Tues. Nov. 25, 4pm: Lifting the Veil on Those with Power & Influence: Bohemian Grove.



INDULGENCES, PENANCE & the SOULS in PURGATORY

This Sunday, Nov. 2, is **ALL SOULS DAY**, the day after All Saints Day. During the Month of November we remember in a special way all the souls who died in a state of grace but who still atone for their sins in Purgatory: we pray and offer Masses for them, and gain indulgences on their behalf to help them get to Heaven. A **plenary indulgence** may be gained for the souls in Purgatory for all who from Nov. 1-8, visit a cemetery and pray for the dead; or who on Nov. 2 visit any parish church and recite one Our Father and one Creed (& fulfill other conditions—see below).

What is an indulgence? The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* (CCC) 1471 teaches: “An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven, which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under certain prescribed conditions through the action of the Church which, as the minister of redemption, dispenses and applies with authority the treasury of the satisfactions of Christ and the saints.”

An indulgence is *partial* or *plenary* [full] according as it removes either part or all of the temporal punishment due to sin. Indulgences may be applied to oneself or to the dead [souls in Purgatory], but not for the living. To gain any indulgence one must be in a state of grace, perform the work prescribed, and have the intention of gaining the indulgence.

To gain a plenary indulgence one must perform the prescribed work AND fulfill the normal conditions for gaining a plenary indulgence: 1) receive Holy Communion that day; 2) go to sacramental Confession within 8 days; 3) pray for the Pope (Our Father, Hail Mary, Glory Be); and 4) remain free from all attachment to sin. We can gain a plenary indulgence for any of the following good works (if we fulfill the normal conditions, 1-4, above): pray a Rosary with others; read Scripture ½ hour; pray a Rosary before the Eucharist.

To understand the doctrine/practice of indulgences, we must realize that sin has a double consequence. Unrepented mortal sin results in the eternal punishment of hell. But “every sin, even venial, entails an unhealthy attachment to creatures [people/things], which must be purified either here on earth, or after death in the state called Purgatory. This purification frees one from what is called the temporal punishment of sin” (CCC 1472).

“**The doctrine and practice of indulgences are closely linked to the effects of the Sacrament of Penance**” (CCC 1471). The forgiveness of grave/mortal sin through the Sacrament of Confession results in the remission (taking away) of the eternal punishment due to that sin (CCC 1473). However, even after sins are forgiven, “temporal punishment of sin remains”; that is, punishment to satisfy/make up for the harm our sins have caused, which (punishment) must be suffered in this life or after death, in Purgatory. This makes sense, for every sin harms Jesus (crucifies Him), harms the Church/others, and harms us individually.

This is why the priest assigns a “penance” in Confession: saying prayers or doing some good act helps to repair for the harm our sins have done. But usually the penance does not satisfy completely for the harm our sins have caused (does three Hail Mary’s make up for an act of adultery?). The CCC 1473 states we “must strive by works of mercy and charity, as well as by prayer and the various practices of penance” to satisfy for the harm our sins have caused. If we have not satisfied completely for our sins in this life, we must do so in Purgatory, because our souls must be completely purged of all effects of sin before seeing the All-Pure God.

Offering Masses, prayers & indulgences for the souls in Purgatory is part of the Communion of the Saints in which “a perennial link of charity exists between the faithful who have already reached their heavenly home, those who are expiating their sins in Purgatory, and those who are still pilgrims on earth” (CCC par. 1475).
