ADMINISTRATORS RETREAT

AMENDED CALENDAR

The form to be used by schools to submit an amended calendar can be accessed <u>here</u>. An amended calendar must be submitted by each school by **April 29**th whether or not the school missed days. If no days were missed, simply indicate that on the form.

SCHOOL BREAKFAST AND LUNCH

Reminder: Schools are prohibited from denying students school breakfast or lunch because payment is owed without prior notice to parent. If payment is owed, schools must notify parents/guardians of the debt and provide a period of 10 school days to pay the amount due.

TEACHER INTENTION FORM

As part of a school's overall planning process, a survey needs to be taken of all teachers by principals to ascertain each teacher's intention for the 2016-2017 school year. Please access the form to be used for this purpose here. Note that the form should be distributed immediately and completed by April 1st. Every teacher must complete the form.

ADVANC-ED STEM CERTIFICATION

Three of our Diocesan STEM schools are seeking STEM Certification through AdvancEd this year. The process, which mirrors the accreditation procedure, will take place from February 28th through March 2nd. The schools - All Saints Academy, St. Anthony School, and St. Catherine of Bologna School - will be the first to be certified in New Jersey. The administrators, faculty, students, and parents, have all worked to bring these schools to this point. We wish them success in this endeavor!

SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITY

The money for these scholarships comes from the funds generated by the former Paterson Diocesan Federation of Home and School Associations. The decision will be based on need, the student essay, and the teacher recommendation. POWERSCHOOL - NJ STATE ATTENDANCE REPORT

Just a reminder that we are aware of a problem with the NJ State Attendance Report in PowerSchool. We are waiting for a fix to the NJ State Reporting Module to address the issue of not being able to select months in 2016. Schools will not be able to run their 2016 reports until the fix is released. We will update you once we get notified the reporting module fix is available.

CATHETICAL CERTIFICATION

The Spring Semester is under way in the STEP program at University of Notre Dame and many of our teachers, principals, and presidents are taking advantage of this learning experience. Please be reminded that **ALL FIRST AND SECOND YEAR ELEMENTARY TEACHERS** must complete two courses within their first two years of employment. Registrations for the 2015-2016 year do not match the number of new hires in our diocese. Catechetical certification is not optional, therefore principals must ensure that their faculty members are meeting the certification requirements set by the CSO.
