Church Steeple Repair Project

Over the last year we have been watching the water damage increase in the balcony ceiling. Last December we had Krause Konstruction Company inspect the bell tower and steeple. They found some significant water damage and corrosion on the interior and exterior of the steeple and bell tower. The estimate to repair the damage came in at close to \$160,000.

St Patrick's is currently raising funds to pay for these repairs.

50% of the cost of the repair/restoration is due to the contractor at completion of the project in September, with the other 50 % due in March of 2024. Letters and donation forms were recently mailed out to parish households. Please pray about this cause and give what you can to save our beautiful steeple. There will be a display in the back of church with more information and updates on the fund-raising progress. Thank you for your generous support to maintain the house that God built.

Pastor's Corner

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

We hear about the parable of the sower sowing seed for this weekend's gospel and it's a good one. However, it's very easy to focus on the same things or even tune out the message that Jesus wants us to learn from.

We often focus on being and having good soil so that the seeds can grow and yield a hundred, or sixty or thirtyfold. The gospel still holds true that we should all strive to become better Catholics and holy saints. In light of the renewal of the further appreciation for the Eucharist, this gospel should inspire us to do more. We are all called to spread the Word of God and the great news of our Catholic Faith and we often call this evangelization.

What are we teaching about our Catholic Faith to the people around us? It's the Kerygma. This is a Greek word that means proclamation that Jesus has come to save us. Fr. John Ricardo has a great video about this online on his YouTube channel.

The Kerygma can be summarized into four words: (1) created, (2) captured, (3) rescued, (4) response.

We have been Created in the image and likeness of God so that means we are made good and are good. This is a great blessing by God with the gift of free will.

Unfortunately, we have abused the gift of free will and we have been Captured by sin through the original sin of Adam and Eve.

God didn't want his children to remain in this limbo or be punished forever without any plans of salvation.

Therefore, we have been Rescued by Jesus when he came into the world to carry the cross and to die for our sins. He rose from the dead to open the gates of heaven for us.

Since God has done all of this and more for us, what is the appropriate response?

How do we intentionally Respond to God's love and mercy? Sincerely yours in Christ,
