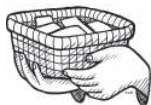

To Admonish Sinners

This article is the tenth in a series examining the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy as an expression of the New Evangelization.

Fraternal correction is an extremely important application of divine mercy. At first glance this may seem a denial rather than an affirmation of love. After all, it does not seem very affirming to criticize another's conduct. Christ Himself admonished us to remove the "plank from our eye and then you can see clearly to remove the splinter from your brother's eye" (Mt 7:5). For some people, charity means being "nice" and never hurting another's feelings.

Christ, in fact, did not practice this rather limited understanding of charity. It is true that He was very understanding and approachable for tax collectors and sinners. Still, He was quite tough with the leadership of Israel, not being afraid to call them whitewashed tombs and blind guides. Even with His own closest companions, the affirmation He carried on involved fraternal correction.

The most celebrated case was Peter. Our Lord was preparing Peter to be head of the Church. The beginning of this was the revelation to Peter that Jesus was the Messiah, the Son of God. Christ rewarded him by making him the head of the Church on earth. Then Christ explained that there is the unpleasant episode in His life that He as the Messiah had to suffer. Peter responds: "God forbid that you should suffer, Lord." Jesus answers: "Get behind me, Satan, you are trying to make me trip and fall because you are not judging as God judges but as man judges" (Mt 16:23). Jesus calls the first pope "Satan" in public.

Jesus knows that Peter can take a correction. Out of His regard for him and also His desire truly to prepare Peter to be head of the Church, Jesus practices the art of fraternal correction. In this He demonstrates that charity is not about sparing someone's feelings if the correction is for his good and the good of others and one knows the person can accept it maturely.

A physician who hid an illness from someone because he wanted to spare his feelings would not be treating him with mercy. Instead, the physician must explain the nature of the disease and then perhaps perform a painful cure. This is not out of hatred for the patient but the desire that he will be healed. In the same way, our Healer, Christ, demonstrates a proper attitude toward healing with us. Our Lord does not fear to tell the truth when He knows either that the truth is necessary to avoid further evil, as was the case with the leadership of Israel, or for the person's own good.

Admonishing the sinner is a true application of the divine pity. There are, however, some important norms that must be observed.

The only person who has a *right* to admonish a sinner is someone who is in authority over him. This would mean that it is not required for a stranger or an equal to do this. In the case of sin, the clergy are the best people to do this. For one thing, the proper forum for this is normally confession for the individual or preaching for the community.

Another person may also admonish a sinner, but if he does so, he must be motivated first by his desire for the amendment of the sinner. He must seek the good of the sinner and not just the resolution of some personal problem the admonisher has. He must also be certain all things being equal, that the correction will actually strike home. If he has the idea that, because of who he is or the situation in which such a correction might be made, it will make the sinner only more obstinate in his sin, then he has an obligation to be silent. This is not to excuse the sinner, but merely to recognize that the purpose of the correction will not be effective.

Also, it is rarely a good idea to speak to the sinner in an angry and threatening tone. The offender often only hears the emotion of the words and reacts to those. He does not thoughtfully consider what is said. The corrector should explain that he realizes that we all commit sins. He is not standing in judgment as a merciless person just to condemn the other. In correcting the other, he is in a sense correcting himself. For this reason, corrections should be done quietly, humbly (accusing oneself of weakness too) and rarely. Pope Francis expresses this idea: "The Church is a mother; she has to go out to heal those who are hurting, with mercy."

Religious Education Begins in September

Religious education classes for elementary, junior high and high school will begin on Sunday, Sept. 18. During the first two weekends of September registration will take place after Masses. Remember we have a mandatory three-year program for Confirmation; students must be in our program freshman, sophomore and junior years, with classes on Sunday evenings.

Morning Mass on Monday, Sept. 5, will be at 8:30 am instead of 7:15.

**Judge blocks Obama's transgender
restroom edict in public schools**

AUSTIN, August 22, 2016 ([LifeSiteNews](http://LifeSiteNews.com)) – The Obama administration twisted the law and violated proper procedure in its efforts to force public schools into opening the restrooms, showers, and overnight accommodations of one sex to members of the opposite biological sex, a federal judge ruled on Sunday. In a major setback for the administration, U.S. District Judge Reed O'Connor granted a preliminary injunction against the Obama administration's controversial federal guidance to the nation's public schools and universities regarding transgender students on Sunday.

The rules, promulgated in May, held out the possibility that public schools would lose federal funding if they maintained what O'Connor called separate "intimate facilities" based on biological sex. The administration has said it roots its reasoning in Title IX, a 1972 law intended to prevent discrimination against women in education. While federal civil rights laws do not include "gender identity," the Obama administration has interpreted numerous federal laws that bar discrimination based on "sex" as though they include both sexual orientation and gender identity.
