

On Friday the Church celebrated the Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and on Saturday the Immaculate Heart of Mary. These two Feasts are powerful testimonies of the burning and unquenchable love that God and the Blessed Virgin have for us.

In their images the Sacred Heart and Immaculate Heart burn with a flame that comes out of the top of their hearts while their hearts are encircled with the crown of thorns. The flame represents their burning love for us, while the thorns represent the pain and suffering they had to go through in order to help us to be saved.

Every Christian should keep these a picture of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary in their home in order to pause once a day and taste the great love God has for us.
