THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

JANUARY 2, 2022

FROM THE PASTOR

I don't know about you, but Advent and Christmas seemed like a bit of a whirlwind this year. This weekend we celebrate the Epiphany of the Lord, and Ordinary Time resumes next Sunday with the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord.

The normal Mass schedule resumes this week, and the office reopens on Monday, January 3.

During the coming week, the Church is celebrating the feast day of the first American saint. Tuesday, January 4, is the feast day of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton (born August 28, 1774; died January 4, 1821). Her husband, William Seton, suffered from tuberculosis. Having been advised to travel to Italy for the warmer climate than that found in New York City (where the couple resided), her husband died there in 1803. It was during her time in Italy that Elizabeth Ann Seton was introduced to Catholicism. Following her return to New York, Elizabeth was received into the Catholic Church on March 14, 1805.

In 1809, she relocated to Emmitsburg, Maryland, where she founded St. Joseph's Academy and Free School and the Sisters of Charity, the first order of religious sisters founded in the United States. Many parishes throughout the United States are named for St. Elizabeth Ann Seton, including the nearby parish in Mauldin. Seton Hall University in New Jersey is also named for her. The National Shrine of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton is located in Emmitsburg, Maryland, where her remains are entombed.

During the Mass of her Canonization in Rome on September 14, 1975, Pope Paul VI said:

"Elizabeth Ann Seton is a saint. St. Elizabeth Ann Seton is an American. All of us say this with special joy and with the intention of honoring the land and the nation from which she sprang forth as the first flower in the calendar of the saints. Elizabeth Ann Seton was wholly American! Rejoice for your glorious daughter. Be proud of her. And know how to preserve her fruitful heritage."

Fr. Longenecker was brought up in an Evangelical home in Pennsylvania. After graduating from the fundamentalist Bob Jones University with a degree in Speech and English, he

went on to study theology at Oxford University in England. Eventually he was ordained as an Anglican priest and served as a curate, a school chaplain in Cambridge and a country parson on the Isle of Wight.

Realizing that he and the Anglican Church were on divergent paths, in 1995 he and his family were received into the Catholic Church. For ten years they continued to live in England where he worked as a freelance writer and charity worker. Then in 2006 the door opened to return to the USA and be ordained as a Catholic priest.





Fr. Longenecker now serves as Pastor of Our Lady of the Rosary Catholic Church in Greenville, South Carolina.


