It is really very important to have our Extraordinary Ministers recommissioned in order for them to continue to serve.

As I mentioned in my homily last weekend, I absolutely loved the movie Mother Cabrini. Fr. Yojan, Fr. Alex, Carlos, and I went with several friends to the movie theater in East Hanover. I saw many of our SVM parishioners and many former St. Rose parishioners. The movie was about the life of St. Frances Cabrini, a strong intellectual and holy woman who felt called by God to help children and the poor. Through much hard work, dedication, and the will of God, she and her sisters arrived in New York in the late 1890s and began their work. We see in the movie a shocking remembrance of how downtrodden women were then and the awful prejudice against Italians in the US. We truly get a sense of the abject poverty and hopelessness of many. Mother Cabrini never gave up and used her talents and the talents of many to open orphanages and hospitals that are a lasting legacy of her hopeful love. This is a great family movie, and it is a great discussion subject for families on the role of women in today's world and how we as Catholics, need to rid ourselves of any prejudice we might have towards other human beings regardless of race, creed, and gender. Go see the movie; it is a movie you will never regret seeing and it will truly impact your life as it impacted ours.

As the Synod of Bishops in Rome begins to process the results of its assembly last October, and to prepare for its next assembly in October 2024, it has asked dioceses to participate in an “interim phase” of the Synod on Synodality during this coming Lent.

Specifically, the Secretariat of the Synod has asked for further consultation with the People of God through local listening sessions. The input from these sessions will be included in a diocesan synthesis report that will be sent to the United States Catholic Conference of Bishops in early April. Its synthesis of the input from US dioceses will be forwarded to the Vatican in May.

Tenebrae Service
March 27, 2024 at 7 pm

Tenebrae, translated as "shadows" or "darkness" in Latin is an ancient holy week service that features distinctive symbolic elements of Christ's passion and death.

During the service, which combines song, scripture, and silence, candles are extinguished one by one as Scripture readings are shared to tell the story of Holy Week. This gradual descent into darkness is a representation of the increasing sorrow of Jesus as the events of Holy Week unfolded. After the last verse is read, the last candle is extinguished, and the room is plunged into darkness as the Lux Aeterna is sung.

Tenebrae is designed to serve as a powerful, reflective experience ahead of the sacred Triduum. The representation of the darkness of sin and death serve to call us as Catholic Christians to embrace the light of Christ, who has conquered death.


