Church Steeple Repair Project

Over the last year we have been watching the water damage increase in the balcony ceiling. Last December we had Krause Konstruction Company inspect the bell tower and steeple. They found some significant water damage and corrosion on the interior and exterior of the steeple and bell tower.

The estimate to repair the damage came in at close to \$160,000.

St Patrick's is currently raising funds to pay for these repairs. Our most recent Steeple Pledge total update is \$135,915.04

Pastor's Corner

This weekend Jesus gives us the challenge of following him. He says, "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me. For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake will find it. What profit would there be for one to gain the whole world and forfeit his life?"

Taking up one's cross isn't easy when our natural instinct is to flee from it or to fight it. This is why holiness is so difficult to obtain. However, we must remember that it is still possible with God's help and grace.

St. John of Chrysostom speaks about 5 ways of repentance.

- 1. Condemn you own sin which means learn to hate your own sins so that you won't offend God again.
- 2. Learn to master our anger and forgive our enemies
- 3. Have a prayer life
- 4. Almsgiving
- 5. Learn to be humble

These are great tools for us to practice and live out on a daily basis because they help us to focus on God when we learn to identify certain sins that keep us from coming to him. We then can go to confession to have our sins erased. Then we also can learn to forgive others so that we don't have to hold onto those unnecessary burdens. Having a prayer life increases our intimacy with God and it helps us be centered on him. Then almsgiving helps us to be detached from material goods so that we can take care of our brothers and sisters who lack the necessities of life. Lastly, the virtue of humility helps us to be focused on God and be grateful for things that he has given to us.
