Mass Schedule: 4th Sunday Advent & Christmas: BOTH are Obligatory

This year the 4th Sunday of Advent falls on the same day as Christmas Eve, with Christmas Day on Monday. The obligation to attend Mass on the 4th Sun. of Advent <u>and</u> on Christmas still stands. Because people may have questions about how to fulfill both obligations, below are **four options**. The important thing to remember is that no matter which option is chosen, the two obligations must be fulfilled separately:

Option 1 – Saturday Eve. Dec. 23 at 4pm <u>Fourth Sunday</u> Advent & Sunday Dec. 24 at 4pm Christmas Eve

Option 2 – Saturday Eve. Dec. 23 at 4pm Fourth Sunday Advent & Monday Dec. 25 at 12 am Midnight (Latin) or 10am Christmas Day

Option 3 – Sunday Dec. 24 at 7am, 10am or 12 noon (Latin) Fourth Sunday Advent & Sunday Dec. 24 at 4pm Christmas Eve

Option 4 – Sunday Dec. 24 at 7am, 10am or 12 noon (Latin) Fourth Sunday Advent & Monday Dec. 25 at 12am (midnight Latin) or 10am Christmas Day
