My Dear Parishioners,

Growing up in Ireland in the 1960s, everybody spoke like me, looked like me and worshipped like me. From 15 years old on, I loved to travel. I was privileged to use the inter-rail system and travel throughout Europe between15 years of age and my mid -20s. Back then in Ireland, most people had instant coffee. I will never forget my first coffee in Italy. I thought I had died and gone to heaven. My first plate of pasta and my first taste of Coq au vain in Paris. My first ice cream dish in Zurich. I realized that there was a whole world out there and I wanted to be a part of it. Ireland became a part of the European Union in the late 70s and finally, Irish people got a chance to taste different foods and different cultures. I remember my first visit to New York in the 1980s, the subways, the fast pace, the multitude of languages. I love to travel. I love to eat and meet different people from different parts of the world, I am privileged to have travelled on every continent except Antarctica. What a privilege that God has made us so unique, so different and at the same time, so similar, giving us a chance to appreciate our differences and our similarities.

The Israeli people before the time of Christ, were an isolated group who lived in fear of Yahweh, whom they loved but they were afraid to express that love. God the Father sent the world, his son Jesus and through Jesus, we see God's love unconditionally given to everyone. As we express our adoration to God, we are able to express our love for each other and take joy in the differences that make us unique and yet similar. The three kings – the three wisemen have status and riches. They were non-Jewish and were searching for God. They trusted in God as they followed the star to Bethlehem. These three kings that we see today, in many ways reflect who the Roman Church is today as a universal church, Mass is the same in every land but in the multiple languages that are spoken on planet Earth. Here at St. Vincent Martyr, we reflect the many cultures of the world in those of us who worship here. We thank God for the ability to enjoy each other's culture, to learn from each other and to enjoy together the gifts that God has lavished upon us.

The Eastern Europeans have an ancient custom of inscribing the names of the Magi over the doorways of their homes and businesses. We, here at St. Vincent Martyr, have had this custom for several years. Before each Mass, Fr. Yojan and I will bless the doorways of our church as well as the chalk. As you leave Mass today, you will be given a piece of chalk so that you may inscribe the initials of the Magi over your doors, C- Casper, M - Melchoir, B - Balthazar, these letters also abbreviate the prayer, "Christus Mansionem Benedicat" meaning "May God bless this house." We conclude the blessing by praying:

"Lord God of heaven and earth, you revealed your only begotten Son to every nation by the guidance of the star. Bless this house and all who inhabit it. Fill us with the light of Christ that our concern for others may reflect your love. We ask this through Christ our Lord. May we always be with Christ in all our comings and goings. Amen."

In Ireland this weekend is called Little Christmas, and it ends the Christmas season. Tomorrow, we celebrate the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. The Christmas season comes to an end and Ordinary Time begins yet again.

Fr. Yojan leaves for Columbia on Monday, January 8th to have a well-deserved visit with his mother, Martha, and his family. It is truly a pleasure to share ministry with Fr. Yojan. I wish him God's blessings as he spends this special time with those who have nurtured him and nurtured the beautiful vocation that makes him such an amazing priest. I wish you the joys and blessings of this Feast of the Epiphany. Happy Little Christmas and Happy New Year!

BLESSING OF HOMES ON THE FEAST OF THE EPIPHANY



There are a number of customs associated with the Feast of the Epiphany, such as the blessing of homes and the inscribing of doorways with the names of the Magi. May the inscription be a witness of your faith to others and may the peace of our loving God dwell in your home and in the hearts of all who dwell there. To bless your home, gather your family at a doorway to your home. If you live alone, you may want to share this blessing with friends or make it time for private prayer.

Begin by saying: Let us praise God who fills our hearts and homes with peace! Blessed be God forever! The Word became flesh and made his dwelling place among us. It is Christ who enlightens our hearts and homes with his love. May all who enter this home find Christ's light and love.

The following intercessions are then said: The son of God made his home among us. With thanks and praise let us call upon him as we respond: **R: Stay with us Lord**

- ♦ Lord Jesus Christ, with Mary and Joseph you formed the Holy Family: remain in our home, that we may know you as our guest and honor you as our Head, we pray, **R.**
- ♦ Lord Jesus Christ you had no place to lay your head, but on the spirit of poverty accepted the hospitality of your friends: grant that through our help the homeless may obtain proper housing, we pray, **R**.
- ♦ Lord Jesus Christ, the three kings presented their gifts to you in praise and adoration: grant that those living in this house may use their talents and abilities to your great glory, we pray, **R.**

Then using the chalk that was blessed and distributed at church, a designated member inscribes the following over the doorway:

20 + C + M + B 24

(The numbers are those of the New Year - the initials, C, M, B representing the Magi - Caspar, Melchior, Balthazar - and the three crosses stand for 'saint.' The letters also abbreviate the prayer "Christus Mansionem Benedicat" (which means May God bless this house.)

Conclude the blessing by praying: Lord God of heaven and earth, you revealed your only begotten Son to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless this house and all who inhabit it. Fill us with the light of Christ that our concern for others may reflect your love. We ask this through Christ our Lord. May we always be with Christ in all our comings and goings. Amen.

Alpha time together on Thursday evenings begins with fellowship and ends the week with an upbeat experience of community.


WHAT IS THE ALPHA COURSE?

7 de enero de 2024 Experiencia Hispana

Mis queridos feligreses,

Al crecer en Irlanda en la década de 1960, todos hablaban como yo, se parecían a mí y adoraban como yo. Desde los 15 años me encantaba viajar. Tuve el privilegio de utilizar el sistema Inter-Rail y viajar por Europa entre los 15 y los 20 años. En aquel entonces, en Irlanda, la mayoría de la gente tomaba café instantáneo. Nunca olvidaré mi primer café en Italia. Pensé que había muerto y había ido al cielo. Mi primer plato de pasta y mi primera prueba de Coq au vain en París. Mi primer plato de helado en Zurich. Me di cuenta de que había todo un mundo ahí fuera y quería ser parte de él. Irlanda se convirtió en parte de la Unión Europea a finales de los años 70 y, finalmente, los irlandeses tuvieron la oportunidad de probar diferentes comidas y diferentes culturas. Recuerdo mi primera visita a Nueva York en los años 80, el metro, el ritmo acelerado, la multitud de idiomas. Amo viajar. Me encanta comer y conocer diferentes personas de diferentes partes del mundo, tengo el privilegio de haber viajado por todos los continentes excepto la Antártida. Qué privilegio que Dios nos haya hecho tan únicos, tan diferentes y al mismo tiempo tan similares, dándonos la oportunidad de apreciar nuestras diferencias y nuestras similitudes.

El pueblo israelí antes de la época de Cristo, era un grupo aislado que vivía con temor a Yahvé, a quien amaban pero tenían miedo de expresar ese amor. Dios Padre envió al mundo, a su hijo Jesús y a través de Jesús, vemos el amor de Dios dado incondicionalmente a todos. Al expresar nuestra adoración a Dios, podemos expresar nuestro amor mutuo y alegrarnos de las diferencias que nos hacen únicos y al mismo tiempo similares. Los tres reyes — los tres reyes magos tienen estatus y riquezas. No eran judíos y buscaban a Dios. Confiaron en Dios mientras seguían la estrella hasta Belén. Estos tres reyes que vemos hoy, reflejan de muchas maneras quién es la Iglesia Romana hoy como iglesia universal, la Misa es la misma en todos los países pero en los múltiples idiomas que se hablan en el planeta Tierra. Aquí en San Vicente Mártir, reflejamos las muchas culturas del mundo en aquellos de nosotros que adoramos aquí. Damos gracias a Dios por la capacidad de disfrutar la cultura de cada uno, aprender unos de otros y disfrutar juntos de los dones que Dios nos ha prodigado.

Los europeos del este tienen la antigua costumbre de inscribir los nombres de los Reyes Magos en las puertas de sus casas y negocios. Nosotros, aquí en San Vicente Mártir, tenemos esta costumbre desde hace varios años. Antes de cada Misa, el P. Yojan y yo bendeciremos las puertas de nuestra iglesia así como la tiza. Al salir de Misa hoy, se les entregará un trozo de tiza para que puedan escribir las iniciales de los Reyes Magos sobre sus puertas, C- Casper, M - Melchoir, B - Balhazar, estas letras también abrevian la oración, "Christus Mansionem Benedicat" que significa "Que Dios bendiga esta casa". Concluimos la bendición orando:

"Señor Dios del cielo y de la tierra, tú revelaste a tu Hijo unigénito a cada nación por la guía de la estrella. Bendice esta casa y a todos los que la habitan. Llénanos con la luz de Cristo para que nuestra preocupación por los demás refleje tu amor. Te lo pedimos por Cristo nuestro Señor. Que estemos siempre con Cristo en todas nuestras idas y venidas. Amén."

En Irlanda, este fin de semana se llama Little Christmas y pone fin a la temporada navideña. Mañana celebramos la Fiesta del Bautismo del Señor. El tiempo navideño llega a su fin y el Tiempo Ordinario comienza una vez más.

P. Yojan parte hacia Columbia el lunes 8 de enero para tener una merecida visita con su madre Martha y su familia. Es verdaderamente un placer compartir ministerio con el P. Yojan. Le deseo las bendiciones de Dios mientras pasa este tiempo especial con quienes lo han nutrido y han alimentado la hermosa vocación que lo convierte en un sacerdote tan maravilloso. Les deseo las alegrías y bendiciones de esta Fiesta de la Epifanía. ¡Feliz Navidad y feliz año nuevo!
