

St. Anthony Mary Claret and the Missionary Sons of the Immaculate Heart of Mary



The Missionary Sons of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, also known as the **Claretians**, was founded in 1849 by the one-time Archbishop of Santiago, Cuba, **St. Anthony Mary Claret** (1807-1870), whose feast day is October 24 (next Friday).



St. Anthony was born in Spain. In his autobiography he says that from his infancy and youth he had a most heartfelt devotion to the Virgin Mary, was an indefatigable apostle of Mary's Immaculate Heart. After working for a time in his father's weaving business, he followed the call to the priesthood. Ordained in 1835 at the age of 27, he sought to dedicate his life to missionary work, preaching the Gospel and leading spiritual renewal across Spain. He traveled throughout Spain preaching missions, giving retreats, and spiritual conferences.

In 1849 St. Anthony founded the Missionary Sons of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, also known as the Claretians. The primary mission of this congregation was to serve as missionaries, bringing the Gospel to local communities and foreign lands. The Claretians emphasized spreading devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary, reflecting St. Anthony's own deep Marian spirituality.

In 1850, Pope Bl. Pius IX appointed St. Anthony Claret as the Archbishop of Santiago, Cuba. In that same year St. Anthony consecrated his Diocese of Santiago, Cuba to the Most Pure Heart of Mary. He established Archconfraternity of the Most Holy and Immaculate Heart of Mary in many place, and he and his order did much to promote the Archconfraternity. In 1858 St. Anthony published a work on the Archconfraternity that includes a novena in honor of Our Lady's Heart, in which a prayer speaks of the complete likeness of her Heart to that of her Son's: "Sinners!!! . . . ah! fix your sight on that afflicted Heart of Mary resembling completely the Heart of Jesus."

The Claretian *Manual of the Archconfraternity of the Immaculate Heart of Mary* states that its object is to go to the Heart of Jesus through the Heart of Mary in order to obtain mercy for the conversion of sinners. This *Manual* also makes clear that Claret's Missionary Sons actively promote the teaching of the union of the Hearts of Jesus and Mary. For example, a prayer of consecration of families to the Sacred Hearts begins: "Oh Hearts of Jesus and Mary, so agreeable and united, that you formed a single Heart, true model of the heart that ought to unite the Christian family into a single sentiment! . . ." And opposite the title page appears an image that features the Blessed Virgin seated with the Christ Child on her right knee, with Mary holding in her left hand her Heart pierced by a sword, surrounded by flowers surmounted by a flame, and Jesus holding in His left hand His Heart with is surmounted by a flame. This image is generally denominated "The Virgin of Divine Love."

In 1950, Pope Pius XII canonized him as a saint of the Catholic Church. Today, the Missionary Sons of the Immaculate Heart of Mary continue his legacy, with missionary activities across 65 countries worldwide.
