Familia debe haber extrañado terriblemente su hogar. Seamos siempre empáticos con los exiliados; los exiliados que viven en nuestra tierra y los indocumentados, que intentan encontrar una manera a través del trabajo para mejorar sus vidas y las de sus familias. Intentemos no juzgar a los inmigrantes, sino más bien considerar cómo María y José empatizarían con ellos. Qué contentos se sintieron María y José cuando murió el rey Herodes para regresar a su tierra natal y a la familia que tanto amaban. La composición de una familia hoy en día puede ser diferente, ya sea monoparental o biparental, casada, soltera o divorciada. Cada persona o pareja tiene sus propias alegrías y desafíos. Nuestra parroquia de San Vicente Mártir da la bienvenida a unidades familiares mientras juntos enseñamos a nuestros hijos nuestra fe católica, los preparamos para los sacramentos y caminamos juntos con ellos como discípulos intencionales en el camino. Hoy en día, la mayoría de las parejas trabajan fuera del hogar, a veces la madre es el sostén de la familia, a veces el padre, a veces ambos. Animaría a todos los padres a que siempre hicieran tiempo para asistir a Misa con sus hijos, para enseñarles a orar y luego orar con ellos y, en un mundo muy ocupado y estresado, escucharlos.

El lunes 1 de enero celebramos la fiesta de María, Madre de Dios. ¡Qué título tan maravilloso y qué privilegio y responsabilidad tan asombrosos! María fue y es la madre de Jesús y es madre del mundo. Jesús nos dio a su madre para que fuera nuestra madre también justo antes de morir en la cruz. Nuestra madre María madre nos guía en la vida y nos capacita para seguir siempre a nuestro Señor, hermano y salvador. Honramos hoy a María como nuestra Madre y como refugio para toda la humanidad en tiempos de alegría y tristeza.

El próximo sábado/domingo celebramos la Fiesta de la Epifanía. En este día recordamos la invitación de Dios a los gentiles (no judíos), que tanto ellos como el pueblo judío fueron llamados a ser hijos e hijas del Señor. Vemos a los Reyes Magos venir de lejos, de países y etnias muy diferentes. Siguen la estrella para encontrar a Jesús a quien anhelaban.

El pasado miércoles 20 de enero tuve el honor de celebrar una liturgia con otros líderes religiosos de nuestro pueblo en un Servicio Ecuménico llamado Solsticio de Invierno. Este servicio se realiza en la noche más larga del año. Nuestro tema es "Luz a través de la oscuridad". Nosotros, como cristianos, recordamos las antiguas religiones paganas que estaban llenas de miedo y superstición, orando a una deidad de los dioses, a quien tenían miedo. Como cristianos recordamos la luz de Cristo. Esta luz la vemos simbolizada por nuestro cirio pascual, que se enciende con gran aclamación cada noche del Sábado Santo. Regocijándonos en la victoria de Cristo de la luz sobre las tinieblas, del bien sobre el mal. Cristo es nuestra luz y reflejamos nuestra luz en la forma extraordinaria en que vivimos la vida ordinaria. Mi agradecimiento a Jan, Carlos y los demás líderes de fe que juntos recordaron: no debemos temer a la oscuridad de la noche, nos regocijamos porque Cristo es nuestra luz.

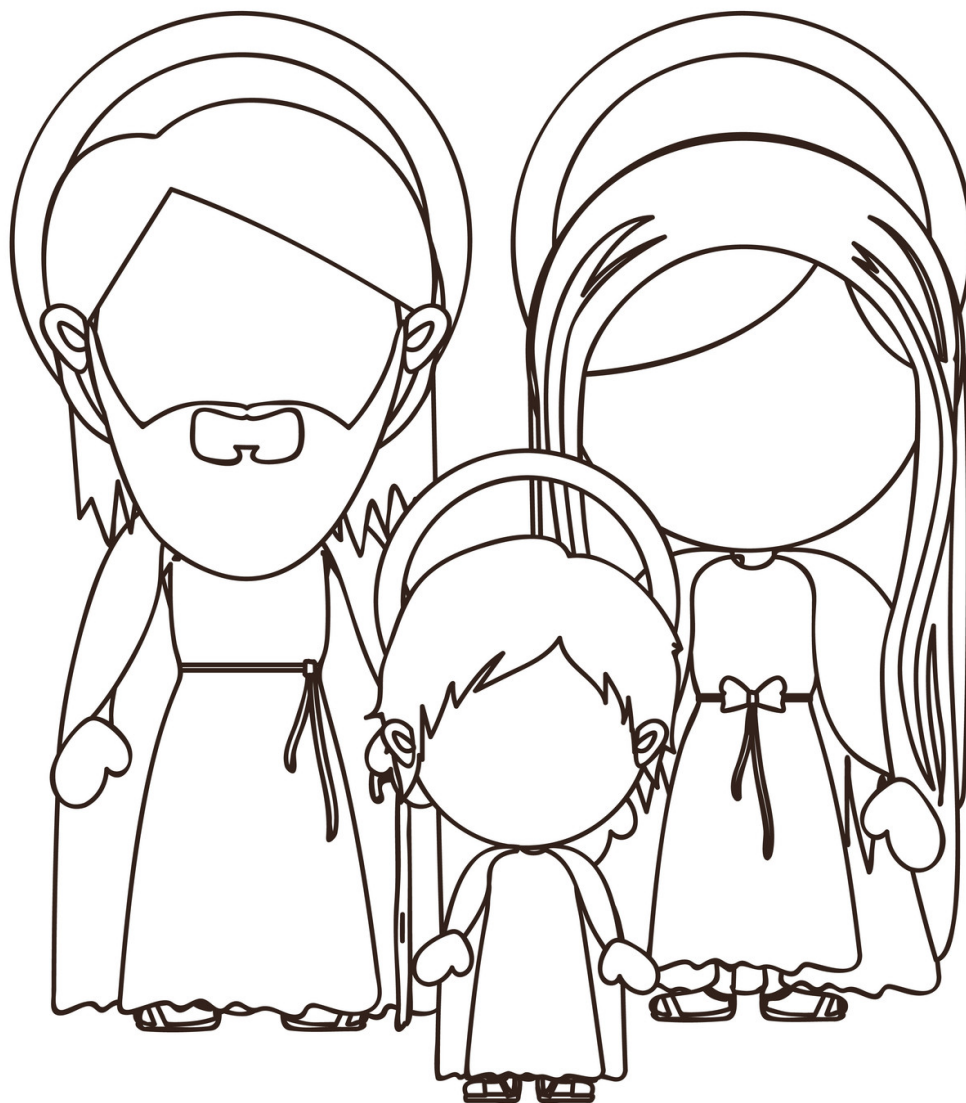
